Hurricane Katrina: Lessons Learned at a Federal Level

Mr. R. David Paulison served as Director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Mr. Paulison led FEMA from 2005 to 2009, was credited with having guided the federal agency through the development of the next-generation processes, technologies and infrastructure required to respond to the hazards and disasters of the 21(st) century.

He began his career as a firefighter in 1971 and served as Fire Chief of Miami-Dade County, FL from 1992 to 2001. In that year, he joined the federal government as Administrator of the United States Fire Administration, the division of FEMA with responsibilities for supporting national, state and local fire service programs as well as implementing FEMA initiatives for emergency readiness, firefighter training and equipment. From 2003 to 2004, he served as Director for Preparedness for FEMA within the newly created Department of Homeland Security where he was responsible for over \$1 billion in grant programs for state and local governments.

Mr. Paulison has deep experience and insight into a period of tremendous change in how the world thinks about public safety and protection. His tenure as FEMA Director began in 2005 and was marked by a renewed focus on key national safety and preparedness priorities, including effective national response to disasters through three hurricane seasons, California wildfires and the 2008 mid-west floods.

Under his leadership, the agency reframed the doctrine by which the nation prepares for and responds to all-hazard disasters through a new FEMA Strategic Plan, and directing the development of the new National Response Framework. He has been Trustee of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. since April 18, 2011.

John has a degree in Analytical Chemistry from Plymouth University and a PhD in Emulsion Explosives from Cranfield University. John joined a firm of consulting scientists and engineers in 2001, before establishing HFS-Asia in 2011. In 2016, HFS-Asia merged with Hawkins and Associates, a well-established and respected firm specialising in forensic investigation and root cause analysis for the insurance, legal and risk management professions. He has been involved in the investigation of over 600 fire and explosion incidents, ranging from small domestic premises to large industrial plants. He has provided advice on the storage and use of damaged explosives and the appropriate use of explosives in wreck removal.

John has investigated a wide variety of marine incidents on ships and yachts, including fires in containers, engine rooms and bulk cargoes. He has provided advice on 'live' ship fires involving cargoes such as DRI, coal and agricultural products. In addition, John has dealt with a number of cargo contamination cases, including natural product spoilage, chemical reactions, liquid and gas cargo contamination, taking samples, interpreting analytical results, and supervising the clean-up.

He has significant experience of agricultural bulk cargo claims, including determining causes of product deterioration, cargo liquefaction (fluorspar, nickel ore, iron ore, fines etc.) and providing advice on the carriage and care of the cargo. This work involves supervising surveyors, agricultural scientists and sampling experts as well as providing reports suitable for use in both local courts and London Arbitrations.

It is with deepest regret that we have accepted Jim Kelly's resignation from the role of administering the evacuation qualification. Jim is well known throughout the industry and has always provided fair and impartial reviews of the applicant's abilities, as well as donating a lot of his time to the review project. We will be actively seeking a suitable replacement for the role.

The FENZ fire information unit are still seeing high numbers of applications. With the anniversary of the

evacuation regulation being introduced it is timely to remind ourselves to refer to Fire and Emergency NZ by their official title or the abbreviation FENZ this is particularly important for scheme submissions – they are no longer the fire service.

HOFFE SIG Update

As another month slips by we continue to discover more issues thanks to our vigilant members. As many of you will be aware that there has been quite a bit of controversy surrounding standards and approvals for the larger capacity wheeled mobile fire extinguisher units. The majority of these are installed where the risk necessitates a capacity that a normal fire extinguisher (weighing less than 23kg) simply doesn't have. These larger capacity mobile appliances most commonly are filled with dry powder, foam or CO2 and range in capacity from 45kg/lt – 100kg/lt. Most of these are stored pressure though some may have an external propellant cartridge which is normally filled with either CO2 or nitrogen. These mobile appliances are a manually operated fire appliance, aka Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment (HOFFE) as designated in NZS 4503:2005 pg13. Traditionally a low pressure fire extinguisher with the exception of the CO2 units.

