Welcome to the April commentary.

This has been another busy month for the association, and we are seeing some really positive outcomes as projects come to fruition. I'll update you on these below, and please also see further information later in the newsletter.

FireNZ Update

As you may be aware, this year we are taking FireNZ to Mount Maunganui for the first time. Planning is well underway, and we will be releasing the exhibitors' brochure in the next two weeks.

We have been working with several significant international keynote speakers this year and are in the closing stages of agreeing contracts. We will reveal more in the next newsletter, but we have at least four high-calibre speakers coming from the UK, USA and Australia – globally known experts in their field who are seldom available to come to New Zealand. You would be hard pressed to find this level of international speakers again in one location, so you will not want to miss FireNZ this year – it will be the best 'bang for your buck' for continued professional development (CPD). If you can only attend one conference this year for your CPD, best you make it FireNZ.

"Get it Right" Training Seminars

The next set of "Get it Right" industry training seminars will be held in June we will hold these in Auckland Wellington and Christchurch and will cover fire alarms topics. I strongly encourage you to get your staff to attend. We have heard of several cases from members and the inspectorates about areas of concern in both sprinklers and fire alarm systems. We have a responsibility as an industry to continue to develop staff and keep them up to date with current points of interest or where change is needed. We also plan to measure staff CPD as part of the sprinkler and alarm certification process in the future. Even staff and companies that have no issues have a responsibility to be represented at these events to stay abreast of industry developments. Our intention is to continue to raise the standards of our industry as a whole.

NZS4541 Standards Nominations and Process

I would like to update you on the selection of FPANZ representation for the NZS4541 review working committee. We were fortunate to be asked to provide three representatives to cover the main areas in which our membership would be affected:

- An FPANZ organisation sprinkler member representative – Adam Ellwood from Triangle Fire Protection
- A sprinkler contractor representative Craig Taaffe from Chubb
- A representative of the inspectorate group Brent Houston from SAIL

While the formal committee members are still to be approved by Standards NZ, we are pleased with the outcome of the process and the strong FPANZ membership representation on the committee. We will provide further updates as they come to hand.



The SIG meeting took place on Monday 9th April at the RNZYS at Westhaven, it was well attended (as normal).

The meeting was productive – we run trials on the new teleconferencing equipment - a great success - with participants from Dunedin to Sydney joining the group!

This is a huge step forward for the SIG – it will enable members to join us from almost any location – broadening our influence and participation within the SIG!

Two more manufacturer members announced they would be publishing their products on the passive fire equipment register this month – which is great news!

As the register is up and running - it was decided we now move to the second and third "pillars" being put in place for the improvement of our industry - that being position statements and industry qualifications!

A new sub group was formed to commence work on the technical position statements which will become "the" guidance to industry – by Industry – FPANZ!

The established training group is working hard – a cooperation between FPANZ & Competenz – have completed stage 1 of the process in the creation of the new NZQA level 3 and 4 qualification – it's a long road – probably an 18 month program – but will result in New Zealand's first industry recognised qualification for installers – a huge industry step forward in being recognised as a professional trade!

As always – id like to thank the members of the SIG for their continued support – its time consuming – but the results are starting to speak for themselves and our visions for a better industry are coming together!

HOFFE SIG Update

Hi folks, it looks like winter is coming at us fast especially in the South Island where some white stuff is falling from the skies. Like many parts of our industry we are fielding many calls about the foam issues with PFOS & PFOA becoming terms often heard in conversation. We all know that these have not been present for over 10 years in the foams used in our AFFF fire extinguishers, mobiles & fire suppression systems however I think that given the publicity this topic has received recently we had better rehearse our responses to this topic so we can reassure the public. While no one wants a fire if it happens & a foam extinguisher is available you would most likely use to save lives & property as the alternative is almost unthinkable. It is also worth noting that PFOS has been used in many commonly obtained items such as electrical parts, insecticides, metal plating, hydraulic fluids, leathers, carpets, upholstery, paper & packaging, rubber & plastics.

