### Commerce Commission Investigation of Aero Fire

Following the media release by the Commerce Commission last month, I requested further information to release to members.

I am pleased to say that, just in time for this newsletter, I have a formal response from the commission, which can be found on [pages 5-12](#). 

Please be assured that we continue to assist the commission in its ongoing investigation. I do request that members await further releases of information from the commission and know that we will keep you updated with any new details as they become available. For clarity, all information and responses from the commission contained in this newsletter are in the public domain.

### Competenz

It is great to see that, after much time, effort, and collaboration between Competenz, Fire Protection Association Australia (FPAA), and FPANZ, the new fire programmes are now live and ready for enrolments. Further details can be found on [page 13](#). I am also pleased to note that we now have more representation in our training SIG, with Mark Preece joining us in 2018 and Samantha McNaughton joining the council. This will further cement the joint FPANZ and Competenz initiatives to grow the skills in our industry and train new employees. I encourage you to share the information on [page 13](#) with your staff and get them enrolled. 

### FPA Charitable Trust

I am pleased to announce that the FPANZ board have recently approved an initiative to set up a charitable trust, and further details will be available once this process is completed. My intention with this trust was to establish separate funds for the sprinkler, fire alarm, HOFFE, and passive SIGs to finance standards development and training. This trust will be administered separately to the FPA and will have only the two purposes outlined above. I believe this is an important step in helping maintain the growth and development of key areas of our industry and ensure these objectives can continue to be delivered independent of the normal FPANZ functions and objectives.

### AGM

This year we held the AGM in Auckland at the Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron. Aside from being a great location, it was nice and central and had ample parking, making getting to the meeting easier for everyone. Amusingly, we were evacuated by the fire alarm just before the AGM, so we ended up a bit behind schedule. ### Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

#### Engineered Solutions!!!

This month's article deals with the difficult subject of engineered solutions.

An Engineered Solution – or commonly known EJ's (original name Engineered Judgement) – is a system proposal where no specific AS 1530.4/AS 4072.1 test data exists for a particular scenario.

There is currently no NZ standard industry approach for the creation of an EJ – which has led to confusion and in some cases their abuse.

An EJ should be created by a manufacturer – or somebody who has been closely involved in the development and testing of the product or system being proposed.

The reason – the creator needs to know how the system will perform – what its characteristics are – how it reacts to certain substrates – what its limitations are and where it might fail!

Currently we have a number of "Passive Fire Engineers" who are preparing and proposing EJ solutions – with all due respect to these companies – how on earth can they be qualified to know how different manufacturers

products perform in a fire – and who carries the liability?

Recently we were shown an EJ proposal for a particular manufacturers product prepared by a Passive Fire Engineer – it was based on an EN 1366 tested product – unfortunately – the Passive Fire Engineer had missed a critical part of the system from their proposal – having testing experience a member was able to pick up the flaw (this time) and alert Council before consent was given.

An EJ is an "opinion"- its created by product experts – considering many different fire tests – some that even failed and were never publicised – only those persons are qualified to create EJ's that have real safety value!

EJ's are the last resort and should NEVER be installed rather than a correctly tested or assessed AS 1530.4/AS 4072.1 system!

### Inspectorate SIG Update

Hi all, yes it's that time of the year again shortly you will blink and we will be into 2018. This past year has been one of turbulence on the Inspectorate front and not a lot of progress made within the SIG this year.

2018 is looking to change all of that with the entire current inspectorate keen to play a part in the SIG. Our first task as a revamped SIG has been to set up a Fire Alarms Technical committee, as we have had a number of queries recently regarding interesting views on what particular parts of the standard do or don't mean. The idea behind the committee is for it to be able to answer a few questions that crop up from time to time but don't necessarily require a Formal Interpretation; where required send something through for an FI and provide some installation guidance to the wider industry. We also hope that this will bring an even field to how inspectors see certain parts of the code.

We are currently working through a brief on what the technical committee will cover and have invited each of the alarm inspectorates to nominate a person to be part of the committee. A number of other highly qualified individuals from differing parts of the alarm industry have also been invited to participate, we are also looking for a contractors' representative so if you would like to be considered please contact Kiran Soma as the Chair of the contractors SIG who will pass your details on.