Depending on who you talk to these larger units appear to have been both recommended and withdrawn from service pending a resolution on their standards and serviceability. We have raised the different approaches taken and inconsistencies with Worksafe in a Fire Equipment industry meeting of interested parties organized by the FPA a few months ago. However we had heard nothing until one of our members sent us an email through pointing out that a draft document from Worksafe has been sent out, consulting on three safe work instruments. This was sent to some companies asking for comment on the following;

- a) Additional design standards for cylinders
- b) A new standard for low-pressure fire extinguishers, and
- c) A standard for the design and construction of above ground stationary tanks.

Given the subject matter and recent engagement we have had with Worksafe it would seem logical that you would send a copy of this consultation document to the organization that represents a large portion of the fire equipment industry in this country and that had already shown interest in this topic? A relatively short consultation period opening on the 7th June and then closing on the 5th July also exacerbates the situation, the standard concerned is BS EN 1866-2:2014 Mobile Fire extinguisher construction, mechanical testing, pressure resistance.

We had a bit of discussion around this topic during June's HOFFE group meeting but we agreed that a positive from this was the fact that Worksafe are looking at the possibility of adopting standards which are widely accepted elsewhere, also dependant on the standards approved/accepted this could be a positive for the fire protection industry. At our June meeting we also had Phil Jackson from the Evacuation SIG come along to give an informative overview to our members present about the projects his group are involved in. Another guest was Dave Boff who was having similar experiences to us with cylinder approvals and gave us some insight into the process and results to date.

Last month's article has generated a bit of feedback, thankfully most of it has been positive, particularly the feedback from the insurance sector and other HOFFE companies. We are all agreed that removing good operable fire equipment is a backward step and that it should remain installed and be maintained to the appropriate standards, so thank you for that consensus.

FPANZ Coatings Working Group Update

It was a humbling experience to be part of the working group. It's extremely fortunate the group is made up of like-minded individuals from a range of companies and back grounds - all committed to solving a massive issue that is present in our industry.

Our initial goal was to establish a 'guideline' for the industry to clearly detail the process around the specification and application of Intumescent Coatings Systems (ICS) to structural steel. This morphed into a 'Code of Practice' document that compliments the great work from FPANZ to help solve other issues within our industry.

We've held intensive and constructive meetings every 2 weeks. The meeting last Monday provided an opportunity to tie up loose ends. With the bulk of

the work now completed, we're now waiting for the first draft to be released to the group on the 5th July. This will start the review process.

We're aiming to send a draft out to industry for comment early of August with a 2-week review period. Next steps will involve consolidating the information, then releasing Version 1.0 'Code of Practice for Specification and Application of Intumescent Coating Systems for Structural Steel' in time for FireNZ 2019.

Inspectorate SIG Update

As mentioned in last month's newsletter, the Fire Protection Charitable Trust has been set up and is now operating. This is independent of the FPA, who do not have access to its assets or funds. So, we have now got Memorandums of Understanding from all Inspectorates regarding collection of levies for fire alarm inspections. The Trust will then utilise these funds for the betterment of the fire protection industry, be it through training or standards development. Who knows what else may be coming in the future?

Good design at the start of the job beats opening your wallet at the end to fix the job. Nothing is more frustrating than getting to the end of a project, getting the inspector in, and then finding the system does not meet the specification. Sprinkler Systems,

especially in a warehousing situation, need to have a thorough design done at the start of the project. Part of this design needs to include a storage declaration. How can the design be determined if you do not know what is being stored? The process undertaken by the Sprinkler System Certifier for sprinkler design review includes a review of the storage against the sprinkler system design. When there is no storage declaration provided, the design cannot be approved.

All in all, a busy time with Inspections, with Industry demands stretching all involved.

New “Integrated Building Systems - Code of Practice” is under development

The Fire Protection Association Council identified that at present there is no specific New Zealand Standard for integrated building systems, therefore a range of practices are utilised within the market.

Where systems integration is not correctly completed, there is a risk to life safety and also a business liability risk.

For example, a sprinkler system may require that mechanical air handling plant be shut down for effective sprinkler system operation. As has already happened in New Zealand, failure to ensure correct system integration can result in the air handling system blowing heat away from a fire and operating sprinklers that are not above the fire - so they have little/no effect. Too many sprinklers open and there is not enough water to supply them. The sprinkler system is then overwhelmed and the fire is not controlled. Lives of occupants, neighbours and firefighters are put at risk.