The recently published guidelines from Fire & Emergency NZ regarding the use Fire Extinguishers were great to see, it was especially pleasing as it showed that the results of the fire equipment usage survey were taken into account. This also means that we need to show people where you can obtain fire equipment from knowledgeable,

ethical suppliers such as those on our suppliers register. If our FPA HOFFE suppliers register is not available online by the time this is published, then it will not be far away from being available. This is



a logical link which will not only promote suppliers who have proven they follow the proper procedures & comply with the relevant regulations but the register will also provide freely available quality information for both the public & those from industries seeking fire equipment solutions.

Obviously, the next part of this equation is to sort out a Code Of Practice for our service personnel so we can complete the supply chain e.g. right product, right quality, right people, right installation location, right signage, equipment certified, documented, ongoing service scheduled. We have this FPA document in draft form currently so it is available for comment should you wish to do so.

Inspectorate SIG Update

Welcome to the latest SIG newsletter. Following on from our recent Inspectorate SIG meeting, I have a number of updates regarding topical items which we have been involved with. The items of interest are outlined below:

4512 Standards Development Levy

After discussion with various stakeholders, the FPA Council (with the support of the Inspectorate and Contractors SIG's) will be introducing a levy of \$45.00 on all new fire alarm systems installed and \$20.00 for all extensions/major alterations. The FPA are in the process of forming a charitable trust to hold the monies collected from this, and the similar sprinkler levy, to ensure these monies can only be used for their intended purpose. All of the inspectorates support this initiative, and believe this is the best method for maintaining New Zealand's high levels of fire protection standards. On 1st July, this policy will come into effect. The inspectorate companies will be in contact in the next couple of weeks to discuss the collection process.

As many of you will no doubt be familiar with, the sprinkler standard NZS4541 is about to undergo its next review. We understand that Standards New Zealand will be commencing the process to start revising NZS4512.

Labelling of Fire Alerting Device.

The Inspectorate SIG has been made aware of inconsistent in application of clause 402.11 from NZS4512:2003/2010; specifically with regards to the sequential numbering of alerting devices.

• 402.11

Zone circuits shall be allocated an identifying symbol. Every detector, sampling point, manual call point, alerting device, junction box, and end of line device shall be uniquely marked in a permanent and durable manner in characters not less than 5 mm high with its zone symbol and a designation indicating either its logical system address (such as corresponds with a system's alphanumeric display) or the numerical order in circuit beginning at the control unit. This marking shall be visible when the components are installed.

Upon consultation with industry experts, the conclusion was that the aforementioned clause is very clear in its requirements. Suffice to say, that, if we as an industry haven't been doing this, then we need to action it now. All of the Inspectorates will be ensuring compliance with this clause, and that it has been attended to, as part of their inspection process. In order to allow the industry to catch up on these requirements, this will be implemented from June 2018. All fire alarm junction boxes should also be labelled and these labels should correspond with what is on your as-built drawings.

The following guide can be used as an example of good practice labelling, other methodologies should be discussed with your inspectorate of choice to ensure correct compliance.

- Conventional systems with either dc or amplified systems
 - [SZ][X]-[1,2,3,.....EOL]
 - SZ being Sounder/Speaker Zone
 - X being the sounder or speaker feed number eg SZ1, SZ2.
 - This will require labelling of the sounder/speaker feed cable at the panel.
 - 1,2,3...EOL being the numerical sequence that they follow with the last being marked EOL

Note: speaker/sounder end of line locations also need to comply with the requirements of 405.3 requiring them to be installed in a readily available location.

- EWIS and Staged evacuation systems
- [XX]-[1,2,3...EOL]
- XX being the Amp or Evac zone
- 1,2,3...EOL being the numerical sequence that they follow with the last being marked EOL

Note: If the zones are spurred then an additional identifier will be required to show this.

- Apartment module/ AA switched systems
 - [LX]-[MX]-[1,2,3,...EOL]
 - LX -MX being the loop and device number of the apartment module/AA device controlling the sounders.
 - 1,2,3...EOL being the numerical sequence that they follow with the last being marked EOL
- AA sounders/strobes
 - Standard AA labelling applies.
- Junction boxes
 - Outside should be labelled JB-1, 2, 3 etc
 - Inside should clearly identify what each connection is for, either on the cables or via a legend on the inside of the box.

