## Voluntary Water Restrictions in Auckland

**Given the current water supply conditions in Auckland we suggest the following measures be taken by the fire industry to support Watercare Services efforts:-**

- Deferment of two yearly flow testing by inspection companies on existing installations. *We note that Standard allows a four month tolerance.*
- Deferment of quarterly testing by maintenance contractors. *We note the Standard allows a two week tolerance.*
- Commissioning flow testing of new installations be delayed as far as the construction program will permit.
- Flushing of new underground pipes be delayed.
- Where possible non-critical work on large volume installations that require draining the system down be deferred.

**We note that during this period of reduced consumption flow test results obtained may not be representative of the normal network capability.**

### Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

#### Passive Fire Inspectors

As the New Zealand passive fire industry grows, we are witnessing a dramatic growth in the number of specialist passive fire IQP's and independent third party passive fire construction monitors appearing in the market.

Looking at this in a positive light – this could be a good thing – more eyes examining the product data and method of installation – but we must be mindful of the risk!

As more and more building owners, fire engineers and council inspections get the “jitters” after years of negative publicity quoting legal action, life safety risks and 98% of all buildings being at risk due to inadequate passive fire protection – it's no surprise that this new set of passive fire “professionals” have found business opportunities!

Although they may be seen by some as saviours – we must remember that this new profession is currently unregulated, has few industry guide lines and in some

instances lack the training required to pass comment on manufactures product proposals.

The information being provided by many currently is almost entirely “opinion”!

I'm sure, like so many growing industries, they will evolve - but I do worry that the power some of them appear to have been given on site might potentially damage our industry reputation and lower the safety bar rather than raise it!

Remember – the manufacturer is still the best source of accurate information on how a product will perform in a fire scenario – they developed it, tested it and know how the product will behave and perform in a fire situation!

### Contractors SIG Update

**The SIG had our first meeting for the year. Feedback is positive and projects are progressing.**

Important outcomes of the meeting;

1. The group ratified their definition, of what a contractor is.
2. The Fire Training Container Project, a transportable Sprinkler / Alarm training facility, has been identified as a project the group wish to progress.  
Agreement is in place to put forward a budget to present to the FPA Board, end of March 2017, propose getting a grant from the Association to fund and produce this project.
3. Inspectors are frequently asked same questions and encounter common mistakes. The group will seek feedback from inspectorates so that we know what areas of clarification could be focused on.
4. The FPA is updating our Member Sprinkler Contractors list. This list is published on our web site and newsletter. To ensure your organisation is appropriately listed, contact the FPA.
5. Changes to NZS4541, 4512; In light of upcoming changes. It is the intent of this SIG to provide our members better representation and interaction on the new standards committee. The mandate of the SIG delegate is to inform, and provide a conduit to and

from SIG contractors. Streamline and ratify proposed changes prior to the public comment stage. Some work was done last year with respect to this, this SIG will be resuming this initiative.

This year we are looking at publishing a monthly article in this publication. Featuring , a topic of interest to the members. SIG members are encouraged to submit their topics, or article for review and possible publication, so to start;

#### **NZS4512: Are under floor concealed space detectors required?**

As per the standard clause 405.2.2 (b). Concealed spaces where detectors may be omitted. Irrespective of depth, between lowest floor and ground, which DO NOT contain equipment or stores, and which there is no access.

The operative parts of this clause are between lowest floor and ground (not ceiling or roof spaces), storage, and access. Storage meaning combustible goods stored, example; storage of clothing , building materials, furniture, general stock, old files etc. Building services and elements housed within an under floor space do not constitute the space being used as storage. Secured access doors and hatches are permitted for the purposes of maintenance of the under floor space.

### Contractors SIG Update *continued...*

#### **NZS4541: Design requirement for residential sprinklers?**

As per the standard clause 701.1 (b), the minimum discharge from each sprinkler is to be the greater of the following:

- i) the listed flow rates for NFPA 13D 13R systems; or
- ii) a minimum discharge density of 4.1 mm/min over a design area of the four most hydraulically demanding sprinklers for the actual coverage areas for the sprinklers.

NOTE – Users of this Standard should be aware that the use of outdated data sheets may not provide the latest listing data called up for residential heads. Attention is also drawn to the need to apply the most onerous of the two design criteria provided above.

So to clarify, designers should be aware many sprinkler manufacturers list their residential sprinklers for NFPA13R compliance, which may only provide as little as 2.1mm/m<sup>2</sup> area density coverage.

For example. A sprinkler for NFPA13R / NZS4515 compliance at 6.1m spacing may require as little as 75 l/min. The exact same sprinkler at 6.1m spacing for NZS4541 compliance may require flow rates as high as 153 l/min.

The FPA emphasises the importance of having the SSC design parameter review done prior to commencing a project.

#### **NZS4541: Future revision and amendment.**

Last year AON collected and collated a document outlining proposed changes to the standard in the next amendment. This document is available from the FPA SIG, members are encouraged to review and to add to it. Chris Mak, is heading this initiative to Standards NZ. The FPA will collate any additional member proposals and provide to Chris for inclusion for future consideration. The FPA propose this be finalised and submitted to SNZ by end of April 2017.