The intent of this Code of Practice is to provide guidance for the design, commissioning and routine testing of integrated fire safety systems. This is to be achieved by ensuring that the active interconnections/interface between the various systems in a building are tested as a whole, not just independently of each other.

The focus is on life safety systems, however other systems, whether on a compliance schedule or not, may be included.

To develop a robust Code of Practice the FPA is engaging with other organisations and industries including Fire & Emergency NZ, Society of Fire Protection Engineers, Institute of Fire Engineers, Fire Equipment Manufacturers Association, Insurance Council NZ; IRHACE (Mechanical), NZ Security Association, Lift industry, Electrical industry, Plumbing Industry, Council, commissioning managers and facilities managers.

If you have some good examples of cause & effect matrices or commissioning documents, we would appreciate your contributions.

I am pleased to be facilitating this project and look forward to receiving your help and support.

Charitable Trust – Update

The Fire Protection Charitable Trust was established by the New Zealand fire protection industry in 2018 as an independent publicly-registered charity to hold and administer funds held in trust for the purposes of standards development and industry qualifications/training within the NZ fire protection sector. The Trust works closely with FPANZ in any areas where the objectives of the two bodies are aligned.

We are pleased to announce that the Charitable Trust has secured the support of all 5 alarm system inspection bodies to collect levy funding for the upcoming revision of NZS 4512 and NZS 4514. Aon has been collecting these levies for more than a year, and the remaining companies (Argest, SAIL, HFI, BFS) will start collecting from 1st July (\$45 per new system, \$20 per system extension/upgrade).

The fire alarm manufacturer members of NZFEMA have also generously agreed to contribute to the

NZS 4512 revision – proportionally, based on the numbers of systems connected to FENZ. First instalment invoices went out in April/May, and 3 out of 8 participating manufacturers have paid so far.

On this basis, the Trust is pleased to be able to meet the fire protection industry cost share for the NZS 4512 revision project.

The Trust has also agreed to assume responsibility for funding FPANZ’s share of the current revision to NZS 4541, once Aon’s accumulated sprinkler levy funds are transferred (in July).

FPANZ has formally agreed to provide administrative and accounting services to the Trust, using completely separate bank accounts and funds that FPANZ has no ability to access. The Trustees are grateful for this valuable support, which is being provided at no charge.

NZ Government Vocational Education Review

Kia ora kotou

I am sure you will be aware of the Government's vocational education review and the subsequent 'Reform of Vocational Education' proposal released in February 2019, which was far more wide reaching than expected.

We welcome the Minister of Education's desire to improve vocational education in New Zealand, there is much about the proposed changes that we fully support. However, we are deeply concerned that the removal of the ITO's role in supporting employers and learners through 'arranging of training' will have a direct impact on our employers, just when they need the support the most. At the time of writing this, Minister Hipkins had not yet released his final decision on these reforms, this is expected mid-to-late July.

In the meantime, we have been actively lobbying the Minister and Ministry of Education about the proposed reform, particularly the removal of the ITOs' role in supporting employers and learners in arranging training – our submission and alternative proposal can be found at competenz.org.nz.

We are aware some employers may be reluctant to sign up new learners into apprenticeships and traineeships while the system is under review.

In response to our request, we have received a letter from Tim Fowler, Chief Executive of the Tertiary Education Commission (TEC), which provides employers with an assurance that new training agreements entered into this year will be honoured for the duration of the training, regardless of any future changes.



His letter says, *"I can confirm that any training agreements entered into this year will be honoured for the duration of the training period subject to them meeting the existing funding criteria set by the Tertiary Education Commission. I am happy for you to share this letter with employers as we are very supportive of all opportunities to increase work-based learning."*

For Competenz it is business as usual, we are here to support all our employers, apprentices and trainees. We continue to sign up a record number of apprentices in 2019, continuing the trend from 2018. It is vital that we work together to continue to grow the skills and capability of New Zealand workplaces.
