

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update


With the evacuation consultant qualification revision now nearing completion we will begin work to update our code of practice.

Following on from our last meeting we welcome a greater input from fire risk officers, working together we will be able to ensure we offer more consistent advice throughout the country. Ultimately this should aid all scheme applications, and improve general awareness of the value of evacuation planning.

Here are a couple of tips from the Fire Information unit (FIU) to assist with scheme applications:

 When making Marquee and Temporary Structure Applications – The best method of compliance from our experience, is to provide a Training Programme rather than Trial Evacuations.

- Detailing firefighting equipment and where it is located when making a scheme application
 - There must be a detailed description of where in the

Inspectorate SIG Update

Firstly, I would like to introduce myself. I am Tony Carline, and I work for Aon in a Sprinkler Certification, Sprinkler Inspection and Alarm Inspection capacity. So a jack of all trades so to speak. I have been in the industry for 29 years.

COMMISSIONING OF SYSTEMS

I would like to comment on Commissioning of Fire Protection Systems. When an inspector is called to site to undertake an inspection of a fire protection system, it is expected that the system has been commissioned by the contractor prior to our arrival. Our inspection of the system is an Audit of the system, and we are not there to undertake the system commissioning tests. NZS4541 Part 12 and NZS4512 Part 6 outline the requirements for testing of systems.

All too often, we are called to site and the system is not ready for us. Yes, we acknowledge there are pressures from builders etc to get us onto site to undertake our inspection. But to turn up to site to undertake a final inspection and find equipment not fitted off or completed, programming faults on fire alarm systems, or undertaking the inspection while the premises is still a construction site does not bode well for getting a sign off. Also of concern is what are the fire alarm contractors changing in the programming after the inspector has left the site?

Recently I was asked to undertake a final inspection and arrived on site to see ceilings not installed, painting in progress, and no floor coverings in place due to the state of the construction site. It was not possible to complete the inspection as floor coverings will dampen the sound, what else was being installed on the ceiling, would there be obstructions etc.

PAINTED SPRINKLER HEADS

Fire sprinkler heads are sold with plastic transport clips in



place. These clips are there to provide some degree of protection during transit. These clips are not designed to be protective covers to prevent paint getting on to the sprinkler head. The suppliers have sprinkler boots that can be installed until all painting has been completed. I have been advised of projects where spray painting has been undertaken, with the result being a good finish on the ceiling but the sprinkler heads were contaminated. What was more disconcerting was that the contractor went through and installed the escutcheon plates after painting was completed, but did not change the sprinkler heads. So after the inspection was completed, the contractor was given a list of contaminated sprinkler heads to replace, after the system was full of water.

Sprinklers can only have factory applied finishes and cannot be painted elsewhere. Why? Manufacturers warranty can be voided, the potential to inhibit sprinkler head release, delay sprinkler release, and inhibit spray pattern coverage. There are also concerns that the glass bulb can be scratched, causing it to release at a later date.

Contaminated sprinkler heads should be picked up during commissioning or the contractors walk through before the Inspectors are there to do their final inspections.

PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE

The committee revising NZS 4541 has had five meetings to date. The fifth meeting was held late in February 2019 and this was the final meeting before the draft is finalised and released for public consultation.

This is an update of progress to date, which is intended to be circulated to the committee members, who, in turn, are encouraged to update their nominating organisation on the progress of this project.

It needs to be noted that committee deliberations are confidential. This is to ensure, among other things, that committee members are not subjected to undue pressure and that assumptions are not made by members of the public as to what may be published.

Nominating organisations are also encouraged to feed back to their committee member(s) on any changes they may desire. The scope of the project to revise NZS 4541 has already been decided, but there is still limited opportunity to make minor changes before the public consultation.

UPCOMING MILESTONES

The project is on schedule to be released for public comment in April/May 2019, with publication due in September 2019, provided all copyright licence agreements are in place as planned. The copyright licence agreements are for arrangements where content from another publication(s) has been used in preparing the current NZS 4541 draft standard. Before public consultation, the draft will be released to the Building System Performance branch (MBIE), the International Accreditation New Zealand and the University of Canterbury for some targeted feedback. This has agreed with me (as the chair) and the Manager Standards New Zealand (as a delegate of the New Zealand Standards Executive).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR CHANGES PROPOSED

The following major key changes to NZS 4541 are envisaged:

1) The provisions for seismic resilience have been rewritten to reflect the requirements of NZS 1170.5:2004 Structural design actions – Part 5: Earthquake actions – New Zealand. This will require that the seismic design forces in NZS 4541 standard reflect those in NZS 1170.5, instead of the previously de facto design acceleration of 1.0g. In some buildings, the required design loads will be lower, while in other buildings, the design loads will be considerably higher. A maximum design acceleration of 3.6g is being proposed.