Strobes and other visual alerting devices also require labelling along the same lines as noted above.

Fire Alarm Technical Committee:

Going forward, the FPA inspectorate SIG with the support of a fire alarm technical committee of industry experts will be looking to issue installation and good practice guides on a formal basis. This will cover items of contention that are brought to our attention. These guides will be published on the FPA website and sent out via the inspectorates. We currently have the following topics that we are looking at.

- Linear heat detection installation guide.
- Good labelling practice.
- Panel installation and the workmanship like manner clause.

These will give industry and inspectors some good point of reference on what is required for an NZS4512 compliant system.

If you have any topics which require a similar guide then please let myself, Scott or your inspector know and we will add them to the list.

Get it Right Seminars.

Recently the FPA ran another round of "Get it Right" seminars with a focus on sprinkler pipe installation methods and seismic design practices. This was well received, however, it appears that the same people from the same companies are attending these seminars. Those

in the industry, who need these informative sessions the most, aren't attending. The FPA works hard with industry experts who invest their time, and considerable resources at no cost, for the betterment of the industry. The costs of these seminars are minimal and only cover the direct cost of hosting the events, and moving around the country. There is a huge amount of technical resources and advice brought into one spot with minimal cost. We are all here to try and improve the industry so please consider attending these or sending members of your staff along.

The next FPA "Get it Right" seminar will have a fire alarm focus with industry experts meeting shortly to set out the content. Again, watch this space and I hope to see you there.

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

The first of the meetings around the update for the Certified Evacuation consultant qualification went well. With a proposal to be put to the group that we 'scrap' the levels and replace with the option to hold the qualification or not. The paper will be broken into subparts testing knowledge around all areas of evacuation, safety in and around buildings, and managing people. We will likely keep the practical assessment in place.

Recently I have received enquiries around the need to require an outside line on fire action notices – a topic which comes up every so often. With the increasing use of cell phones, and more areas giving up landlines it may be worth revisiting this area.

Joanne Mackie has been appointed as the new Team Leader for the Fire and Emergency NZ (FENZ), Fire Information Unit (FIU). Jo has worked within the team for close to 5 years and is looking forward to the changes taking place within the new FENZ environment.

These changes, that include rural NZ, have had quite an impact on the FIU team. They have a high workload after taking on a support role for the Fire Permits. This has been a gradual roll out from the rural sectors since July 2017 and the urban is quickly coming through now to be in place by July 2018. The work the FIU team are doing is receiving over 500 phone calls a week and completing applications on line for those that do not have internet access as well as answering fire season status queries.

The FIU team would like to remind consultants to amend their templates that contain the wording 'NZ Fire Service (or Fire Service)' to 'Fire and Emergency NZ'.

Fire and Emergency NZ is still in consultation with stakeholders on the type of services needed in New Zealand, and how best those services should be supported

and funded and to incorporate the perspective of communities, and grow an organisation that is reflective of the communities it serves.

Ruggiero Lovreglio, lecturer from Massey University, who

regularly attends our meetings is currently working on a collaborative project with Massey University and Auckland DHB to start using VR training experiments for training hospital staff in dealing with Disasters. He is also working on a project to verify the effectiveness of VR training in the use of fire extinguishers. It is great to get updates on the way modern technology is helping with training in our industry, and have an input as to how this may be utilised.



Changing Evacuation Regulations Update.

The drafting of the new Regulations are now well underway however it will still be sometime before the exact content of them is known. In the meantime Fire and Emergency have started work changing their IT system ready for the new Regulations and will be preparing to train their people and update public facing material as soon as the Regulations become available. Fire and Emergency would like to hold a workshop with Evacuation Consultants once the Regulations are available so that we can work through them together and all have a common understanding of them. A date and location will be set for this as soon as a firm release date of the Regulations is known.

Contractors SIG Update

There has been some progress this year with regards to the FPA delivering to this SIG initiatives. With the introduction of video conferencing we hope to permit greater attendance of members at SIG meetings. Please feel welcome to contribute by phone, email if and where not able to attend our meetings.

