Fast forward and we now all know the final result, and possibly the cause, but the fall out and impact of this remains to be further realised. The media were quick to find many experts to talk to, some clearly with more credentials than others. This was painfully obvious with some of the comments that started to surface in various reports. It's sometimes disappointing to see ill-informed comments and those seeking their 5 minutes (or often less) of fame in the media spotlight.

Key contacts within the association and its board started our own discussions with industry contacts and FPANZ members working on the job to understand how and what fire protection was being installed and its status at the time. Armed with facts rather than fiction or speculation, we produced a media statement that our media consultants distributed to various

agencies. However, the facts are often less dramatic or controversial than what is chosen to be reported. Regardless, we have a responsibility to inform and correct those statements where we can prove otherwise, and we did that in this case.

Believe it or not, there have been some positive outcomes from this event, not all of which can be released or discussed at this point. They will come to light in due course, and we will continue to update our members and others as it becomes possible.

Those of us who have worked in the fire protection industry for many years know full well that works such as hot works that take place within any construction is a significant risk. We will be working with industry leaders to see what learning can be taken from this event and used to prevent further events of this nature.

### **Passive Fire Protection Level 3 Installers Qualification Released**

On a really positive note, we are rapt that the hard work by the passive special interest group (SIG) and Competenz has now delivered the qualification we were seeking. This is outstanding and only possible because of the hard work and dedication of the SIG and its members. I will leave Paul to discuss this in more detail further in the newsletter. FPANZ and its members wanted a qualification, and it has come to fruition; however, like many large projects, the real work is just starting. We will be working on a timeframe for members and their staff to obtain the qualification with the clear intent that all passive companies should have qualified staff and a pathway for new staff to be formally trained and qualified in coming years.

### **Standards Update**

It is satisfying to note that NZS4541 is now in the final stages after public comment and that the submissions are being reviewed and considered for the final release of the document. We have now also started the selection process for the committee for NZS4512 and NZS4514. Like many of these, the timeframe for FPANZ to nominate, vote, and select its representatives for this committee for review and approval by the standards board is very short. NZS4512 is long overdue for revision, and it will be great to see this finally updated. This is partly made possible by the formation of the charitable trust and the new levy system.

We are also in discussion with stakeholders about NZS4510 Fire Hydrant Systems for Buildings; in light of the NZICC fire, there will be further focus on whether this standard also needs updates. We will be

setting up a dedicated email address and requesting submissions on this in the near future.

I will continue to keep you updated on the area of standards development as this is critical to improving the safety of the public and of buildings in New Zealand.

### **Development of Fire Protection as a licensed trade**

I would like to reassure members that a longer-term goal of the association is to have fire protection recognised as a licensed building trade. We have lobbied and will continue to lobby various groups and government departments as to why this is necessary. Significant steps are being taken to fill the gaps to help facilitate this cause. The passive installers qualification is a prime example of the industry needing qualifications and to develop them where they are missing. Where voluntary schemes or industry self-certification is available, such as sprinkler and alarm certification, industry needs to support these and join up to provide examples and the proof needed to further this cause.

To progress to the next level, we encourage our members to ensure staff are enrolled in qualifications and that continued professional development does take place. It is also worth pointing out that possible updates to and requirements within the standards might clarify what competency is. Some might question this, but the association's view is clear: if qualifications exist within the current framework, NZQA level 3 and 4 qualifications clearly demonstrate an ability to show competency. End of story. The association will continue to push for fire protection to become a licensed trade. We advise all our members to follow the lead of the companies that are producing qualified and competent staff within the current voluntary framework because the day it becomes mandatory might not be as far off as some think.

## Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

Last month I made mention of the importance of noting your hazardous substances in an evacuation scheme application.

Going through the process of applying for an approved evacuation scheme application often highlights areas of concern within the business, such as what hazardous substances may be held on site. This is often a good time to consider risk reduction across site, such as how items are stored, keeping exit routes clear of obstruction, and ensuring that there are robust processes in place to shut down, and make safe hazardous working areas prior to leaving an area.

When working with an evacuation consultant take the time to walk through the site and talk with staff as part of a debriefing following a fire drill, this will often highlight areas where improvement may be made.

As many of you will be aware by now the AGM date and agenda has been announced, I look forward to meeting many of you at the meeting, don't forget our next Evacuation SIG is on 11th November where we will be reviewing the code of practice.