- 2) One proposed change that will impact on manufacturers and importers of sway bracing components is that seismic bracing elements will need to be listed by a sprinkler system certifier (SSC). The proposed listing standard is an ANSI standard, FM 1950:2016 Seismic Sway Braces for Pipe, Tubing and Conduit, or an equivalent standard. This standard can be downloaded from the FM Approvals website. The committee notes that, while the FM Approvals standard will meet the requirements of this standard, verification of compliance from accredited testing laboratories will allow listings of seismic bracing elements by a SSC following other criteria that meet the requirements of the standard.
- 3) A proposal to combine hydrants and sprinklers in tall buildings in order to add resilience and potentially reduce cost will be also put forward to public comment. This was as a result of reviewing the <u>Lacrosse Building Fire in Melbourne</u> on 25 November 2014, where 26 sprinklers operated over 16 floors in conjunction with hydrant hose streams. The committee considered that if a similar fire occurred in New Zealand, the separate hydrant and sprinkler risers would not have allowed the excessive numbers of sprinklers to operate.
- 4) Another significant issue that will be the subject of a request for specific public comment is to set a requirement that work on a sprinkler system is carried out, or supervised by, suitably qualified personnel. The acceptable qualifications are likely to be NZQA qualifications, or those accessed as being equivalent to them.
- 5) There are also significant changes being proposed to pump speed control requirements, due to the complexity of the design solutions being promoted by industry.

Standards New Zealand is not in a position to provide the details of the changes, as the revised draft standard is not ready for public comment. It is important to remember that any changes cannot be confirmed until after the public comments are reviewed and the final draft is presented to the Standards Approval Board and approved.

Two New NZS 4512 Formal Interpretations

Towards the end of 2018 two new Formal Interpretations were issued to NZS 4512:2010 Fire Detection and Alarm Systems in Buildings.

FI-136 clarifies requirements for connection to a remote receiving centre. Specifically, whenever a building consent requires a remote connection this must be made to a FENZ receiving centre. In addition, any optional connection to a security monitoring centre must still comply with the same technical requirements as for a remote connection to FENZ (these include Manual isolation facilities, latching Fire signal, partial automatic isolation and

defect signal on restoration of Brigade Silencing Switch, transmission of Defect signal, regular testing capability, continuous communication, separate supervised transmitting device power supply).

FI-137 confirms that in Type 5 and Type 7 systems, where sprinkler heads are not required in skylights, then heat detectors are not required in that skylight either. More generally, heat detectors are not required anywhere there is fully-compliant NZS 4541 or NZS 4515 sprinkler system coverage.

NZS 4512:2010 Fire Detection and Alarm Systems in Buildings – Clause 105 and Remote Receiving Centre

Question:

NZS4512:2010. Clause 105 and Remote Receiving Centre

- If a building consent requires a fire alarm system to be connected to a remote receiving centre as defined in NZS 4512, does a security monitoring company connected permanently to a fire alarm system and receiving FIRE and DEFECT signals from that system meet the requirements of clauses 105(a) and 105(b)?
- 2. If a building consent does not require a fire alarm system to be connected to a remote receiving centre as defined in NZS 4512, and that fire alarm system is permanently connected to a security monitoring company to receive and immediately act on FIRE and DEFECT signals, may a 24-hour battery standby calculation as specified in clause 213.1 be used in that situation?
- 3. Clause 209 details the Manual Isolation requirements from a remote receiving centre Facilities shall be provided for manually isolating the normal alarm functions of the system from the remote receiving centre. A mechanism shall also be incorporated to guard against the system inadvertently being left in the isolate mode. Isolating of the system shall initiate an isolate signal being transmitted to the remote receiving centre.

 Is clause 209 applicable to items 1 and 2

above?

Interpretation issued by the Alarms and Detection Group:

- No. Appendix A1 requires such remote connection to be to a Fire & Emergency NZ (formerly NZ Fire Service) remote receiving centre.
- Yes, provided the security monitoring centre will actually take immediate action to summon a service contractor response in receipt of a DEFECT signal.
- 3. Yes. Clauses 204.12, 205.4, 208.2, 602.6, A1, A2 and A3 are also applicable.

In a Type 7 system with a fully-compliant sprinkler system to NZS 4541:2013, where sprinklers are not required in skylights per clause 516 of NZS 4541, and smoke detectors are not required per NZS 4512 clause 405.1.3(a) and FI-104, are heat detectors required in those skylights?

Interpretation issued by the Alarms and detection group:

No

No

NOTE: Clause 405.2.2(h) states the overriding principle that heat detectors may be omitted in the presence of a fully compliant NZS 4515 or NZS 4541 sprinkler system.
