We have been receiving a number of enquiries from members and other interested parties about the use and disposal of firefighting foams. I am not going to get into the specific types of foams here, but I did want to highlight a few points to our members.

First, we are in multiple and ongoing discussions with the New Zealand Defence force, Fire and Emergency NZ, the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA), the Ministry for the Environment and local councils around what to do in terms of safe disposal. These discussions are complicated, and delivering a suitable outcome will take time. However, do know that we are working hard on this topic and the aim is to help our industry deal with legacy issues as well as disposal of current foam waste.

The EPA have a number of guidelines around storage and disposal of firefighting foam, and the latest information can be found here: <https://www.epa.govt.nz/news-and-alerts/alerts/>

We strongly recommend that our members regularly check this website for the latest alerts, information, requirements and obligations about the management and disposal of firefighting foams to ensure compliance.

Halon Project Close Out

The Halon recovery project we had in place with the Ministry for the Environment has now ended. A highlight of the project was knowing that 3.9 tons of the ozone-depleting Halon 1211 and 1301 were recovered and safely disposed of. This is a great result for not only FPANZ members but also the environment.

Even though the project is complete, we are aware additional quantities of Halon still exist. We are working on a smaller back-up project to assist with the collection

and safe disposal of remaining quantities. If you know of any, please contact us asap, as the timeframe on this will be very short.

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

There is no doubt that the new regulations have arrived with significant impact, there is no second document with answers to the many variables that we are presented with on a daily basis. It is for evacuation consultants and industry to work through the processes we develop, and ensure we adopt the changes in regulation in the spirit in which they were intended.

One of the more significant challenges is that evacuation procedures for a building must now allow for people who require assistance to be evacuated to a place of safety. They can no longer be left in a place to gather until Fire and Emergency NZ arrive. While this may impact on the design of buildings in the future, buildings applying for evacuation schemes in the meantime will need to implement management procedures to achieve this. This may mean providing equipment and/or training regular occupants in techniques for evacuating people who require assistance. While there are already international examples of how this can be achieved, it is believed that building occupants and evacuation consultants will come up with innovative approaches to achieve this.

The Fire Information unit now handles all of the trial evacuation reporting in addition to their existing duties, there is also a slight delay in scheme processing as we all adapt to the new regulations.

A collaborative approach sharing our experiences and knowledge is likely to achieve the best outcome. The SIG is the place to table these thoughts in order we can develop best practice, this in turn will improve safety in the industry – our common goal.

Please send all of your queries through to evac@fpanz.org Fire and emergency have also been asked to send any reoccurring questions through to me so we can discuss these during the SIG meetings.

Having delivered and launched the Passive Equipment Register in June – the Special Interest Group (SIG) is determined not to let the grass grow beneath us and is pushing on.

We are moving forward with phase two of the **Passive Equipment Register** with improvements in software to make the register more user friendly – further announcements to follow in next months newsletter!

TECHNICAL POSITION STATEMENTS

July saw working groups review the first batch of Technical Position Statements for release to industry – we expect to publish by end of next month!

The Position Statement review process has been set – resulting in statements being prepared, reviewed and published efficiently and promptly.

These will be an invaluable industry tool in providing technical guidance to Architects, Fire Engineers, installers, IQP's and Construction Monitors.

NZQA L3 QUALIFICATION

The NZQA L3 Qualification working group met this month and has moved to the next stage in the process which is circulating a survey to industry to gauge numbers that would sit the qualification - once completed - supporting funding requirements going forward.

The NZQA L3 working group has also reached the stage of reviewing modules existing within other NZQA industry qualifications that could be adjusted/amended to fit our requirements and created a list of new modules that need building from scratch!

With the heavy work load we put upon ourselves this year – we have fallen slightly behind in the arranging and presenting of seminars surrounding NZ Passive Fire Protection market – it was our feeling that we would rather focus our energies on positive solutions – rather than covering the same old ground of problems and negativity!

As always – we invite members of the FPA to attend our Passive SIG meetings – if you're not a member but would like to get involved and support the positive work we do - let us know and we can arrange a complimentary seat at our next meeting.

Inspectorate SIG Update

Following on from the recent very successful Alarm "Get it right" seminars, I would like to thank all those who attended, hopefully you all came away with some insights into what you can do to help with our industry goal of lifting the standards and getting it right.

For those who were unable to attend a couple of the key takeaways are as follows

- We all have a "duty of care" as fire industry experts to:
 - Ensure safety of people and property with what we do.
 - Communicate issues with fire systems where and when we see them.
- As members of the FPA you or your company's directors have signed up to the FPA code of conduct.
- The inspectorates are putting a greater emphasis on the workmanship and reliability clauses of NZS4512:2010, 109 and 110 as they apply to the end installation.
- NZS4512:2010 refers to several other standards codes, e.g.: AS/NZS3000. You need to have access to them and know where and how to apply them.
- Everyone in the fire protection industry needs to be part of the solution.

As a part of the seminar David Prosser lead an excellent workshop to gather ideas for the improvement of NZS4512, many very good ideas were put forward and it was interesting to see what changes the industry would like to see. This is stage one of the forthcoming review process for those who were unable to attend and would

like to have their ideas heard as well please email your suggestions to myself, David or the FPA.

We are also looking to develop several "installation guides" for specific areas of NZS4512 such as line-type heat detection, if you have any specific areas you would like the FPA inspectorate group to look at please email me.