Update to NZS4541 (Fire Sprinkler System)

This SIG called for candidates to represent the SIG on the new to be formed standards committee. It was agreed that the group would like to have regular feedback and input from the contractors representative to keep updated with progress. The vote to elect our candidate was carried out. We thank all candidates, all of whom are of high calibre. We are pleased to confirm Craig Taaffe has been voted as the contractors SIG representative. The elected delegate represents the significant financial and technical contribution SIG members make for the development of NZS4541. The mandate from the Contractors SIG, to our delegate is to inform us, represent our interest, and provide a conduit to the standard development from SIG contractors. The SIG delegate will communicate, review, and address changes with the SIG prior to public comment stage. Issues and proposed changes shall be worked through with the SIG members, for discussion with their delegate, be it in confidence if need be.

The delegate is aware this role is independent of their employer, though their employer may be a SIG contractor. The SIG delegate is expected to attend the majority of SIG meetings, (Video conference is available) and is required to provide written update to the SIG of NZS4541 progress and developments, on a monthly basis.

Changes to NZS4512 (Fire Alarm Systems, EWS)

This standard is in need for update. Unlike the sprinkler standard the funding is not readily available. On that basis the FPA has put forward a funding model which most parties appear to agree upon. Implementation of this funding model is now in place. Of major concern is that given the last update was 2010, new technology is now available, though technically not able to be implemented. Discussion was made at FPA council level with respect to NZS4512, adoption of new technology. At council level members of the standards committee, advised there is scope for submission of alternative equipment. All equipment would be considered on a case by case basis. New technologies had already been adopted as to be accepted as compliant with the existing standard. We hope now with funding the Standard will sooner rather than later have sufficient funds to update.

FIRE-101 industry entry training

Funding is now in place for this to proceed. This is aimed at new entrants to the industry. Possibly school leavers or those starting their careers in the fire industry. No anticipated in early 2018 a pilot scheme in Auckland. The aim of the course is to provide trainees a broad exposure to our industry sectors, ie Sprinkler, Alarm, Evac, Passive, Potable, Fire fighting, and fire engineering. The course is expected to be full time running for approx 4-6 weeks. Trainees upon completion of the course will be awarded an FPANZ certification. Trainees will be monitored and encouraged to progress further into a specific sector of our industry. The FPA hope to make available a pathway for FIRE-101 certified trainees to forge a career with FPA members.

FPA administrating the listing of Sprinkler Contractors.

The FPA member list is published on our web site and newsletter. This SIG is pleased the criteria for listing is being strictly administered.

Instances poor/inadequate workmanship

Contractors often discover instances of poor/inadequate workmanship on an existing installation. What should the procedure be? Client should be advised to revert back to the Inspectorate who signed it off and the original contractor who did the installation. Any installations that do not comply with the standard should be brought up to standard by the original contractor. Care should be taken to ensure that there have been no changes to the original fit out of the building which could be causing the issue. Contractors are advised to keep records on each installation including any exceptions and reasons for them – this will protect them should there be questions around the installation at a later stage.

Standards and Liability Always use a FPA member to satisfy your fire protection requirements.

FPA members are obligated to provide compliant systems. Quality is of high importance to FPA SIG contractors. On that basis this SIG is committed to assist our members to maintain the high standards delivered by FPA members.

Firefighting foam becoming more environmentally-friendly

Manufacturers of firefighting foams throughout the western world have been shifting towards less-polluting formulations since 2003 in response to increased understanding of environmental effects, according to the Fire Protection Association of New Zealand.

Nevertheless, the perfect non-polluting solution is yet to be found. "In the meantime, it's still a compromise" says Scott Lawson, FPANZ executive director.

Foam use must be weighed up in each case against the harmful effects of the fire itself, both to life and the environment. Containing and responsibly disposing of run-off foam and fire water effluent, wherever possible, is also crucial.

Firefighting foams are typically used on flammable liquid fires, which are among the most challenging and highly-polluting risks to fight. Such events include aircraft emergencies, petrochemical tank blazes and chemical factory fires.

"The lowest adverse impact is achieved when the fire is rapidly extinguished, using a minimum of water and foam, and with the least danger to either victims or firefighters" confirmed Chris Mak, FPANZ vice president and technical advisor on foam.

