Welcome to the August edition of the newsletter.

It has been another busy month for the association and—as I do each month—I would like to provide you with updates on some of our key projects.

Fire101 Pilot Recruitment and Training Project

The training special interest group (SIG) projects have been progressing well and, without detracting from Trent’s update later in the newsletter, it is all positive news. As you read this, we will have had meetings with several stakeholders who will hopefully help us launch this pilot project.

In short, Fire101 will seek 20–30 individuals looking for employment in the fire industry. These individuals will receive a rapid induction to the industry and the basic skills required to work within it (SiteSafe, first aid, to name a few). At the successful completion of the project, we will hold several placement meetings wherein FPA members will have the opportunity to interview and offer these recruits positions. If you would like to be part of this process, please get in touch with me asap.

This aim of this pilot project is to determine whether we can find our own people to bring into the industry and provide them with the basic knowledge they need to hit the deck running once placed within our membership base. The feedback so far is very positive, and the excitement and enthusiasm from within our industry is clear.

Product Issues and Industry Resolutions

One of the mandates of FPA NZ is to be the voice of the industry, and we take this obligation very seriously. We are often asked to get involved in product quality issues, complaints from the public about service delivery, and ethical complaints between members. This is something FPA NZ does need to do occasionally, and in fact we are currently working on four active files.

It is worth touching on this topic for many reasons, but primarily to explain how we deal with such correspondence or complaints. The association must be impartial when investigating matters brought to our attention. This isn’t always well received, as sometimes FPA NZ is expected to spring into action regardless of whether due diligence

has been completed and investigations conducted. Given this, I would like to cover two points in this update.

Complaints Against Other FPA Members

Let’s be realistic, members of any competitive market may not always agree with each other’s professional views or how they choose to do business. Disputes over customers or similar are usually contractual, and the association cannot get involved in contractual disputes between members. We remind all FPA NZ members to treat customers and competitors with respect, and use the code of ethical conduct as the basis for business dealings. Be considerate of the public; they look to us as the industry experts. Please don’t bring the industry or association into disrepute. Of course, this doesn’t mean you can’t have views that differ from those of your competitors, but they should be handled professionally. With this in mind, next time you are about to hit send on an email, be mindful of who might read it and the image you are conveying of yourself, your company, your association, and the wider fire protection industry.

Complaints About Products

We also receive complaints about products, so it is timely to identify where we stand on this, too. First, product complaints usually include a contractual aspect and—if so—this needs to be dealt with directly between the member and the supplier. Once this has been done, if a wider product safety issue remains that needs to be brought to the attention of other members, then we will assist with this and work with all parties. However, we still need to ensure we follow due process to first find out the facts. This often requires a reasonable amount of time and several phone calls, emails and some data collection to establish the facts and have them reviewed by subject matter experts and the like. Once this information has been put to the board or national council for peer review or other comments, FPANZ can then form an official position.

This process often seems to cause confusion for members and, again, FPANZ can be expected to enter the fray the moment something is brought to our attention. However, acting before the facts have been fully ascertained and an official position created, we leave FPANZ legally and financially exposed. Neglecting this process has previously left the association out of pocket after having to engage lawyers.

SYSTEM SENSOR 300 SERIES DETECTOR AND BASE COMPATIBILITY ALERT

WHAT IS THIS ALERT FOR ?

Recently an issue has been raised by an FPANZ fire alarm contractor of a smoke detector not powering up correctly when plugged into what should have been a compatible detector base. The detector in question was one of the System Sensor 300 series, manufactured by the company's European division, while the detector bases supplied in New Zealand are often made in their China facility. System Sensor, part of the Honeywell Corporation, has detector manufacturing plants in Europe, North America and China. The 300 series of detectors are distributed in New Zealand by both Tyco and Pertronic Industries.

WHAT FACTS DO WE HAVE ABOUT THE SITUATION?

