### Fire Protection Charitable Trust Update

I am pleased to advise that the trust is now set up, and many of the functions that will allow it to operate, such as bank accounts and registration as a charity, are now complete.

It has taken considerable time and effort to get this far, with this month seeing a few milestones ticked off. The first is that FPANZ and the trust signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) in which FPANZ has agreed to provide administration support and accounting services free of charge to help the trust conduct its business.

The trust is also in the process of negotiating MOUs with the inspection companies to facilitate the collection of the proposed fire alarm system levy,

which is a real breakthrough that we are close to having fully up and running. I would also like to clarify that, although FPANZ was instrumental in setting up the trust and funding its initial development and ongoing administration costs, it does not run the trust or have access to its assets. These functions are carried out by a separate board of trustees to ensure the two entities can focus on their own primary objectives. However, there will be considerable collaboration on common projects such as standards development. If you have any questions, please contact us so we can put you in touch with the members of the trust's board.

### Suicide in New Zealand's Construction Industry Workforce

Site Safe have been working on a report into suicide in the construction sector, which includes some very sobering statistics. I strongly recommend reading it as a starting point to understand how we all need to effect positive change in our industry's workforce. The data were sourced directly from the coroner's office and cover ten years of suicides in the construction sector. This report provides initial insight into some of the identifiable factors that have led to suicides in our workforce. One of the stand-out factors was job insecurity and work-related stress, particularly for self-employed contractors and business owners. Over the remainder of this year, we will be incorporating into our member's meetings.

### Membership Engagement

We are in the process of planning the remainder of the calendar year and our membership engagement meetings around the country. We have made many

## HOFFE SIG Update

Hi everyone,

It has been pleasing to hear the positive feedback that we are receiving from clients and industry alike on our HOFFE products register, it is proving to be a valuable tool and gaining recognition in the marketplace. There are also expressions of interest from other HOFFE supply companies wanting to list their products on the site which is great to see.

I was recently contacted by people who represent the Insurance Industry asking about the practice of removing fire equipment from client's premises. They made it clear that their industry does not support the practice of removing first aid fire-fighting equipment. Unfortunately, this practice isn't new and in the past has been promoted by mostly well-intentioned individuals on the basis that people could potentially put themselves at risk by fighting the fire instead of getting themselves out.

Our group has discussed this practice on several occasions and offer the following commentary;

- a) We as an industry regard the operation of hand operated fire-fighting equipment (HOFFE) as being instinctive and not hard to operate, they are designed with this need in mind.
- b) In general people want to protect themselves, their families as well as their businesses both of which they are invested in emotionally & financially.
- c) There are often drivers that require businesses to install HOFFE be it from regulations, policies, best practice, commercial requirements or simply because they feel safer.
- d) Studies have shown that there are considerable benefits including economic. As a reference a quick search of FENZ website under "Fire Extinguisher Recommendations" will bring up an article stating that "80% of all fires in a commercial premises are successfully extinguished by members of the public without the intervention of firefighters. Of these 90% were extinguished using a fire extinguisher."
- e) A New Zealand based study that was funded by what was then the New Zealand Fire Service and produced by Civic Futures produced a 53-page report in 2015 (Research Report Number 148) detailing the annual benefit to the New Zealand economy was in excess of \$48million.

- f) The same reports states in section 3.11 "Human behaviour in fire can tend to be logical and if tools are given (such as HOFFE) they will be used." it also states that "Most people can use a fire extinguisher without training (though operation is more confident and effective after training)."
- g) In section 6.1 "Conclusions" the report states that "As the benefit of HOFFE (across all building types) outweighs the cost of providing it, the total costs to building owners and to society are likely to increase if the overall level of provision of HOFFE is reduced.
- h) The fire equipment industry's advice has consistently been only use fire equipment if it is safe to do so "People before Property".
- i) Sometimes having fire equipment installed in a premises can aid people in getting out of the premises.
- j) We know hand operated fire-fighting equipment can be beneficial but for us to realize the benefits it must first be provided!
- k) Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment is a first aid appliance and other than foam and water fire hose reels it has a limited capacity. That said the performance of these products is quantified under AS/NZS 1850 so it can be measured and has been proven to be effective.
- l) Installation by an NZQA accredited service technician will ensure that the correct fire equipment is installed & it meets the requirements of NZS 4503 and will ensure that the correct "For Use" blazon signage is installed so people can easily determine that the fire extinguishing appliance is suited to the risk and its location is more readily found.

