'Get it Right' Training Seminars

Our plans to roll out more training to members and their staff have continued, with the 'Get it Right' training being held recently in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch. The seminars focussed on fire alarm systems, best practice and NZS4512. These seminars were well received and, in fact, so popular that we had more potential attendees than we could enrol, so we have booked two additional sessions: one in Tauranga on Wednesday 4 July and one in Auckland on Thursday 5 July. They will cover the same topics as in June, and we expect another high turnout, so if you would like to take part, please email us for an enrolment form.

Some of the content in the June seminars covered awareness of workmanship standards and trying to clarify definitions around acceptable workmanship. The sessions were very interactive, and participants had the chance to fully engage with the three presenters and other attendees.

The other significant area covered in the seminars was around scoping potential changes in NZS4512. Standards NZ have indicated we might be able to get a project underway sooner than we expected, which is good news and reaffirms our decision to push forward with a levy on fire alarm inspections like the one currently in place around sprinkler inspections. We will also be booking a few more NZS4512 standards meetings to enable further feedback on the standard and what we as an industry think will be required in terms of changes.



Passive Equipment Register Launch

The Passive Equipment Register was launched in Auckland, Hamilton, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin. Again, attendance exceeded our expectations, with each venue at capacity. Along with healthy representation from our members, the engineering community and Councils also had a very strong presence. The feedback from these events was hugely positive, and both events provided a great opportunity to update industry stakeholders on the work we are doing as the voice of the industry and to emphasize the advantages of only using FPANZ members for anything to do with fire protection.

As you are all aware the new Fire and Emergency New Zealand (Fire Safety, Evacuation Procedures, and Evacuation Schemes) Regulations 2018 come in effect ton 1st July 2018. I would like to acknowledge the input from Todd O'Donoghue and Peter Gallagher keeping us informed and updated on the changes as they arise, in particular for taking the time to present to the SIG group earlier in the month.

With any new legislation there are many questions and interpretations that arise as we settle into the new way of working, the SIG group is an excellent forum for discussing these queries, we will be working closely with FENZ to ensure queries are coordinated through us.

Now the regulations are finalised work has begun to update our Code of Practice ensuring it fits with modern thinking and legislation, FENZ is also requesting feedback from their members who work with us on a day-to-day basis.



The FENZ online scheme portal will be down from 25th June to allow for the upgrade accommodating the new legislation, they will be accepting paper applications during this time.

I look forward to seeing you at the upcoming meetings and working through any challenges that the new regulations pose for us, don't forget you can now dial into the meetings via our skype portal.

HOFFE SIG Update - Author Steve Smith - HOFFE SIG Chair

Hi everyone,

We have had an interesting month particularly as it included a visit to our HOFFE meeting from Pete Gallagher & Todd O'Donoghue ahead of the new Fire & Evacuation Regulations coming into effect. While these regulations are available to view or download we appreciate the fact that they took the time to come & share with our group the processes as well as the results of the submissions which we made for inclusion & consideration in the new regulations.

This was the main feature of our 11th June meeting & as it was likely to take more time than any other topic we made it the focus of the meeting. Obviously while we were keen to understand the document, processes & changes to it our main interest was to see if our submissions which were made both in person & written had any impact. Regulations 14 & 15 relate to fire extinguishers covering maintenance of them, training to use them (if installed) & the ability of FENZ to mandate the installation of fire extinguishers. Regulation 14 also specifically calls for maintenance to be carried out as per NZS 4503:2005 stating "The owner of any hand operated firefighting equipment installed in a building for fire fighting by the building's occupants must maintain it in accordance with NZS 4503:2005- Hand Operated fire-fighting equipment."

While we understand that this is the first roll out of the new regulations for Fire & Emergency & the recognition of the need to maintain this equipment so it is "fit for purpose" is great, we had hoped that as we have been able to show a cost benefit argument as well as a life safety benefit using the NZFS survey that we may have gained some recognition.

It would appear that perception of introducing cost to business has been one of if not the main barrier to mandating the installation of HOFFE in all commercial businesses. We all know that HOFFE is already mandated for specific risks however where other risks that also catch fire exist it has not been mandated in these regulations by the government.



We know that many companies with an interest in Health & Safety as well as preserving their equipment/ plant see the value in HOFFE that is why companies with machinery they rely on install them. We see examples of this in many industries, it can be a farmer's tractor, a forestry companies harvester, a hotels kitchen, jewellery manufacturing, plastic extrusion, tourism ventures, a takeaway or a building site, this diverse list of examples where they are voluntarily installed goes on.

So where to from here, well inevitably there will need to be tweaks (amendments) made to the regulation so we hope that by getting our own initiatives underway we can put not only show a cost benefit scenario to them but also offer a framework to deliver it that has ethical member companies operating within the regulations. Obviously this is where our FPA Suppliers Register & Code Of Practice become important, as an industry we must show a positive point of difference & unlike some operators not gain notoriety for being taken to task by the Commerce Commission.

Many thanks to all those who made submissions & especially Todd & Pete for their efforts in both representing our case & coming back to us with the results (sometimes a daunting task), we look forward to continuing to work together in the future.

New Evacuation Regulations to Promote Fire Safety

Coming into effect from 1 July 2018, the Fire and Emergency New Zealand (Fire Safety, Evacuation Procedures, and Evacuation Schemes) Regulations 2018 (the Regulations) provide a new foundation for fire precaution measures and the safe, prompt and efficient evacuation of people in the case of a fire, or alarm of fire.

Along with sections 75 – 79 of the Fire and Emergency New Zealand Act 2017 (the Act), these Regulations replace the current legislative framework.