The FPA and SIG will be seeking delegates to represent the interest of our members on this Standards committee. The FPA will be putting forward the following delegates;

- FPANZ representative.
- Contractors SIG representative.
- Inspectorate SIG representative.

It is envisaged the delegates would represent the interest of their SIG membership, providing a conduit for communicating information. Where necessary seeking guidance from their SIG.

The delegate would be expected to be very technically sound, and voluntarily provide their time for this role.

The time frame for participation is expected to be later this year through 2018. To be considered as a representative register your interest. Contact the FPANZ, or respective SIG.

Registration will close end of May 2017, applicants contacted, with appointments decided thereafter.

# Water Supply Flushing

The success of a fire sprinkler system to adequately contain, or control, a fire is dependent upon at least the minimum required volume of water being discharged from the sprinklers heads. Inadequate flushing has the ability to drastically impact the performance of the sprinkler system. Inspectors around the country find evidence during commissioning flow testing that flushing was inadequate as evidenced by waste materials found in the flow meter after testing or by the telltale sign of stones 'pinging' inside the flow tube during testing.

The types of materials found may lead to many different types of system failure. Firstly on a high volume sprinkler system waste materials may obscure the strainer impairing the supply of water to the sprinkler system. Secondly waste materials may block the cooling system filter on a diesel fire pump leading to engine failure. Thirdly hard objects such as stones may damage or jam the pump impellor, isolation valves, backflow preventer, check valves and alarm valves. Fourthly larger objects much lodge within the distribution pipes severely reducing the flow of water to the sprinkler heads. Lastly smaller objects may foul within the orifice of the sprinkler head obscuring the free flow of water through the sprinkler head.

It should also be noted that within our trade flushing has a different meaning to that of the water supply industry where flushing is to remove any traces of chorine. Chlorination/sterilization certificates are not evidence of high volume flushing as required by NZS4541:2013. Flushing needs to be completed before the sprinkler system is connected to the underground pipe to avoid the possibility of foreign materials being washed into

the sprinkler system. While the flushing certificate in NZS4541:2013 gives minimum flow rates the simplest method is to simply discharge from the open end with the water supply operating at full flow, ie sluice valve wide open.

The requirement to flush all underground pipe is a requirement of NZS4541:2013 irrespective of whose contractual responsibility the installation of the pipe is. It is our view that the onus rests upon the entity submitting the form 1 documents to advise the underground contractor what is required. We would suggest that before connecting the valve set to the water supply the fire contractor obtains a copy of the flushing certificate or undertakes their own flushing.



# Drilling Holes for Concrete Fixings

This photo is an object lesson in what not to do when drilling holes for concrete fixings.

Firstly when a hole is drilled for a concrete fixing the hole has to be a minimum distance from the edge of the concrete, this is referred to as edge distance. Secondly when there are multiple holes required each hole has to be a certain distance from each other; typically this is half the minimum edge distance but refer to the manufacturers data. Lastly when the hole is not required then the separation to the next hole is normally the same as for multiple fixings.

The reason for edge distance is to prevent the fixing blowing out the side of the hole and no longer being held by the concrete. But what is the most concerning is due to the sheer number of holes drilled into this beam the strength of the beam has been compromised. It is sad that there is such a clear lack of knowledge by the installing technician, and lack of knowledge, attention and care by the sprinkler project supervisor. Cases such as this reflect very poorly upon our industry.

# BRANZ Passive Fire Protection Seminar



In the time since BRANZ last gave a seminar on passive fire protection in 2010, studies have shown that, in a large proportion of buildings, passive fire protection is not being effectively designed, specified and delivered.

This potentially poses a serious life safety risk for building occupants and firefighters in the event of fire occurring as well as increasing the risk of fire spread and subsequent property damage.

When appropriately integrated into a building, passive fire protection responds against flame, heat and smoke to maintain the fundamental requirements of building compartmentation, structural stability, fire separation and safe means of escape. This makes passive fire protection vital in ensuring the safety of building occupants, firefighters and property.

There is an overwhelming need for comprehensive guidance on how to design, specify, install, inspect, certify and maintain effective and resilient passive fire protection in New Zealand buildings.

BRANZ has produced a guide that introduces the principles of passive fire protection. It identifies the requirements of the New Zealand Building Code, explains the terminology commonly used and identifies the main building components that have a passive fire protection role. The guide enables the successful use of passive fire protection including providing the right product and installing it correctly in the right situation. It proposes good practice for specification, approval, installation and verification. Specific processes may vary between jurisdictions and the professional people involved, but in all cases, the appropriate product must be correctly installed.

The purpose of the seminar is to summarise the contents of the guide and explain them so that users can more effectively use the guide.

Attendees will have a better understanding of the guide and be able to use it effectively, and the seminar will help architects, designers, regulatory authorities, builders and installers to:

- better understand the relevant compliance documents
- incorporate passive fire requirements into building design more effectively
- identify key design and performance parameters for passive fire protection
- identify regulatory requirements for passive fire protection
- identify good installation practice
- ensure passive fire is well installed and meets specifications.