## HOFFE SIG Update

We now have a draft position statement for the FPA on Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment prepared by Nicky Marshall. We discussed this at the last Council meeting where it was well received. This statement also has references to other sites such as FENZ position statement and survey report document 148, which were approved for our use by Peter Gallagher of FENZ at the last council meeting.

FENZ have joined the insurance sector in expressing their concern at the ongoing practice of permanently removing hand operated fire-fighting equipment (HOFFE) from commercial premises. Anyone considering this would be well advised to read the FENZ report document 148 prior to doing so. Simon Davis of FENZ has also asked to be informed of the reasons for removing HOFFE from commercial premises.

One of the challenges ahead will be to look at where we as an industry sit under the governments restructure. As the FPA we have discussed this both at Council and industry level in the RoVE Workshop

(Competenz and the Workforce Development Council) and it appears any sector we fall into won't be a neat fit but rather a compromise to get the best fit/deal we can for our industry. We really cannot afford to get lost in an industry sector where our voice is not heard and as such our challenges and priorities are not addressed.

Our next HOFFE group meeting is on the Monday 11th November which, after 3 years, will be my last as chairman of our special interest group. For me it has been an interesting experience with plenty of engagement, some challenges and insight gained during this time. That said, whoever takes over the chairman's role will have my support should it be needed.

## Inspectorate SIG Update

### Fire Systems Ownership

Most people involved in the fire protection industry have a desire to do the best for their client, trying to help them out whenever they can. Sometimes the maintenance contractor may miss out on completing an extension or otherwise. Let's remember though, that Company A may service the system, but they are not the owner of the system. The system has been paid for by the owner of the building, and it is their asset. We need to keep in mind that whatever we do, we are working on the owners' asset and not a competitors fire alarm system. Let's get our standard of workmanship improved so that the owner does not incur additional costs to repair/fix work done by others.

### Shutdowns

A shutdown can be considered to be any activity whereby the fire system is isolated from the monitoring company for the purpose of surveying, testing, or extensions, and is out of operation should a fire occur. For this it may mean the sprinkler system is drained of water, for a fire alarm it may mean the fire alarm wiring is compromised. If you need to shut down the fire system, adequate notice needs to be provided to the owner, to ensure satisfactory arrangements can be made to alert occupants should there be an emergency requiring evacuation of the building. This should mean that if the fire alarm is shut down, the fire sprinkler is still operating, or vice versa.

It has been brought to my attention a situation whereby a push was on to get the fire alarm and fire sprinkler in an extension to an existing building operational. The work continued till early evening. Once the fire sprinkler work was completed, the system was reinstated. An hour or so later, it was discovered that the fire alarm system was still isolated, and the technician was off-site for the night. Frantic phone calls ensued until a technician was

located. The response as to why the alarm system was still isolated from the brigade was they had not finished the work and would be back the next day. The client was unaware of this situation. This practice/situation is not only unacceptable from an industry perspective, but this also had implications to the owner of the fire alarm system.

### Isolations

We keep hearing stories of parts of the fire system being isolated, with no notice being held at the fire system advising of the isolation. NZS4512 and NZS4541 both have an example of an isolation notice that can be fixed to the fire panel door or valveset whenever an isolation takes place.

Let's get back into the habit of using these forms of isolation tag. All it takes is for one company to go out of business, and with no on-site records of isolations, the owner's specified systems are compromised. It would be disastrous for our industry if there were to be a failure of the fire system due to a partial isolation that no-one was aware of.

We are more than aware that over time, the general standard of installation has deteriorated. Some of this is bad teaching bad habits, and some is a lack of industry knowledge, some are unscrupulous contractors trying to make an easy dollar. Every time there is a system that false alarms, the question of the standard of installation comes up. Let's all pick up our game, from good upfront design to installation, to completion, to inspection.

Finally, it has been brought to the attention of the FPA that some of the listings numbers for Notifier Amplifiers have not shown on the current FPA Fire Alarm Register. I can confirm that the following products are listed, and the FPA is updating the information currently:

# Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

## Well after three years, my last monthly article!

2019 has been a great year for the SIG, not only have we delivered the FPA Code of Practice for application of Intumescent Coatings, but this month, Competenz launched the NZQA Level 3 Passive Installers qualification, which will enable fire engineers, architects, builders, building owners and others to recommend passive fire protection products be installed by a qualified person.

