Some of the key points from the last year were the development of the Fire Protection Charitable trust and putting a levy system in place for inspectorate companies to help fund development of the NZS4541, NZS4512, and NZS4514 standards and the development of the level 3 passive installers qualification in conjunction with our industry training organisation Competenz. We have also continued to grow our surplus to allow us to budget for some longer-term capital expenditure projects in the coming year.

Current Outputs

Work is already well underway on the following initiatives for this financial year:

- » developing the intumescent coatings code of practice
- » developing building interface code of practice
- » rolling out and adopting the level 3 passive installers qualification
- » completing the NZS4541 sprinkler systems standard revision
- » starting on the NZS4512 fire alarm and NZS4514 smoke detector standard revision projects
- » developing a pilot scheme for industry development and careers.

Our plans and projects continue to grow and develop our industry and raise the profile of our members within organisations such as Standards New Zealand; the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE); fire and emergency organisations; local councils; BRANZ; and Fire Protection Association Australia (FPAA). We have had high levels of engagement with these organisations this year, and the profile of FPA NZ

Inspectorate SIG Update

It appears that once again we have arrived at the end of the year without realising it has caught us.

So, what is the process if you disagree with a ruling by your inspector on site? Each of the inspectorates will have their own procedures to deal with second opinions. In the instance of a sprinkler query, we have the Sprinkler System Certifier who can provide guidance. Fire alarms are a little different with no overarching Certifier. I have received queries from one of the other inspectorates asking me to review their recommendation regarding fire alarms. If the contractor is still in disagreement, the next stage would be a formal interpretation submitted via the Standards NZ website. While this process is the highest ruling authority we currently have, the process can take time, which at the end of a project is not conducive to a good builder / contractor / inspector relationship. If there are any items that you are aware of that may be marginal or out of the ordinary, I urge you to get these resolved early on in the process.

NZS4512 permits smoke detectors to be substituted for heat detectors, up to 30% of the fire cell. What do you do when this limitation is exceeded?

Firstly an approach to the fire engineer should be made to see if a heat detection system with supplementary smoke detection is an acceptable alternative. If not, then you need to look really carefully at where you have substituted smoke detection. It may be that some areas may need smoke detection to be installed. Unfortunately, this scenario happens more often than we would like. Yes, it can cause a project to be delayed for signoff, but we do have to sign it off against the fire alarm standard.

While not relevant to the inspection side of the industry, we do hear of projects that have been incorrectly tendered. Remember to read the documentation carefully, and to clarify your scope of works. Quoting for stage one of a project when the documents require stage two or three works to be included, is not going to end up well financially for anyone.

Finally, on behalf of the inspectors around the countryside, may you all have some time off over the Christmas break, and we look forward to seeing you in the new year.

Gas Flooding Systems – Understand the Danger and Risk:

The fire protection industry and those that work in it, are exposed to a number of health and safety hazards on a daily basis such as; working at heights, driving, using dangerous equipment and gas flooding systems. The Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 lists the governing principles and responsibilities for all staff within an organisation. As we should all be well aware by now the penalties for non-compliance can end with heavy fines and prison time if non-compliance is proved.



There have been a couple of incidents and “near –misses“ in New Zealand recently that would suggest that the dangers associated with gas flooding systems and responsibilities of those working with them is not well understood.

In the near future the NZFPA will be rolling out a “Get it Right” seminar on this subject but the following is a high level view of some of the hazards and considerations when working on gas flooding systems.

The first rule is, **“if you don’t know, don’t touch”!** Staff need to have undergone formal specific training on the; handling, servicing and commissioning of gas flooding systems. This is typically undertaken by the manufacturer or their agent and needs to be specific to the hardware and the specific models. If an employee is trained on the ABC Ltd hardware it does not imply that he can work on and service hardware produced by the XYZ Corporation. The principal of operation may be completely different and one wrong move may be fatal. The training needs to be formal and specific and it has to be prove that the employee has understood the training. This typically means a formal written test with the results kept and

recorded. The manufacture of the hardware need to provide clear instructions i.e. operation and maintenance manuals. These need to clearly list the procedures be it for installation, service and maintenance, isolation, removal or commissioning. If a technician is asked to work on a gas flooding system and has not been trained and fully understands the system he/she should bluntly refuse to do so.

Real Estate agents use the phrase; “location, location, location”. When working with gas flooding systems the phrase is; **“Isolation, Isolation, Isolation, Isolation ...”** i.e. Isolate the gas flooding system both electrically and mechanically. This typically means;

- › **ISOLATION** at the gas flooding control panel.
- › **ISOLATION** (or removal) of the electrical or solenoid type actuators from the cylinders.
- › **ISOLATION** of the mechanical actuators for the cylinders.
- › **ISOLATION** of any interfacing systems that could be triggered i.e. air conditioning, power shut down, plant shut down.