As always happens when people with differing points of view or terms of reference read the same clause there can be differing opinions on what a clause within a code means. Standards NZ has a method to follow where this happens with the formal interpretation system. A form for this can be downloaded from www.standard.govt.nz

The SIG has not had a meeting recently as we are still trying to work with MIT to set a date for the first Fire 101 (Certificate of Attendance in Fire Technology) Course. The administrative wheel of MIT is slow and they have not been able to confirm everything yet. Unfortunately the funding was applied for and approved under the a previous person. That person was made redundant under a restructure move at MIT. The new person is not yet up to speed with our project. We have been pushing them for 3 months now but we still have not got it across the line. Unfortunately it has not been from a lack of effort on our behalf.

On a better note the NZ Diploma of Fire engineering has been formally submitted to NZQA for approval. We are waiting their response. We have also secured a site at the Careers and Transitional Education Advisors annual conference to promote the Diploma and Certificate. This way there will be over 800 careers advisors from all over NZ under one roof which we will be able to educate about our industry and impress on them the need for more workers in our industry. Keynote Speakers

Dr. David Crowder

Head of Fire Investigation and Expert Witness Services, BRE Group

David has overall responsibility for the fire investigation team as well as expert witness services across all disciplines in the BRE Group of companies.



He specialises in investigating fire development, the performance of fire protection measures and systems during real fire incidents, and the regulatory aspects of performance in these areas. Major fire investigations he has worked on include the Penhallow Hotel fire in Cornwall, the Atherstone-on-Stour warehouse fire, Royal Marsden Hospital, Cutty Sark and the Lakanaal fire in Camberwell.

Research projects include: fire spread in car parks, researching the effectiveness of residential sprinklers, evacuating mobility impaired people from hospitals, developing a fire protection strategy for HMS Victory, developing cost effective water misting systems for use in prison cells and a scoping study on the environmental impact of fires. He holds a PhD in the impact of fire chemistry (flammability and toxicity) in fatal fires, examined via the investigation and reconstruction of real fires.

Arnold Dix is a passionate advocate for safety in complex built structures. With an international reputation as a disaster investigator, consultant and advisor - trained as a Lawyer and Scientist - with a professional background spanning Partnerships in some of the world's leading Law firms, a barrister and Visiting Professor of Engineering at Tokyo City University His background and professional focus is rather strange but useful. He serves on two NFPA standards (NFPA 130 and 502) at the invitation of the US for nearly 20 years, sits on the Executive of the International Tunnelling Association (UN affiliate), is a registered British Investigator, and founded the ALARP group of companies.



Niall Rowan

Chief Executive Officer, ASFP

Niall started working in fire in 1979 graduating to managing Warringtonfire's (Exova) test laboratory operations. He drafted the first twelve fire resistance test methods for CEN in the 1990s and from 2007 to 2009 he was President of EGOLF, the European organisation of fire testing laboratories and certification bodies.



In 2009 Niall became the ASFP's Technical Officer, responsible for the Association's technical output, including the recently revised Yellow, Red, and Blue Books, the ASFP Guide to Passive Fire Protection for Fire Risk Assessors and many other publications.

Niall took on the role of Chief Operations Officer at the ASFP at the start of 2017 providing leadership and direction to the ASFP's aims to ensure professionalism in the design, development, specification, installation and maintenance of Passive Fire Protection.

In early 2018 Niall became the ASFP's Chief Executive Officer where he continues to work with government, agencies and other stakeholders. He currently spends much of his time involved with fallout from the horrific Grenfell Tower fire and sits on the Building Regulations Advisory Committee which is revising the statutory guidance to the Building Regulations in the wake of the tragedy.

Sean Decrane

Sean DeCrane retired as a 25+ year veteran of the Cleveland Division of Fire. He rose through the ranks and serving in various roles including the Director of Training and Acting Chief of Operations. He retired as a Battalion Chief covering Cleveland's Westside



Sean has been very involved in the research at Underwriters Laboratories and the National Institute of Standards and Technology. He serves on the UL Fire Council, is a member of the UL Fire Fighter Safety Research Institute's Advisory Board and is currently on a number of technical panels for research and standards.

Chief DeCrane also represented the International Association of Fire Fighters in the International Code Council process and has served on the 2009, 2012, 2105 and 2018 Fire Code Developing Committee and as Chair for 2015 and 2018. Sean served on the NFPA 1 Technical Advisory Panel, NFPA Research Foundation on Tall Wood Buildings and is serving as the Chair of the fire Test Work Group for the ICC Tall Wood Building Ad Hoc Committee.

Sean has been awarded the 2015 UL Council Member's Achievement Award, 2014 Fire Equipment Manufacturer's Fire Safety Advocate of the Year Award, the 2013 International Association of Fire Chiefs Life Safety Award and the 2012 ICC-IAFC Life Safety Advocate Award. Sean has delivered a number of keynote addresses including the 2015 Fire Department Instructor's Conference. Currently Sean has been appointed as the UL Manager for Industry Groups and association and Professional Organizations.

Jonathan Barnett

Technical Director, RED Fire Engineers, Australia

Jonathan has over 40 years' experience in fire safety engineering. Previously a professor of fire engineering and mechanical engineering at WPI in the US, Jonathan has researched topics such as computer modelling of fire, structural fire protection and the development of tests for firefighting personal protective equipment. Today he is the Technical Director for RED Fire Engineers in Australia.

As an expert witness, Jonathan has testified on fire events throughout the world. In 2001

Jonathan was a core team member for the Building Performance Study that investigated the events of 9/11.

Currently, Jonathan is the national chair of Engineers Australia Society of Fire Safety and a Subject Matter Expert for The Australian Building Codes Board. He is also a founding and life Member of the Society of Fire Protection Engineers (NZ Chapter).


