Information Notice re: System Sensor Series 300 Smoke Detector Issue

Further to the News Flash issued by the FPANZ on 15 August 2017, we wish to provide the following additional information and clarification for the benefit of FPANZ members and subscribers.

The Issue

Honeywell has recently been advised of incidents where some System Sensor Series 300 smoke detectors are not powering up correctly. This issue arises where model number B401 detector bases manufactured at the Honeywell's Xi'an site since April 2016 are combined with S300 detectors manufactured at Honeywell's Trieste site. It appears that electrical contact is not always made between the two products. The incompatibility of the two products may cause a Sensor not to function, and potentially presents a serious risk of injury to people and damage to property. Each of these products as manufactured by Honeywell at the Xi'an and Trieste sites, function correctly when paired with compatible products as detailed in our technical literature.

Our Recommendation

Honeywell has had ongoing communications with our distributors on this issue. Honeywell has recommended that our distributors initiate a program for the replacement of all B401 bases (manufactured from April 2016) that have been installed with S300 detectors in New Zealand. These bases are to be replaced with B401 bases from Honeywell's Trieste factory which are fully compatible with the S300 detectors.

Our Commitment

Honeywell has offered our distributors support and cooperation in order to remedy this situation as efficiently and quickly as possible and we have assisted them to provide information regarding the product issue to their installers, contractors and customers.

We are committed to ensuring our actions are in compliance with applicable local laws and regulations and Honeywell policies.

WorkSafe NZ v Budget Plastics (NZ) Ltd [2017] NZDC 17395

This first sentencing decision under the 2015 Health and Safety at Work Act - legislation that increases maximum health and safety penalties six-fold - suggests penalties are likely to be reduced for a small business unable to pay. The company, as a PCBU (person in charge of a business or undertaking), pleaded guilty to failing to ensure the health of its workers so far as was reasonably practicable. The worker suffered a partial hand amputation.

The court was expected to establish the starting point for fines and consider the possible influence of Australian case law but left these issues for the higher courts on appeal. WorkSafe wanted a \$900,000 starting point (previously around \$90,000 for high/medium culpability), the company, \$200,000. Instead, the court looked at a penalty range, proposing, for this medium culpability offence, a range of between \$400,000 and \$600,000, reduced here to between \$210,000 and \$315,000 on the basis of mitigating factors such as an early guilty plea. But the consequent fine of \$275,000 was

not the end of the matter. The court recognised \$275,000 as beyond the company's financial capacity and so reduced it to \$100,000 as the maximum the company could 'realistically pay'. \$37,500 reparation was payable for emotional harm and costs of \$1,000.

Compare this decision with other recent cases. Earlier this year, under the Health and Safety in Employment Act, a company that also pleaded guilty at the first opportunity (under the HSE Act to failing to take all practicable steps - fractured back and hip and lacerations) faced a starting point of \$60,000 with a \$31,000 fine imposed, plus reparation of \$35,000. Late last year, with worker death involved, the starting point was \$95,000, the total amount payable (repairs, fine, funeral expenses) \$142,875.

What the *Budget Plastics* case also indicates is that even when reduced, health and safety penalties are now likely to be considerably higher than in the past.

Sprinkler Contractors Listing Formalized Agreement

NZS 4514 - Interconnected Smoke Alarms for Houses - design standards updated

The Smoke Alarm design standards referenced in NZS 4514:2009 have been updated. This has been done because MBIE has published a draft new Design Guide for Residential Community Housing, which proposes to mandate NZS 4514 for certain supported living situations where a full NZS 4512 system is not warranted.

If this new Design Guide is implemented, it will be the first time that NZS 4514 has been cited in its entirety.

The title says it all - **Interconnection is fundamental to NZS 4514 and life safety...**

Interconnection of smoke alarms, a fundamental element of an NZS 4514 system, is currently neglected by the Compliance Documents.

The comment appearing after F7/AS1 clause 3.3.1 sums it up: "Smoke alarms also need to be located so that an alarm is given before the escape route from any bedroom becomes blocked by smoke. This includes those parts of escape routes on other floors. Although not required by this Acceptable Solution, the interconnection of individual smoke alarms should be considered if audibility is a problem."

Audibility of stand-alone smoke alarms on other floors (or even in other areas of the same floor) will always be a "problem", so it is hard to understand why interconnection is not mandatory under F7/AS1, bearing in mind that such systems are typically installed by electricians, not fire protection specialists.