Gas Flooding Systems – Understand the Danger and Risk *cont.*

All personnel working on gas flooding systems need to understand the amount of energy that they are dealing with when they work on gas flooding systems. When we service and maintain sprinkler systems we are talking about a medium (i.e. water) at a maximum pressure of approximately 12 Bar. With gas flooding systems the medium is a gas and we are dealing with storage pressures of 25 to 300 Bar! These pressures have the potential to be fatal if the correct procedures and isolations are not followed. **In brief, gas flooding cylinders need to be treated as an unexploded bomb!** The other misunderstanding is that a cylinder is deemed to be empty and safe if it has discharged. This is totally wrong and the law is very clear here. If a cylinder has a valve fitted to it, the assembly has to be treated as, "dangerous goods". There is very good reason for this e.g. a 45Kg cylinder discharges but the valve jams towards the end of the discharge. In this case there will still be pressure present in the cylinder hence the need to treat all cylinders as if they were full.

Transport, handling and storage are other areas that are not always given the attention they deserve. The following are a few "do's and don'ts" with regards to this very important topic.

- › **DO** – complete a Specific Job Safety Analysis before commencing any activity involving the transport or handling of gas flooding cylinders.
- › **DO** – ensure that all staff have been specifically trained and understand the procedures.
- › **DO** - make sure the cylinder is legally allowed to be used in NZ i.e. must have an Import Clearance Test Certificate and LAB or FERN number.
- › **DO** – ensure that cylinders are secure and housed in specific cylinder cages or other suitable arrangements that are "fit for purpose". This is covered under the Land Transport Regulations and NZS5433.1 Transporting of Dangerous Goods on Land.
- › **DO** – wear the correct PPE
- › **DO** - make sure you have a Safety Data Sheet if transporting cylinders.
- › **DO** – ensure you fill out a Dangerous Goods Declaration
- › **DO** - ensure that the cylinders are labelled correctly.
- › **DO** – use a purpose built cylinder trolley or other aid to move cylinders.
- › **DO** - organise sufficient man power to help move and handle cylinders.
- › **DO** – a Risk Assessment of where cylinders are to be stored.
- › **DON'T** – man-handle a cylinder by rolling it on its edge.
- › **DON'T** – lift a cylinder by its valve.
- › **DON'T** – attempt to transport the cylinder if it is not safe i.e. severely corroded or has damaged pressure gauge or is leaking.
- › **DON'T** – try and fix a leaking or damaged cylinder in the field or tamper with any port that you are unfamiliar with.
- › **DON'T** – transport a cylinder without a safety travel cap protecting the valve or in some cases the individual valve ports require individual safety caps.
- › **DON'T** – leave a cylinder free standing. It must always be made safe.
- › **DON'T** – transport a cylinder with actuators and discharge hoses still fixed to them.
- › **DON'T** – leave cylinders exposed to the elements or high temperatures.
- › **DON'T** – store cylinders in confined spaces i.e. work vans.

RoVE - WDC Fact Sheet

Kia ora koutou.

The Minister of Education Hon Chris Hipkins, has confirmed the structure of the Workforce Development Councils (WDCs), which are part of the Government’s Reform of Vocational Education.

Under the new system, the WDC responsibilities will include: setting standards for qualifications, unit standards and other skill standards; skills leadership; consistency of assessment and learner outcomes; advising on funding and industry brokerage. WDCs won’t be directly involved with arranging training.

RoVE – WDC Fact Sheet *cont.*

What will this new structure look like?

- › Six industry-led WDCs will be established:
- › Manufacturing, Engineering, Logistics and Technology
- › Creative, Cultural and Recreation
- › Primary Industries
- › Service Industries
- › Health, Community and Social Services
- › Construction and Infrastructure.

The Fire Protection industry will sit under the Manufacturing, Engineering, Logistics and Technology WDC.

Competenz supports the Minister's announcement of six skills-aligned WDCs, this is consistent with the feedback our industries, including Fire Protection, provided during consultation so it is encouraging to see this announcement confirming their views.

We would like to reassure you there will be no change to the services and support you receive from our organisation throughout the transition. The final date for transition for all functions is 31 December 2022, with all WDCs being established by June 2021.

Next steps

The Government says its next steps will be: further engagement on the WDC establishment process early next year; and supporting industries to identify their governance arrangements and Board appointment process.

We will be in touch again in the new year with further updates and next steps as they come to hand.