This, along with the Passive Equipment register, provides the foundations for a brighter future in our industry.

There is no doubt passive fire protection has changed immeasurably over the last three or so years, and I believe industry will continue to change in the light of recommendations and reports coming from serious fires around the world.

We still have much to do, we need more technical guidance in the form of codes of practices, but one of the unanswered questions is Alternate Solutions, or the more common referenced “EJ’s”.

EJ’s are written when there is no specific tested solution available, they are formed using related test data – but quite often – with no testing experience to base a solution upon - they become very unreliable.

This area of our business needs more work!

For instance, *who is qualified to write an EJ?*

*What are the ramifications if the EJ doesn’t work?*

So often we’re told by contractors signing PS3 “*oh its ok, the fire engineer has signed it off*” – I’m not sure how much weight that will carry if challenged later?

Then we have the PS4 – which we are told, leans heavily on the PS3 – again – I’m not sure how both parties would fair if challenged?

In my humble opinion – the answer boils down to two things:

- a) either the builders start putting controls in place to ensure the buildings are built around the tested solutions, or
- b) more testing is carried out to replicate what is being installed on site.

*The current mechanism for an EJ isn’t reliable!*

This is a major challenge for the SIG to get to grips with over the coming year, but for me about to depart the “chair” I would like to thank the SIG for its support over the last three years, without the “team”, we wouldn’t have delivered a record amount of work in such a short space of time.

The challenge for the future in maintaining the momentum and not losing focus on positive solutions for Passive Fire Protection in New Zealand.

It’s been fun, hard work, frustrating, personally bruising sometimes, but the end result has been reward enough!

Onwards and upwards!



# C/AS2

On 27 June 2019, the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) published the new C/AS2 (Acceptable Solution for Buildings other than Risk Group SH) for fire.

The document combines what were previously six separate Acceptable Solutions for fire into one.

Although every attempt was made to ensure the new document was correct, some unintentional errors occurred. The Building System Performance branch is planning to address these issues in the next biannual Building Code update, which will go out for public consultation in February 2020.

In the interim, three priority corrections will be made immediately to C/AS2 to coincide with the end of the transition period (31 October 2019). These are:

1. Within the scope for risk group WB, under ‘Storage activities such as’, a typo was made including the word ‘no’ (see the corrections as per the red mark-ups below). Refer to page 34 in 2019 C/AS2, Table 1.1 WB.

Risk group	Applies to
<b>WB</b> Business, commercial and low level storage.	<b>Professional activities such as:</b> Offices (including professional services such as law and accountancy practices). Laboratories, workshops (including mechanics workshops). May contain storage with a capable height of storage of less than 3.0 m. <b>Industrial activities such as:</b> Factories, processing and manufacturing plants (excluding foamed plastics) with a capable height of storage of less than 3.0 m. <b>Storage activities such as:</b> Buildings or parts of buildings capable of storage: no more than 5.0 m in height; Warehouses and storage buildings (other than those listed above), capable of storage <del>no</del> more than 5.0 m in height, but with a height to the apex no greater than 8.0 m and total floor area of no more than 4200 m <sup>2</sup> . Temperature controlled storage with a capable height of storage of less than 3.0 m, other than some limited areas in processing areas, or up to a maximum area of 500 m <sup>2</sup> with a maximum capable of storage height of 5.0 m. <b>Intermittently occupied buildings (other than outbuildings) such as:</b> Light aircraft hangers, buildings containing fixed plant and/or fixed machinery and spray painting operations, whether or not in a spray booth.

2. Re-inserting the requirement for a Type 9 in Table 2.2b for buildings in risk group CA with an occupant load between 251 and 1000 people, and an escape height between 4 and 10 metres. Refer to page 43 in 2019 C/AS2.

3. Amending Table 2.2c to allow for the substitution of a Type 3 with additional smoke detectors where the environment might be too challenging for a Type 4. With the development of the new table in the 2019 C/AS2, key footnotes were erroneously left out. Where the occupant load is 100 to 250 and 251 to 1000, and the escape height is between 0 and <4 metres (four fields altogether), footnote 4 should be added to allow for this substitution. Each of the four boxes should read: 44,5,6, 187. Refer to page 44 in 2019 C/AS2.