NZS 4514:2009 *Interconnected Smoke Alarms for Houses* - Clause 5.1 and Referenced Documents

Are detectors that comply with the following new standards permitted?

- a) ISO 12239:2010
- b) AS 3786:2015
- c) CAN/ULC S531 (3rd edition) 2014
- d) UL 217 (8th edition) 2015
- e) BS EN 14604:2005

Interpretation issued by the Alarms and detection group:

Yes

Notes:

BS 5446 part 1:2000 has been withdrawn and replaced by BS EN 14604:2005.

EN 14604:2005 is still current.

NZS 4512 - Fire Detection and Alarm Systems in Buildings

Labelling of visual alerting devices

The requirements for "FIRE" labelling on visual alerting devices have been clarified by NZS 4512 Formal Interpretation FI-130.

When located on a detector, visual alerting devices do not need to be labelled, the same as for audible alerting devices.

However, unless a combination audible/visual alerting device is coloured red, it does require the "FIRE" labelling regardless of whether it produces a verbal message or not.

Visual alerting devices are typically provided for those who cannot hear an audible alerting device, or where high background noise levels are likely to be present.

Compliance of addressable devices

Formal Interpretation FI-128 has clarified that Short Circuit Isolators and addressable Input / Output Interface Modules require local laboratory appraisal testing to the specific requirements of NZS 4512 prior to Register listing. This also includes Short Circuit Isolators that are built-in to detectors.

Such devices are often certified to EN 54 standards. However, this does not replace the need to assess them against the requirements of NZS 4512 for functionality and compatibility with an NZ-listed control unit. In the New Zealand compliance regime, unlike detectors, such devices are viewed as a distributed part of the control equipment.

NZS 4512:2010 *Fire Detection and Alarm Systems in Buildings* – Clauses 218.3 and 218.4

Question:

Clause 218.4 requires visual alerting devices to be either coloured red or incorporate a white strobe with the word 'FIRE' coloured red illuminated.

- a) If the visual alerting device is located on a detector does it still require the word 'FIRE' illuminated?
- b) If the visual alerting device is located on an audible alerting device which produces a verbal message does the device still require the word 'FIRE' illuminated?

Interpretation issued by the Alarms and detection group:

- a) No.
- b) Yes, unless the combined audible/visual alerting device is coloured red.

Calling all Halon Fire Extinguisher Owners



FPANZ is promoting awareness around Halon fire extinguishers and wants to recover these from the commercial sector and from private owners.

Halon has fallen out of favour due to its environmental impact and long atmospheric life time. It is considered to be a potent greenhouse gas and contributes to ozone depletion. However, safety is the main issue as servicing of Halon extinguishers has not been available since 1998 when the production of Halon was banned under the Montreal Protocol.

Over the previous ten years, more than 60 tonne of Halon has been recovered by FPANZ members and this was sent for safe destruction. It is estimated that a further five to ten tonne is still in use. This needs to be recovered now as any unit still in use will be well over ten years old and will not have been serviced.

“Fire extinguishers, just like smoke detectors, need to be checked by a certified agent annually” says Blind

“We do have fears that Halon extinguishers, due to this lack of servicing, may fail to operate correctly in the event of a fire. We are prompting all members of the public to check their boats, cars, workshops, caravans and planes to see if they still have a yellow Halon extinguisher and to exchange this for a unit coloured red”.

“There will be a cost to change, however both the public and the environment will benefit as we can be sure new systems will operate correctly in event of a fire and the impact on the ozone layer will also be reduced” says Blind.

There are now many suitable and cleaner alternatives available and FPANZ members located nationwide will accept Halon units and provide information on the safer alternatives available. Halon extinguishers are easy to identify as they are bright yellow. Replacement units will be coloured red.

“We look forward to gathering as many of the remaining Halon systems and hand held fire extinguishers here in New Zealand and to have the contents safely destroyed” says Blind.

“We will also have greater confidence that owners will be protected in the event of a fire and this will ultimately protect lives”.

Our message is: **“Be Safe Yellow is Out – Red is In!”**

While there, talk to these experts about your needs and how best to protect against fire, including alternatives such as a red fire extinguisher*, a fire blanket, a smoke alarm, and other effective choices. Often a combination is the best approach.

So act now and hand in your old yellow extinguisher. It's a service for the general public and small businesses. A small recovery charge will be set at \$10 per kilogram (up to a maximum extinguisher weight of 2.1 kg in size). A Halon extinguisher larger than 2.1kg is considered a commercial size and will be disposed of at a quoted rate.