While we as an industry like to think that we get things correct 100% of the time every now and then it appears we miss (or ignore) parts of the code, generally speaking these tend to be fairly minor and we have discussed this

scenario amongst the committee and agree that the best plan in cases where we discover items that we as an industry have gotten it wrong is to draw a line in the sand, inform the industry via the FPA give a short moratorium to allow people to integrate and changes and then start enforcing from a given date, no retroactive remedial action would be expected.

Where we discover something that may critically affect the operation of a system we will also follow the same format however we will recommend that remedial action is taken. NZS4512 601.3 Note (3) allows a 12A to be issued once found at the Annual survey with one year to remedy the situation.

Currently we have three items under discussion which we hopefully have answers for and with luck we will find a space on the FPA web site to post once complete, they are.

- Sequential Numbering of alerting devices, is it required, if so what protocol should be used?
- Clarification and installation guide for Linear Heat detection around the 4m from any point in the building and requirements around the 500mm from apexes.
- Are wall mount heat pumps/AC units classed as Air outlets for the purpose of the 1m clearance rule?

### Official Information Act request # 17.097 Aero Fire

1. We refer to your request of 27 November 2017 for a copy of the “stop now” letter the Commission sent to Aero Fire (NZ) Sales & Services Limited (**Aero Fire**).
2. We have treated this as a request for information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

### Our response

3. Subject to withholding the information identified below, we have decided to release the “stop now” letter addressed to Aero Fire, dated 15 November 2017, as you have requested.

#### *Section 6 (c) - Maintenance of law and investigations*

4. We have withheld information under section 6(c) of the OIA because we consider it may prejudice our investigation.
5. As you know, the Commission is undertaking a current, active investigation into whether Aero Fire’s conduct is likely to have contravened the Fair Trading Act 1986 or Crimes Act 1961. The Commission is still assessing the complaints it has received and information gathered during the course of the investigation, and has not yet decided whether to take any enforcement action. Release of the redacted information may prejudice the investigation or potentially, any subsequent proceedings.

#### *Section 9 (2)(a) – privacy of natural persons*

6. We have decided to withhold the contact details of all individuals (including Commission staff) under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA to protect the privacy of natural persons.

*Section 9 (2)(ba)(i) protect the future supply of information*

7. We have withheld information under s 9 (2)(ba)(i) of the OIA that was provided to the Commission where we consider the release of that information would jeopardize the supply of future information, and it is in the public interest that such information should continue to be supplied.

*Public interest*

8. Section 9(1) requires the Commission to establish good reason for withholding information, and requires that the Commission must balance the reasons for withholding against any countervailing public interest in disclosure.
9. We recognise that there are public interest reasons for disclosure, including the transparency and accountability of the Commission's investigations.
10. Where information has been withheld, we have considered that the reasons for withholding the information outweigh the public interest in disclosure.

**Right to review**

11. If you are not satisfied with the Commission's response to your OIA request, section 28(3) of the OIA provides you with the right to ask an Ombudsman to investigate and review this response.
12. Please note the Commission intends to publish this response to your request on its website. Personal details will be redacted from the published response.

### Fair Trading Act 1986: Stop Now Letter

1. As you are aware, the Commerce Commission (**Commission**) is investigating complaints about the business practices of Aero Fire (NZ) Sales & Services Limited (**Aero Fire**). The complaints raise issues under the Fair Trading Act 1986 (**FTA**) and the Crimes Act 1961 (**Crimes Act**).
2. The Commission has now had the opportunity to review the information you have provided to us, and take signed statements from a number of your customers.
3. We are concerned that Aero Fire has engaged and may be continuing to engage in conduct in breach of these Acts and that consumers are being harmed by this conduct.
4. Consequently, in this letter, we:
  - 4.1 Request that Aero Fire immediately stop engaging in the conduct specified in this letter.
  - 4.2 Set out the nature of our concerns.
  - 4.3 Set out the potential consequences of failing to comply with the Commission's request in this letter.

