# Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

#### PASSIVE PRODUCT REGISTER LAUNCH!!

The FPANZ are proud to announce the launch of Australasia's first ever trade association register of passive fire protection products tested to AS 1530.4-2005/2014 and assessed to AS 4072.1-2005/2014.

The register has been created to help Architects, Fire Engineers, Councils, Installers and IQP's specify, consent, install and inspect NZ Building Code Compliant products.

For many years industry had debated the issues surrounding passive fire protection non-compliance – but very little was done to put measures in place which would improve the state of the industry – around eighteen months ago - FPANZ passive fire protection special interest group set out three main improvement projects that would help raise the life safety bar – and the launch of the FPANZ passive product register is the delivery of the first of the project!

The register is open to both FPANZ members and nonmembers to list their products.

Its self-regulating – each registered supplier signs an undertaking that listed products are fully tested to AS1530.4-2005 (& 2014) or assessed to AS 4072.1-2005 (& 2014), that the test data is within date, tested/assessed at an ILAC accredited laboratory and that the reports are made readily available to industry upon request.

Any supplier / manufacturer who does not keep to the undertaking runs the risk of removal - which is a pretty big incentive!

FPANZ has already received feedback – only a few days after launch - from Architects and Fire Engineers that they will be specifying "passive fire protection products listed in the FPANZ passive product register" on their projects going forward - which is fantastic news!

So if you're a manufacturer or supplier of passive fire protection products and want join the register – please let us know.

We hope that the register will fast become the "go too" for industry wanting to ensure code compliant products are selected.

We are already working on the next two projects – FPANZ position statements providing one technical voice to industry



– instead of the situation we have currently – which is lots of different opinions coming from lots of different individuals and the other being the new NZQA level 3 and 4 qualifications for the installation of passive fire protection working alongside our strategic partners Competenz.

The end result of these three projects will mean that the Architect or Fire Engineer will be able to specify products referenced on the FPANZ register, installed by an NZQA level 3 or 4 technician backed by Technical Position statements that clarify any complexities through the process.

The FPANZ Board, Council and SIG groups work for the good of the industry – without industry support – with all the best will in the World – things wont change for the better – so please – continue supporting us and if you have any questions, ideas or want to become part of the association – please get in touch!

# Inspectorate SIG Update

I was recently asked to give a talk to a group of IQP's on what a survey is where it fits into the Bwof process and what they as IQP's should be looking for and what they need to know.

What a sprinkler survey is or isn't.

- It is specific checks to ensure functionality and a visual check (from ground level) of the system. These checks are done using the methodology noted in the latest standard *with reference to the standard of installation*.
- It does not verify that all areas of the system are 100% compliant, they are a snapshot of the system on the day.

Sprinkler Survey reports will have three types or deficiencies listed within them

The first type are Significant/Serious Defects, These should preclude the issuing of a 12a as noted in NZS4541:2013 these are

- Deficiencies of sudden degradation of the water supply.
- An increase in the fire load beyond the capability of the system.
- External fire loads
- Unprotected areas
- Incorrectly set or faulty fire or pump start pressure switches
- Over age diesel pump set starting batteries
- Defective, damaged or painted sprinkler heads (includes concealed plate covers)
- Components subject to recall
- Any defective device that precludes ongoing testing and maintenance.
- If an area was not able to be accessed after two consecutive Biennials.

The second type of deficiencies From NZS4541:2013 are the General/valve house items which are items that are required under the relevant clauses of NZS4541/4515 but don't meet the requirements noted above. Generally these will not adversely affect the operation of a system in a fire situation.

These can include

- Areas of poor coverage due to poor spacing or minor obstructions.
- Obvious issues with Hand held fire fighting equipment. (unless sprinkler installed to BC appendix B/D).
- Labelling
- minor corrosion
- incorrect details on block plans
- other non compliances with the system *relevant to the standard of installation*.

From NZS4541:2013 "If a process to remediate deficiencies that are not serious deficiencies has commenced, then such deficiencies shall not preclude the issue of a certificate of compliance with inspection, maintenance



and reporting procedures (Form 12A) provided that the deficiency has not continued for longer than 12 months since the time of first reporting"

In practice this means you have until the second Biennial is due to complete these items before they affect the 12A.

The third type is Observations and Recommendations often known as Duty of care.

Do not affect issuing the 12A for the sprinkler system at all but may note issues with other fire systems and will often note items that can be done to improve a system.

Fire alarm surveys also form part of the required tests for issuing of a 12A and NZS4512:2010 has a number of clauses which detail what issues will affect the issuing of a 12A.