Older-technology foams contained significant proportions of either PFOS or PFOA, now identified in the Stockholm Convention as persistent organic pollutants (POPs). Manufacture of foam containing PFOS, also a suspected carcinogen, was discontinued in the west in 2003. PFOS-based foam has been banned from sale by the New Zealand Environmental Protection Agency since 2006.

The adverse effects of PFOA are still unclear, despite its accumulation in the environment and the human body. It is still widely used in many industries, including non-stick cookware and as a water repellent on clothing and textiles.

In an environmental stewardship program, the major western foam manufacturers all voluntarily transitioned to short-chain "C6" fluorinated foams, reducing PFOA constituents to almost undetectable levels in the process. These C6 foams have replaced PFOA-based foam and are highly effective at fire suppression in a wide variety of situations.

Fluorine-free foams have also been developed to address environmental concerns. Despite their immediate appeal, they are considerably less effective at fighting fires than C6 fluorinated foams. So more foam and water is needed, more run-off is produced, the fire burns longer, and is more likely to spontaneously re-ignite posing a hazard to both victims and firefighters.

Manufacturers are still working to improve the performance of fluorine-free foams, particularly on the hottest types of hydrocarbon fires. Meanwhile, fluorinated foams have valuable fire-fighting performance advantages unmatched by fluorine-free foams.

Fluorine-free foams, while being less harmful to the environment long-term, are acutely toxic to aquatic life short-term, especially fish, so must be kept out of waterways and disposed of responsibly as is the case with all foams.

According to FPANZ, most installed foam fire equipment (extinguishers and fixed fire suppression systems) will be free of PFOS or PFOA. Any owner concerns should, in the first instance, be taken up with their local fire protection equipment professionals.

Disposal of legacy stocks of old PFOS and PFOA based foam remains a significant issue, with no clear guidelines yet available from the relevant New Zealand authorities. Destruction in an approved high-temperature incineration facility is recommended by FPANZ.

"The Fire Protection Association is committed to working constructively with both industry and regulators to ensure the best outcomes" Lawson said.

Re: NZS 4512 fire alarm standard inspection levy

Since the last revision of the national fire alarm Standard NZS 4512 in 2010, there has been no mechanism agreed within the fire alarm industry on how to finance future revisions of the Standard.

Standards NZ expects industry to cover a considerable proportion of the ongoing cost for development of standards and, to date, the fire alarm industry has failed to agree on how to do this. Consequently nothing has been done, and a review of NZS 4512 is overdue.

Given the highly technical nature of fire alarm systems, and the ongoing emergence of newer technologies, the longer we delay in reviewing NZS 4512, the further we will fall behind the rest of the globe.

Over the past 18 months, FPANZ has been exploring options for the industry to help fund the future development of NZS 4512. Our Inspectorate Special Interest Group and, Contractors' Special Interest Group have canvassed their members and agree the best way to move forward as an industry is a small voluntary levy on fire alarm inspections.

This new alarm levy would be similar to the extremely successful sprinkler inspection levy that has been in place via the SSC for several years, and which is currently funding a review of the Sprinkler Standard.

To ensure this new levy is collected and used only for the betterment of the industry via fire alarm Standards development, the FPA is in the final stages of setting up a charitable trust. The trust's establishment deed will ensure that these funds are ring-fenced, administered by a separate board of trustees, and only used for the intended purpose.

Fire alarm equipment suppliers within the New Zealand Fire Equipment Manufacturers' Association are in support of this proposal, and those companies will also be directly contributing to the trust. The FPA national council has voted to endorse the proposal and suggest the inspectorate companies collect this levy starting from 1st of July 2018 to allow a lead in.

All six of the inspection companies have agreed to collect the following levies on system inspections. The amounts have been calculated as adequate to fund the likely cost of Standards revision over a 5-7 year cycle:

- \$45.00 per new (full) inspection
- \$20.00 per partial inspection

Inspectorates will collect this levy and pass it on to the charitable trust.

We encourage you to support this levy, and those inspectorates, by directly passing this levy cost on to your clients, end-users, and owners of buildings who should be contributing to the development of better standards and safer buildings for the benefit of all New Zealanders.