### Request to stop conduct

5. The Commission requests that Aero Fire immediately cease:
  - 5.1 making false or misleading representations, specifically that:

- 5.1.1 Aero Fire has pressure tested, refilled, or recharged a customer's fire extinguishers, when [REDACTED]
- 5.1.2 punching fire extinguisher maintenance tags indicating that fire extinguishers have been pressure tested in a certain month and year, when [REDACTED]
- 5.1.3 Representations that Aero Fire services fire extinguishers in accordance with the New Zealand Standard NZS 4503:2005 for Hand Operated Fire-Fighting Equipment (the **Standard**), when it does not;
- 5.1.4 Representations that fire extinguishers need to be serviced every six months, when the Standard sets out that inspections, testing and maintenance are required to be carried out yearly (+/- 1 month);
- 5.2 engaging in misleading conduct, specifically:
  - 5.2.1 removing and replacing fire extinguishers, or servicing existing fire extinguishers that have previously been serviced by Aero Fire or any other company less than 11 months prior (and therefore do not require servicing in compliance with the Standard), unless the fire extinguisher requires servicing due to use or damage, or that customer has called Aero Fire to request its service; and
  - 5.2.2 [REDACTED]

**Nature of our concerns**

- 6. The Commission is of the view that Aero Fire may have engaged and be continuing to engage in misleading and deceptive conduct in breach of the FTA and Crimes Act.

**Misleading claims about servicing in accordance with NZS 4503:2005**

- 7. It is an offence under the FTA for a trader to make a false or misleading representation that services are of a particular standard (section 13(b) of the FTA).
- 8. We are concerned that Aero Fire has likely breached section 13(b) of the FTA, for the reasons set out below.
- 9. [REDACTED]

10. We are concerned that Aero Fire is unlikely to be providing services in accordance with the Standard because [REDACTED]
11. We are of the view that Aero Fire does not service fire extinguishers in accordance with the Standard because of the following:
  - 11.1 The Standard requires the creation of (1) commissioning records when new fire extinguishers are installed, that include identification marks and location records, (2) maintenance records when fire extinguishers are serviced, and (3) reports containing additional information, as set out in the Standard. [REDACTED]
  - 11.2 We have reviewed the invoices you have provided and spoken to and taken statements from a number of Aero Fire customers [REDACTED]. The Standard requires yearly servicing of fire extinguishers, plus or minus one month from the date of initial installation. [REDACTED]
  - 11.3 We have spoken to and taken statements from a number of Aero Fire customers, which include pictures of the fire extinguishers supplied and serviced by Aero Fire. These fire extinguishers demonstrate that Aero Fire has applied its company labels on fire extinguishers contrary to the Standard because the Aero Fire labels are larger than the maximum size allowed in the Standard, and some have been inappropriately applied over information on the fire extinguishers.

#### **Misleading claims about the need for servicing every six months**

12. It is an offence under the FTA for a trader to make a false or misleading representation concerning the need for any goods or services (section 13(h) of the FTA).
13. We are concerned that Aero Fire has likely breached section 13(h) of the FTA, for the reasons set out below.
14. We have spoken to and taken statements from a number of Aero Fire customers who have said that Aero Fire has told them that their fire extinguishers need to be serviced every six months. In fact, the Standard requires yearly servicing of fire extinguishers, plus or minus one month from the date of initial installation.
15. [REDACTED]



- 16. In both instances the inaccurate oral and handwritten statements indicating when the next service is required could have misled customers regarding the need for the service in breach of section 13(h) of the FTA.

**Misleading claims regarding services performed**

- 17. It is an offence under the FTA for a trader to make a false or misleading representation that services are of a particular kind, or that services are supplied by any particular person (section 13(b) of the FTA). It is also an offence under the Crimes Act to obtain money by deception (section 240(1)(a) of the Crimes Act).
- 18. We are concerned that Aero Fire has engaged in conduct that breaches these provisions, for the reasons set out below.



- 21. We have reviewed the receipts you have provided us

- 22. We have spoken with the seven Auckland-based certified cylinder testing facilities that pressure test and recharge fire extinguishers, and a Christchurch based testing facility, who told us that none of them have performed any services for Aero Fire.

- 23. Enquiries made to other companies that sell and service fire extinguishers, resulted in them denying that they have ever serviced fire extinguishers for, or on behalf of, Aero Fire, with the exception of the fire extinguishers referenced in paragraph 21.