- Clause 601.3
  - Notes
  - (1) A Certificate of Compliance is commonly referred to as a 'Form 12A' as defined in the Building (Forms) Regulations 2004. This is not the same as an Appendix J Certificate of Completion, issued at system commissioning.
  - (2) Significant deficiencies which would lead to a probability of system failure should be urgently attended to, to ensure that the system will operate reliably. Examples of such deficiencies include missing detectors or manual call points, or deficiencies that would significantly delay the operation of the system in the event of a fire. A Certificate of Compliance should not be issued if such deficiencies exist.
  - (3) Minor deficiencies which are in the process of being rectified should not preclude the ability to issue a Certificate of Compliance. Such deficiencies could include areas with individual detectors out of rule, a zone index that requires updating, and the like. If such deficiencies appear on subsequent inspection reports, a Certificate of Compliance should not be issued until such deficiencies are rectified.

#### Common issues we see:

- Painted / Damaged / corroded / taped Sprinkler heads
- Obstructed heads
- Not enough coverage
- Badly fixed pipe work

# Inspectorate SIG Update cont.

- Flue spaces blocked in racking
- Hoffe not serviced
- Degradation of water supplies
- Large Stacks of Pallets
- Unprotected areas due to new construction (usually this has "always been there")
- Smoke/heat detectors taped up or covered
- Sounders not working

The key to both sprinkler and fire alarm surveys is that they must be done with *reference to the standard of installation*; the requirements of a later standard cannot be imposed upon a system installed to a previous version of the standard. Surveyors and IQP's need to be up to date with all versions of the relevant standards and be aware of their responsibilities in this industry of "Life Safety" that we work in.

# **HOFFE SIG Update**

I imagine that like us, you are all well and are back in work mode and very busy after a few breaks during February (more at the end of this month).

We did have another productive and positive HOFFE Group meeting last month at our new venue in central Auckland, it was even more pleasing that we managed to get a few things sorted.

Within our HOFFE group we have been able to find clarify that the new Hazardous Substances and (Compressed Gases) New Organisms Regulations 2017 do require both high & low-pressure fire extinguishers (pressure vessels) coming into our country to get a be cleared andgain an Imported Gas Cylinder Test Certificate prior to being sold onto the New Zealand market. This may seem logical to most of us but previously a low-pressure cylinder (powder, foam, water, wet chemical etc) could be brought in without a clearance certificate however high-pressure cylinders required a clearance certificate!!!

Obviously this regulation becomes particularly relevant for those wanting their fire equipment to be part of our FPA product register as compliance with the HSNO regulations is one of the pre-requisite requirements to be met for an before a listing can be approved. It is pleasing to see that the role of hand operated fire fighting equipment has not only been evidenced in the fire extinguisher usage survey but also been reflected in the information available on the



FENZ website. Many thanks to people like Simon Davis, Lance Hunt, Simon Patton & all those who contributed to the survey as this recognition of the role our products play in life safety and business/property protection is well overdue.

I trust you all have a great month, our next big project for the group is the service company register which we will discuss at our next meeting.

# Reducing False Alarms - A Success Story

High on a hillside overlooking the picturesque Lake Wakatipu and the Remarkables, sits the ecofriendly Sherwood Hotel. However, it was not the location that brought this hotel to the attention of Fire Risk Management Officer, (FRMO) John Smalls, from Queenstown; it was the 27 false alarms, five small fires and one reasonably sized fire.

This building had the highest false alarm rate in the area, so John contacted the owner and began

a dialogue in November 2015 to find out what was happening. The false alarms not only occurred in the hotel rooms but also in the open restaurant/kitchen area. John worked with them to build a 'False Alarm Management Plan' as well as helping to upgrade the fire alarm system to an addressable intelligent system. They worked with a local company to stage the upgrade over six months which included:

- upgrading the detectors in 15 out of 16 rooms in the lodge building to have devices and fitted cages installed to all sensors over the bunk beds to stop damage from backpackers
- upgrading the alarms in the restaurant to multi-criteria heads to prevent the smoke from the open fire and open wood BBQ from activating the alarms
- removal of toasters in rooms
- implementing a staff training programme with ongoing regular training



- upgrading the detectors in the bathrooms and hallways of the hotel blocks to work with the new analogue addressable panel
- implementing a 12-month cycled deep clean/ assessment programme for the new smoke detectors.

The number of false alarms has decreased to two in 2017 and none so far this year. This is a great result for an area which relies on the response from volunteer brigades.

"The Sherwood has not rested on their laurels as they were very helpful during a recent scrub fire a year or so ago. They found rooms for all the rural firefighters (not easy in Queenstown) and gave them all a free meal in the evening. So in my mind, they are an exemplary building." - John Smalls, FRMO, Queenstown.