We have been advised that what has been observed by the distributors (on a very random basis when carrying out extensive testing) is when a 300 series detector is plugged firmly into a recently manufactured detector base, one of the electrical contact pads on the detector may lift off the corresponding electrical contact spring in the base, meaning there is no power to the detector. These detectors can be programmed to have the LED blinking set to OFF or ON in a normal state, but are supplied with LED blinking set to OFF, which is the norm for European devices. This means if an alarm technician has plugged a 300 series detector into a base and not placed the detector into an alarm test, the LED blink may be off because the detector is correctly powered up and not blinking, OR it may mean there is no power to the detector. That is the issue being highlighted here.

The Fire Protection Association has now been advised that System Sensor has tracked the issue to a new detector base mould introduced into the Chinese production in April 2016. As this is one of several moulds apparently being used, not every base imported since then will have this incompatibility issue

with a 300 series detector. The distributors confirm that all conventional detector bases (model B401) supplied by System Sensor have always been and continue to remain completely compatible with the more widely used model 2151B and 2151BPI conventional smoke detectors - there is no issue whatsoever with these installed devices. The 300 series represents only a very small portion of conventional System Sensor detectors supplied in New Zealand.

WHAT FPANZ RECOMMENDS FIRE ALARM AGENTS DO

As an immediate precaution, the Fire Protection Association urges fire alarm service companies to identify and smoke or heat test any 300 series detectors purchased and installed by them since April 2016. The 300 series incorporates both smoke and heat detectors.

Pertronic Industries are waiting for a formal response from System Sensor on this issue, although Pertronic advise they have written to all customers who bought 300 series detectors from them since April last year and have outlined their proposed way forward with this issue.

In the interim, any concerned fire alarm companies or contractors should contact whichever distributor they purchased their 300 series detectors from.

Please ensure this alert is passed on to field staff. It is also a timely reminder for all field staff that "industry best practice" is to ensure all new equipment is tested once installed to confirm correct operation. The FPANZ will continue to work with both New Zealand suppliers on this issue and will continue to provide information to our members as it comes to hand. Where appropriate we will also engage with System Sensor directly to represent our members and end users of their products.

This month we have seen Fire Safety Residential Community Housing Proposal released via the MBIE website, <http://www.mbie.govt.nz/info-services/building-construction/consultations/consultation-fire-safety-residential-community-housing-proposals> which is open for feedback and comment.

The government have also formally announced the review of the Fire Safety and Evacuation of Buildings Regulations. The consultation period is now underway and closes at 5pm on Friday 8 September.

A discussion document is available from the DIA website, <https://www.dia.govt.nz/Fire-Services-Transition#Proposals>. This also covers offences, and penalties that were introduced as part of the new Act.

Fire and Emergency NZ will be facilitating a number of consultation workshops around the country. Dates and locations for these workshops are currently being scheduled.

The Evacuation SIG is intending to form a discussion group with regard to this, and make a formal submission.

You will have also received a paper from Ruggiero discussing Evacuation Strategy, and this month's SIG meeting introduced Blair Dyer from Austinsure, talking about liability for the Evacuation Consultant.

As the year progress we have seen an increased interest in the certified Evacuation Consultants qualification, and welcome the new applicants on board.

Training SIG Update

Kia ora koutou,

The training SIG had our meeting on 28 July and it was a very productive one. We were fortunate enough to have Dr Neel Pandey and his assistant Mary from Manukau Institute of Technology and Brenden Mischewski from Micro-Credentials attend our meeting too. There were two items on the agenda which were the content of the Fire 101 course and the content of the Diploma in Engineering - Fire Engineering.

After a very healthy discussion and an input from all persons present we were able to formulate a draft for the 5 week course for Fire 101. We are now putting together a business case for this course to obtain additional funding from E2E (part of the Tertiary Education Commission). Brenden and Dr Neel are helping us with this business case. Mary will be assisting us in providing quality educational material to deliver to the students. Some of the tangible outcomes for the students will be at least 3 unit standards i.e. fire extinguishers and first aid. They will also have their site safe certificate and be awarded CPD. What this means to employers is that once they complete the course and have their FPA certificate they are ready to start in the work force. They will also have a basic understanding of the fire industry and fire technology.

The main factor though is that they have proven that they are wanting a career in the industry and not just a job.

