NZS4512 - Funding Gap

Talking about the Fire Alarm Equipment Register leads nicely into the issue of how to source funding for the revision of NZS4512. The Sprinkler System Certifier (SSC) has done a nice job of imposing a levy levy on all systems being submitted for certification; however, the fire alarm industry has not been as proactive, which has left us in the unfortunate position of having no available funding set aside to pay for changes to NZS4512. In my time in this position, I have spoken to several industry players about this shortcoming and, in my opinion, the time for talking is over. Two of the available funding options are an inspection levy on every new system or increased charges to list products in the Fire Alarm Equipment Register. I know views on these options will be polarised; however, as an industry, we need to deal with it. We are already working with an outdated document (NZS4512:2010) that refers to older international standards and doesn't allow for the many new products now available or the developments that have taken place globally since its last review.

By nature, fire alarm systems are electronic products, and we all know how fast electronics become superseded. By way of example, do you remember what cellphone you were using 8+ years ago? I suspect it had nothing like the capabilities of the one you use today. What if there was a standard that meant you still had to use that old brick today even though the latest phones are available everywhere else in the world? Well, to a lesser extent, this is one of the issues we have with NZS4512 not being kept up to date.

The industry needs to get on board with a funding model and, to this end, we are tabling this as a topic at the next contractors SIG meeting on 16 June. If you would like to be part of the solution, I encourage you to attend this meeting or to get in touch with me directly. We need to get funding for this project, so I need your input or you might find someone else makes the call on how to fund it.

FireNZ Call for Papers

Halon Update

Our third shipment of halon is about to depart New Zealand in the next week or two. It has been good to get many of the small 1211 extinguishers out of circulation in this shipment. I have been working with a few of you on some larger 1301 systems that are due to be decommissioned. We have one more shipment left to complete; after this, anyone with halon is stuck with it. The risk you and your clients face is that, in the future, the liability to ensure the safe containment of any halon will be extensive. Once this project ends, there will be no facility for the export or destruction of halon. So again, I call for you to follow-up with your clients and make them aware of the risks they face and the obligations they have regarding halon systems or extinguishers.

Evacuation Consultants Group Update

Following on from the change in the Health and Safety Act, Organisations will now have their relevant process in place. As such, I believe they are better informed about their responsibilities and that, coupled with the change in the NZFS Structure, is most likely the reason I am receiving more technical questions as the year progresses. Working with the fire service, we are able to obtain their latest legal interpretations leading us into a safer way of working.

Last month, I mentioned the new Training SIG - the first meeting was most engaging with all parties bringing something from their discipline to the table. It is vital that our group contributes a fair representation around best practices for Evacuation – please continue to email me with your submissions.

The Evacuation group is also giving consideration to starting a subcommittee to work on the proposed changed to the Fire Safety and Evacuation of Buildings Regulations 2006. It is expected that a review of the current Regulations will commence shortly after the establishment of Fire and Emergency New Zealand in July 2017 with the updated Regulations to be in place by July 2018.

The NZFS Fire Information Unit (FIU) are planning a number of updates to their Online Services website over the coming months to improve the user experience. Some of these updates have been requested through the Evac SIG group, including the ability to attach supporting documents to online trial evacuation reporting and to save draft applications as templates. The FIU are always happy to receive feedback from Online Services users and make improvements where possible – suggestions can be raised and discussed at future Evac SIG meetings.


Well the temperatures dropping, our clocks have gone back an hour & another month has passed since the last newsletter. On the plus side we have had another HOFFE group meeting which covered many items including an update from Kim Comben of Worksafe on their current C02 related investigations.

While not able to reveal items that may be prejudicial to the C02 investigations Kim provided us with some good insight into the issues, processes & challenges involved in this type of investigation in particular the potentially dangerous ejecting valve issue. Brett Neilson brought along some examples of the problem to share with the group which prompted some lively discussion around the issue, in particular the processes involved & time these could take. Worksafe are continuing their investigation & we will keep in touch with them & support them because as we all know this type of investigation must follow a procedurally correct course in order to not jeopardise the outcome.

Also on the topic of CO_2 extinguishers Geoff has confirmed that they have been pro-actively working with the CTLA to help Test Stations identify the differences between the cracks & folds as found in JX/Winner cylinders.

Other topics that were raised & updated include the Codes of Practice, NZS 4503 submissions, Training, the usage survey & ways we can assist the Commerce Commission with their investigations.

Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

Passive Fire Protection Moving Forward!

Is it me or is this year flying past - April already!

As we move into the second quarter of the year - I thought it timely to update our readers on developments within the Passive Fire Protection Special Interest Group (SIG).

As I mentioned in my first article after taking over as SIG Chair, I felt we had spent far too many years highlighting the negatives in our industry rather than dealing with the bigger question of how we should go about fixing the problem.

Up until the end of last year, we had virtually nothing to work with apart from the building code requirement that all penetration seals should be assessed to AS 4071.2 and primary and secondary elements should be tested to BS 476 parts 20/22 – so at our first SIG meeting we put forward four "building block" proposals which we believe will help move things forward.

The Passive SIG is one of the largest Groups in the FPA – with the potential for delay when trying to get a common consensus of opinion from such a large group – but not in our SIG – the proposals received strong support and we have already started the process of repair and improvement.