I realize that a lot of what is printed above is probably being read by those who already agree that removing fire equipment is not a step forwards in safety but rather a step backwards. That said part of our role in the industry is to educate and inform others so hopefully in some small way that is what we have been able to achieve here.

## Mr David Paulison

FEMA Director, Retired | Board of Directors – **Underwriters Laboratories**

### Hurricane Katrina: Lessons Learned at a Federal Level

Mr. R. David Paulison served as Director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Mr. Paulison led FEMA from 2005 to 2009, was credited with having guided the federal agency through the development of the next-generation processes, technologies and infrastructure required to respond to the hazards and disasters of the 21(st) century.

He began his career as a firefighter in 1971 and served as Fire Chief of Miami-Dade County, FL from 1992 to 2001. In that year, he joined the federal government as Administrator of the United States Fire Administration, the division of FEMA with responsibilities for supporting national, state and local fire service programs as well as implementing FEMA initiatives for emergency readiness, firefighter training and equipment. From 2003 to 2004, he served as Director for Preparedness for FEMA within the newly created Department of Homeland Security where he was responsible for over \$1 billion in grant programs for state and local governments.

Mr. Paulison has deep experience and insight into a period of tremendous change in how the world thinks about public safety and protection. His tenure as FEMA Director began in 2005 and was marked by a renewed focus on key national safety and preparedness priorities, including effective national response to disasters through three hurricane seasons, California wildfires and the 2008 mid-west floods.

Under his leadership, the agency reframed the doctrine by which the nation prepares for and responds to all-hazard disasters through a new FEMA Strategic Plan, and directing the development of the new National Response Framework. He has been Trustee of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. since April 18, 2011.

John has a degree in Analytical Chemistry from Plymouth University and a PhD in Emulsion Explosives from Cranfield University. In 2016, HFS-Asia merged with Hawkins and Associates, a well-established and respected firm specialising in forensic investigation and root cause analysis for the insurance, legal and risk management professions. # Inspectorate SIG Update

Further to last month's article, where I briefly mentioned As Built Documentation, I have been asked to expand on this topic. So here goes.

A simple description is that As Built documentation is a record of how the system is installed. As Built documentation should be sufficiently detailed so that the end user can read and refer to these documents and understand the system they have purchased. So, what does As Built documentation look like?

Firstly, some clarification of terminology.

As Built Drawings should record all changes made during the system installation, including changes to pipe / cable routes, device locations, seismic break locations, to name a few. Hanger details, flexible dropper make and model, and sprinkler head identification information should also be included.

As Built Documentation would include As Built Drawings plus additional documentation that can be used to undertake testing and maintenance of the system. Such things as equipment technical material, programming files, operational instructions, hydraulic calculations, block plans, etc.

So, what should be shown on as built drawings? As Built Drawings need to be an accurate record of how the system has been installed. Anyone should be able to pick up an as built drawing and understand where in the "system" they are. They need to show device locations, pipe routes / cable routes, device identification numbers, dimensions of equipment from walls. Remembering these drawings are a record of how the system is installed, so comments to aid in the installation process should be removed. They should be an easy to read, common scaled, clean set of drawings.