Dr Neel presented to us on the Diploma. He gave us a few options and they are writing a whole new course just for fire engineering or using the Diploma of Engineering core subjects as a base and have added additional elective subjects for fire engineering. We have opted for the second option. This will hopefully produce good all round fire engineering technicians. Dr Neel is taking our proposal to the Engineering Council for approval. Once approved it will hopefully be a fast track then to getting the course setup for next year. Our initial target audience is those in the industry already who want a qualification. There will be an ability also for recognition of prior learning too.

Our next meeting is at the end of August and we will be finalising the content of both courses. As I said this meeting was very productive and there were some good outcomes. It is still a long road to go but from my point of view there is a light now at the end of the tunnel. Thank you to the continued support of all the training SIG members.

At this month's meeting we covered off the final touches to the FPANZ Passive Product Register which will be launched at the FireNZ conference in October - we expect the register to become the "go to" for BCA's, fire engineers and architects in raising the bar in the use of building code compliant products.

We also discussed the introduction of FPANZ Position Statements – FPANZ are contacted regularly for comment on our position on any number of topics surrounding passive fire protection – MBIE are very keen for us to take a leader position in industry and we see Position Statements as a great platform to put forward our view providing clarity on different issues as they arise.

This, we hope, will help eradicate the confusion and misguided opinions currently being provided by the few – and put forward a fair and unbiased opinion to industry through the FPA Passive SIG.

We also had a short presentation by Ed Claridge – Senior Fire Engineer – Auckland Council who informed us of the creation of the new BCA fire Group – this group brings together a number of BCA's across the country and will help provide a platform for FPANZ to engage with and help deliver what is require by Councils.

He also presented the new Auckland Council Position Statement with regards to Passive Fire Protection which highlights the approach of Council to passive fire protection.

The FPANZ has also signed an MOU with BOINZ to work together and create a passive fire protection course which will provide unbiased education and training to industry by industry!

We were lucky enough to have Daniel Scheibmair – Technical and Education Manager from BOINZ at the meeting who gave a short presentation on the plans ahead.

Training and education are key focus areas for the association - the last topic of discussion was the FireNZ training and education programme – this is a collaboration between FPANZ, IFE and the SFPE.



The programme is looking at creating a Career path for people who want to enter our industry - from NZQA Level 3, 4 – onto diploma!

The FireNZ training group met recently – it was a fantastic meeting attended by MIT and Micro Credentials – things are moving swiftly and I hope to report back in my next update some very exciting news.

Our final message is one we repeat so often – our SIG Group is all about creating a safe, fair and level playing field for all – our vision is to provide training which is unbiased – onsite guidance provided by informed professionals – fit for purpose products supplied and installed correctly - we are in the safety business – our group leaves their company or organisation hats at the door as they enter the and put them on again as they leave.

I can honestly say that our group takes this message very seriously and the progress we are making is testament to this - I'd like to thank the group for their continued support.

Passive Product Register -

This at draft stage and has just a few minor typos to be amended before this will go before FPA for approval – so we expect this to be ready for launch at FireNZ in October.

Just in case none of our readers are aware, the new register will be the first central database in NZ which will detail all AS 1540.4/AS 4072.1-2005 code compliant products – which will be an invaluable tool for designers, councils, installers, construction monitors and IQP's.

Training / Qualifications -

This is by far our most exciting task ahead – our industry is crying out for a scheme where we can not only attract new blood into the industry, but train those working within to help raise the bar when it comes to design, services coordination, firestop installation, compliance, construction monitoring and annual IQP inspection.

The FPA, IFE and SFPE have created the Fire NZ Training & Qualification Initiative which will deliver a course which will not only bring recognition to our trade – but help inject desperately required new recruits into industry.

Working with bodies like Competenz, MIT and Engineering e2e – we believe we will be in a position to start delivering course material early next year.

BOINZ Training Scheme -

Along with the exciting developments detailed previously – the FPA are also engaged with BOINZ to create a passive training scheme to deliver to their membership – with a time frame of being available by the end of this year.