- 24. We have looked at several of the fire extinguishers that Aero Fire has charged for pressure testing, recharging and refilling, and it appears that these extinguishers have not been pressure tested, recharged or refilled. Fire extinguishers that Aero Fire has charged for pressure testing, and have punched the maintenance tags as being pressure tested, do not have the silver label that is applied to the cylinder when pressure testing has been conducted. Additionally, these fire extinguishers still contain the original cylinder testing label that state "remove when recharged".

25. We are therefore concerned that some of Aero Fire's customers may have been misled as to the kind of service provided because we suspect that the services were not provided as claimed. These customers are likely to have suffered loss through deception by Aero Fire because we suspect the services they paid for were in fact not provided.

#### **Deceptive conduct with respect to the date of pressure tests**

26. It is an offence under the FTA for a trader to make a false or misleading representation that goods have been reconditioned at a particular time (section 13(d) of the FTA).
27. We are concerned that Aero Fire has likely breached section 13(d), for the reasons set out below.
28. We consider it likely that pressure tests were not completed because:
- 28.1 These fire extinguishers do not contain the silver label that is applied by the certified laboratories after pressure testing is conducted.

28.2 

#### **Deceptive conduct with respect to the maintenance history of fire extinguishers**

29. It is an offence under the FTA to make a false or misleading representation that goods are reconditioned (section 13(d) of the FTA).
30. We are concerned that Aero Fire has engaged in conduct that breaches this provision, for the reasons set out below.

31. 

#### **Further information on request to stop the conduct**

32. The Commission's immediate objective is to prevent further harm to consumers or competitors who are complying with the law.
33. In the Commission's view, the conduct set out in paragraph 5 is likely to cause significant harm to consumers.
34. The Commission considers that providing customers with incorrect information about the servicing history of fire extinguishers is also a significant safety risk.

35. The Commission is not satisfied that all of the conduct set out in paragraph 5 has ceased. Nor is the Commission satisfied that sufficient systems are in place to prevent further harm to consumers.
36. Therefore, to prevent on-going harm to consumers, the Commission requests that Aero Fire immediately ceases each practice specified in paragraph 5.

### **Penalties for breaching the Fair Trading Act and Crimes Act**

37. Only the courts can decide if there has actually been a breach of the FTA and Crimes Act. The court can impose penalties where it finds the law has been broken. A company that breaches the FTA can be fined (for each offence) up to \$600,000 for a company and up to \$200,000 for an individual. Under section 241 of the Crimes Act, every person who is guilty of obtaining by deception or causing loss by deception is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 7 years, if the loss caused or the value of what is obtained exceeds \$1,000.

### **Next steps**

38. Please confirm by no later than 4:00pm on 24 November 2017, that Aero Fire intends to comply with paragraph 36.
39. The Commission will consider our next steps on receipt of your response. Please note that the Commission may still bring legal proceedings in relation to this conduct, irrespective of whether it has subsequently ceased. We recommend that you seek legal advice in relation to this letter or guidance on your legal obligations.
40. If there is any other information that Aero Fire considers is relevant to its determination to cease the conduct, please advise the Commission in your response.
41. A written response should be sent to [REDACTED] either by post to Level 13, 55 Shortland Street, PO Box 105-222, Auckland 1143 or by email to [REDACTED]@comcom.govt.nz.
42. As the Commission's investigation remains ongoing, we may also contact you again to request further information.

### **Public information**

43. This letter is public information. We may make public comment about our investigation, including issuing a media release or making comment to the media.

## Enrolments open for new fire protection programmes

Industry training organisation Competenz has launched new fire protection programmes for apprentices and trainees.

Developed with input from industry experts, the programmes cover skills in detection and alarms as well as fire protection and hand-operated firefighting equipment.

Each certificate is a combination of practical on-the-job learning and theory delivered online through Canvas eLearning, which apprentices and trainees can access 24/7, whenever and wherever it suits them.

A Competenz training advisor visits throughout the year to structure the training material into manageable chunks of learning, set deadlines with learners to complete assessments, and support them through their training.

Fiona Kingsford, Competenz Chief Executive, says the new certificates have been designed to build skills across all businesses dealing with fire protection and fire detection systems.

“Developing highly skilled employees is critical to staying competitive, productive and safe. These new qualifications take a step-by-step approach, which allows for practical and theory to be combined to give better structure and spread the learning load.”


## Sprinkler Contractors Listing Formalised Agreement