Minimal changes have been made to those buildings defined as relevant buildings in the Act, which must have an approved evacuation scheme and comply with both Part 1 and Part 2 of the Regulations; there were also minimal changes around the types of buildings that must comply with Part 1 of the Regulations.

Most buildings that are workplaces or allow public entry are covered by Part 1 of the Regulations and must follow a range of fire safety precautions to help manage the risk of fire and have an evacuation procedure in place to enable evacuation in the case of a fire.

The main changes in relation to Part 1 of the Regulations are:

- Requirements for the colour and layout of fire action notices installed on or after 1 January 2019.
- Clear requirements that all occupants must follow evacuation procedures.
- In non-sprinkler protected buildings with a single means of escape, Fire and Emergency may require an owner or tenant to install hand operated fire-fighting equipment where there is a risk that a fire is more likely to affect the means of escape.
- New offences for various breaches of the Regulations

In Part 2 of the Regulations, the major changes you will notice from 1 July 2018 relate to the type and amount of information required as part of the evacuation scheme application process This will allow a more robust assessment of applications to be carried out.

- Applications for an approved evacuation scheme must now be made prior to, but no more than 30 days prior to, occupation of a new building or of an existing building being used as a relevant building.
- Fire and Emergency now has the power to revoke or require a variation to an approved evacuation scheme.
- Evacuation schemes must provide for people who
 may require assistance to safely evacuate using the
 buildings means of escape, or have a fully compliant
 place of safety inside the building if they, or any other
 person, are to remain inside.
- Un-scheduled alarm activations, such as a real event or unwanted/false alarm, are now able to be counted as a trial evacuation.
- Allowances can be made for people who require assistance or are under supervision during a trial evacuation.
- Building owners must notify Fire and Emergency of certain events, including if they and the nominated contact person are going to be out of the country.

While New Zealand has a good history of fire safety within commercial and industrial buildings and the loss of life has been minimal, a number of buildings are still affected by fire each year. The new Regulations aim to improve the level of protection building occupants have from the risk of fire.

As part of these changes, Fire and Emergency New Zealand will be working to raise public awareness of the requirements under these Regulations, and look forward to continuing to work constructively with the Fire Protection Association and its members in the interests of protecting communities.

Ministry of Education Design Requirement Updates

The Ministry of Education takes fire protection in schools very seriously. Their design requirements are often more stringent than those required under the building code. Their current document (Fire and Safety Design Requirements for schools 2008) is presently undergoing a multi stage review process.

The first two stages of this review have taken place and have been released as addendums to the original 2008 document. The latest addendum addresses, sprinklers, compartmentation, and fire alarm systems.

The major changes are summarized as follows:

Sprinklers

- a. Sprinklers are mandatory when:
 - a new building (or significant alteration of an existing building) has a floor area over 2,400m²; or
 - multi-level buildings with an escape height above 10m, regardless of the size and shape of the building; or
 - the school has an existing sprinkler system that has sufficient capacity to support new buildings or major redevelopment of existing buildings.
- b. Sprinklers are recommended where the practice of having sleepovers in a school is likely to be a key part of the school culture or curricula.
- c. Sprinklers are not mandatory in a satellite or special needs unit (either standalone or integrated within a school building), provided that all of the following requirements can be met:
 - the unit is always situated on the ground floor of a building with any difference in height between ground floor and the final exit way level less than 2m, and the exit route does not consist of steps or stairs; and
 - more than one escape route is provided; and
 - the open path travel distance direct to the outside is no more than 20m; and
 - irrespective of other compartmentation requirements for the building, the unit forms its own firecell with a two way Fire Resistance Rating (FRR) of 60/60/60; and
 - the school can demonstrate compliance at all times with relevant regulations for evacuating people with disabilities who require assistance to reach an external place of safety.

Firecell Size

- a. For buildings with sprinklers installed, there remains no limitation on the size of a firecell.
- b. Where a building is not sprinklered, the maximum allowable firecell size be 800m².

c. Unsprinklered assembly halls and gyms are allowed to have a maximum area greater than 800m² if fire separations will disrupt the intended use of the building. Adequate fire separations shall be provided to align with change in activity boundaries, such as between the hall and administration, or where acoustic separations are to be installed.

Fire Detection and Alarm Systems

- a. For all new schools or major redevelopments, the fire alarm systems must:
 - have a site-wide integrated fire alarm panel with a single point of access for monitoring and control;
 - be analogue addressable;
 - have spare capacity to accommodate predicated growth (20% spare board capacity for expansion); &
 - be integrated into a mimic alarm panel located at an appropriate place for ease of access by FENZ emergency response personnel upon arrival at site.
- b. Align the Ministry's standard for fire alarms with NZS 4512: 2010, and remove the Min-istry's current separate fire alarm standard specification (SFA1) guideline as it is outdated.
- c. Align the Ministry's fire alarm occupancy load with Acceptable Solutions C/AS1- C/AS7, except that:
 - minimum fire alarm system requirement is Type 4 (automatic smoke detection), irre-spective of occupancy load (noting that firecells not suitable for smoke detectors may have smoke detectors being substituted by heat detectors);
 - such fire alarm system requirements do not apply to ancillary buildings and outbuild-ings, except boiler rooms, plant rooms, or buildings that are vital to the school's operation.
- d. Mandatory FENZ connection for fire alarms in all new buildings or major redevelop-ments.
- e. Where any new building (or existing building undergoing a major redevelopment) is providing permanent sleeping accommodation, the Ministry will require full compliance with Acceptable Solutions C/AS2 and in addition the inclusion of a minimum Type 5 (automatic smoke and heat detection) fire alarm system.

Commencement of the policy changes

The above policy changes come into effect on 1 June 2018.





David has overall responsibility for the fire investigation team as well as expert witness services across all disciplines in the BRE Group of