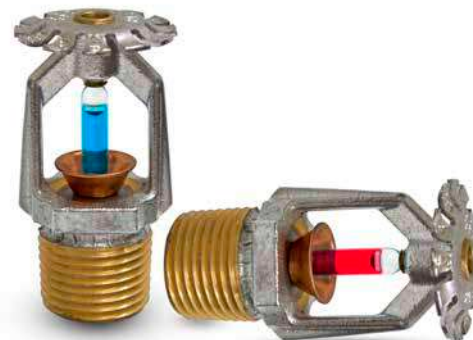

European Standard battery testing not equivalent to NZS 4512

MBIE has recently published NZS 4512 Formal Interpretation FI-127 which confirms that the battery testing regime of European Standard EN54-4 is inferior to that required by NZS 4512 for power supplies. This is an issue frequently encountered by manufacturers attempting to obtain Register listing of European Fire Detection Panels and/or Power Supplies.

FI-127

NZS 4512:2010 *Fire detection and Alarm Systems in Buildings* – Clause 212.6(b)

Question:

212.6(b) specifies the test that a system needs to perform to check that the battery still has adequate capacity to power the system.

Would a system that complies with EN 54-4:1997 including Amendments 1 & 2 (in particular, clause 5.4c and Annex A which require a fault signal to be given within 4 hours of the occurrence of a high internal resistance of the battery) be acceptable as an alternative technology (per NZS 4512 clause 101.4)?

Interpretation issued by the Alarms and detection group:

No.

The EN 54-4 clause 5.4c/Annex A internal resistance test is considered to be significantly less stringent than NZS 4512 requirements.

In general, EN 54-4 section 5.4 requirements are significantly different to NZS 4512 requirements, and are not considered to be equivalent.

Calling all Halon Fire Extinguisher Owners



FPANZ is promoting awareness around Halon fire extinguishers and wants to recover these from the commercial sector and from private owners.

Halon has fallen out of favour due to its environmental impact and long atmospheric life time. It is considered to be a potent greenhouse gas and contributes to ozone depletion. However, safety is the main issue as servicing of Halon extinguishers has not been available since 1998 when the production of Halon was banned under the Montreal Protocol.

Over the previous ten years, more than 60 tonne of Halon has been recovered by FPANZ members and this was sent for safe destruction. It is estimated that a further five to ten tonne is still in use. This needs to be recovered now as any unit still in use will be well over ten years old and will not have been serviced.

“Fire extinguishers, just like smoke detectors, need to be checked by a certified agent annually” says Blind

“We do have fears that Halon extinguishers, due to this lack of servicing, may fail to operate correctly in the event of a fire. We are prompting all members of the public to check their boats, cars, workshops, caravans and planes to see if they still have a yellow Halon extinguisher and to exchange this for a unit coloured red”.

“There will be a cost to change, however both the public and the environment will benefit as we can be sure new systems will operate correctly in event of a fire and the impact on the ozone layer will also be reduced” says Blind.

There are now many suitable and cleaner alternatives available and FPANZ members located nationwide will accept Halon units and provide information on the safer alternatives available. Halon extinguishers are easy to identify as they are bright yellow. Replacement units will be coloured red.

“We look forward to gathering as many of the remaining Halon systems and hand held fire extinguishers here in New Zealand and to have the contents safely destroyed” says Blind.

“We will also have greater confidence that owners will be protected in the event of a fire and this will ultimately protect lives”.

Our message is: **“Be Safe Yellow is Out – Red is In!”**

Yellow extinguishers, Halon extinguishers, are so old – if you have one, the chances are they will let you or your family down in a fire.

Halon damages the ozone layer which in turn can affect our health, causing skin cancer, cataracts and other illness as well. Damaging the ozone layer can also impact on our weather, our soil and our crops.

Protect yourself, your family or business, by handing in your old yellow extinguisher. It's easy to do – simply take it to the nearest local approved Fire Extinguisher Service Agent. A list can be found at www.fireprotection.org.nz

While there, talk to these experts about your needs and how best to protect against fire, including alternatives such as a red fire extinguisher*, a fire blanket, a smoke alarm, and other effective choices. Often a combination is the best approach.

So act now and hand in your old yellow extinguisher. It's a service for the general public and small businesses. A small recovery charge will be set at \$10 per kilogram (up to a maximum extinguisher weight of 2.1 kg in size). A Halon extinguisher larger than 2.1kg is considered a commercial size and will be disposed of at a quoted rate.