Product Register

Just to remind the readers of the four proposals - **Product Register** – a web based FPA register of products available in NZ which are assessed to the AS 4072.1 Standard as required by the building code of New Zealand. The register will be invaluable to designers, installers, councils and others to make sure they are sourcing the right product, tested to the right standard – but also when a product is not available – when to start looking at engineered solutions as the next best option.

Industry Training - there is currently little in the way of independent training or specific passive fire protection qualifications – this needs addressing to help raise the standard of passive fire knowledge and awareness.

Qualified Persons Register – Industry needs to have access to a list of trained persons to check they have the right person for the job!

Industry Technical Guides - We need to produce guides for all passive fire industries, such as penetrations seals, intumescent coatings, fire rated ductwork, fire doors etc. these guides will help designers, inspectors, installers and councils raise the bar of passive fire protection.

Barely four months into 2017 we have formed a **Product Register working group** which met in March and is already working on the way information will appear on the web site, the FPA has created a new **Training Special Interest Group** chaired by Trent Fernley which is working on an industry wide training program and industry recognised qualification in conjunction with Competenz.

I have arranged appointments to discuss **Technical Guides** with similar international trade associations over the coming months to look at what they have already produced and how we can learn from their experiences.

Its exciting times – hard work – but I think I speak for the entire industry – these proposals will do a huge amount of good and will help all levels of the construction sector!

Contractors SIG Update

The major need identified by the contractors is the need for training. A proposal to implement a training container was put forward to the board. The FPA board is in support of the concept, though further details of cost and sustainability need to be identified. In respect to the proposal, further details need to be put forward to the council including designs and budget. We put forward an estimated budget however; we noted that this cost could be reduced significantly, through sponsorship. The SIG members have talked to suppliers and they are keen to support the cause but are interested in more detail around what sponsorship is required and what they will get out of it. This is one possibility of where training could be developed. There are other possibilities under consideration, which may prove more cost effective and beneficial in general. We genuinely seek that contractors get involved with this SIG, move forward for the benefit of the whole industry.

NZS4512: When must you use 2/3 spacing.

The standard is specific with respect to the spacing and location of detectors and equipment. For example the restriction being 30m2 per point type heat detector. So if you are at 6m spacing in one direction, the maximum spacing in the other direction is limited to 5m. None the less, where ceiling construction constitutes a maximum 2/3 spacing with permitted 6m spacing in one direction, the maximum 2/3 spacing in the other direction is limited to 4m. Often, an installer in error assume 6m x 6m spacing of thermal detectors is acceptable. At first glance, though not exceeding the maximum 6m permitted spacing, technically would not comply, as 5m is the maximum permitted in the other direction.

NZS4541: Why is our standard so strict with respect to fixings and brackets?

The standard is intended to safeguard the integrity of the installed sprinkler system in both normal and operational conditions. Under normal conditions pipe work can be restrained and supported with relatively light weight means of support. So why do we have the 5 x weight of water filled pipe +100kg requirement? Because under flow and sprinkler operated conditions, significant forces are imposed on the pipe. On the flip side in some occupancies, you may have a situation where the pipe is incorrectly used to support load. Simplest solution is to ensure your piping supports comply with the standard.

Good house-keeping in a sprinkler protected warehouse

Modern roof level fire sprinkler protection of warehouses is significantly different to warehousing of old. The large discharge volume needs to reach the storage and cascade through the storage system.

- CLEAR AISLES These are important to avoid the fire jumping through multiple racks and triggering more roof level sprinklers than the water supply can support.
- UNOBSTRUCTED SPRINKLERS The water needs to reach the storage system. Relatively minor obstructions have been found, during full scale testing, to have a significant negative consequence; preventing the water from reaching the storage or causing water to spray onto nearby sprinklers and cold soldering them leading to skipping.
 - ► Has the lighting been changed?
 - > Has there been structural strengthening?
- CLEAR FLUES These are important to allow the water to cascade through the rack and supress the fire.
 - 75mm wide required between single width (normal) pallets.
 - ▶ 150mm wide required between double width pallets.
 - > Flues need aligned from bottom to top.
 - Have to be careful when the racking contains a mix as the flues have to be maintained for the full height of the rack.

- Solid barriers are a problem unless they are no worse than a double width pallet.
 - The open wire frame shelves are not a concern but maintaining flues spaces when boxes are stacked can be tricky.
- Scheme A or B in rack system allow a very wide range of special goods to be stored. We only allow for a few sprinklers in the rack to operate; as these are intimate with the fire they are very effective.
 - > 75mm maximum flue is critical.
 - 150mm minimum clearance between top of stowed product and sprinkler is critical.
- The RIGHT PRODUCTS for the design. Or should that be the right design for the product?
 - The design is based upon a maximum commodity group. The higher the commodity group the greater the fire load and hence the higher the volume the sprinklers discharge.
 - Is the warehouse supervisor aware of what the system is designed for?
 - Are there plastic pallets? If so is the design for at least Cat5?
 - Are there open top containers? These collect the water cascading from above so are not permitted.
 - Are there bulk timber pallets? These are equivalent to a Cat5 product.