As Built documentation can also be thought of as Operational Manuals. These are often detailed in contractual specifications as to what is to be included. Simply put, if a technician picked up an operating manual they should have everything they need to perform routine testing or maintenance on a system. So, product brochures, operating instructions, resetting instructions, as built drawings, hydraulic calculations and node diagrams, block plans, hanger details, should all be included. This is not an exhaustive list.

On some larger industrial sites, there may already be as built documentation that you will use for the installation. Imagine the difficulty you would face if this documentation was not readily available! Everyone needs to be considerate to others that may need access to these documents. Being as built documentation, any changes you may make will require the as built documentation to be updated.

The as built documentation requested at the end of a project is requested for a reason. Providing the documentation in dribs and drabs does not result in the certification being provided any sooner.

Finally, remember that the information required to Certify a "System" may only be a portion of what the Engineers may require for their as built documentation.

# Site Safe publishes first-ever report on suicide in New Zealand's construction industry

*Research finds that workplace pressures were a factor for nearly one third of suicide cases in construction industry<sup>i</sup>*

In response to concerns about high levels of suicide in the construction industry<sup>ii</sup>, Site Safe has published the country's first report on suicide in the sector. The report reflects the pressures on construction workers who died by suicide and aims to provide evidence to inform future prevention initiatives.

The study reviewed 300 coroners closed case files of suicides of people who work in the construction industry which occurred between 2007 to 2017. Coroners' reports listed workplace pressures as a factor in nearly a third (32.3%) of all cases.

The workplace pressures mentioned in coroners' reports included: job insecurity or uncertainty, the stress related to running a business, pressure to deliver under deadlines, juggling responsibilities and dealing with an injury or illness affecting the ability to work. One in eight (13%) of all cases listing workplace pressures included experiences of job insecurity or uncertain work situation.

Notably, people who were self-employed or business owners (11.3% of all cases) were twice as likely<sup>iii</sup> to have been impacted by work-related factors than employees of businesses.

The purpose of the research report is to help industry, government, and the wider public understand the risk factors and pressures that can contribute to suicide in the construction industry, so that they can better respond to them.

Commenting on the findings, Brett Murray, Chief Executive of Site Safe says:

*"To lose 300 people to suicide in our industry over 10 years is devastating. It's an employer's responsibility to provide a safe environment for their workers and this includes protecting physical and mental wellbeing. There has been huge progress in workplace health and safety over the past twenty years, but we all need to play our part in shifting attitudes towards mental health.*

*"We know that companies and contractors in our industry are looking for help to protect their employees' mental wellbeing. This report shines a spotlight on the pressures that exist for people working in the construction industry and it's a first step towards understanding the problem.*

*"We will be using our voice to share the findings of this report with government, industry leaders and our 6,000 member businesses. As an industry, we need to work shoulder to shoulder to ensure everyone's mental health is protected, from apprentices to small business owners and employees of large construction companies."*

Overall, the findings show that the construction sector figures reflect the broader trends for male suicide in New Zealand - almost all (99%) of the suicide cases of people who worked in the construction industry recorded over the ten-year period were men. The age-groups most affected were also similar to national male population figures<sup>iv</sup>; with 15% of cases aged 20-24 and 14% aged 45-49.

The report identified no single driver of suicide in the construction industry. It found causes were always complex but there were common factors the industry can work to address, including work stress, financial strain and physical injuries.

Site Safe is already developing a mental health and wellbeing strategy based on the findings of this report.

Reflecting on the findings, Shaun Robinson, Spokesperson for the Mental Health Foundation comments:

*“The findings in this report outline some of the pressures on people working in the construction industry. These pressures aren’t unique to the construction industry, but the solutions can be found by getting the industry set-up to address these challenges and improve the mental health of its people.”*

*“Suicide prevention is something for all New Zealanders to work on, but the most effective suicide prevention initiatives are tailored to the environments and cultures of people at risk. In the case of the construction industry, pilots of programmes in New Zealand and Australia have found that initiatives targeted at people who work in the construction industry can prevent suicide and improve mental health and wellbeing.”*
