### **FPANZ Passive Group Update**

Unfortunately I had no replies to my question from anyone so again I had to eat the sweet prize on my own!

As you will be aware, a small team from the FPA Passive SIG Group have been working on the framework for a Passive Code of Practice. BRANZ were also working on a three year project looking into Passive Fire Protection for relatively new buildings including installation of Fire Rated Walls, Doors etc. FPA assisted BRANZ in one building inspection as part of their pilot report.

BRANZ have decided to cease with their original three year project and will now be producing the Code of Practice with input from from the FPA. BRANZ will be commencing with the Code of practice April 2015 and the FPA look forward to working with BRANZ to complete what is an important document.

This year's FireNZ Conference in Auckland had three speakers and one workshop on Passive Fire Protection which shows the importance of the subject. Unfortunately, fire stopping is still being installed on new construction incorrectly – ranging from wrong systems, to systems not installed as required by the manufacturer's instructions. If your company is undertaking its own fire stopping for fire alarm cables and/or pipework through fire rated walls / floors, then make sure you choose a supplier who will train you

on what systems you need to use and what parameters applies for each system. The fire stopping system is required to comply to NZ Building Code / Australian Standards or Assessments to the relative standards from independent labs such as BRANZ, CSIRO, Warrington. You or a fire stopping supplier cannot just make a system up and say it should work!

Passive Fire Protection is a trade in itself and there are litigation claims for leaky buildings that are including incorrectly installed fire stopping. If you or your or company contribute to the issue then you may be liable. Remember, a building owner has 10 years to lodge a claim – so don't think once your warranty expires you are out of the woods!

On a more positive note, I especially want to thank those of the Passive SIG Group who have worked hard on the Code of Practice to date that will be handed to BRANZ, and those who attend the regular meetings.

Christmas is just around the corner and we have one meeting left for the year, so why not join us for the meeting and a drink afterwards!

# Competenz Apprenticeship REBOOT SCHEME

The scheme is available for all apprentices who sign up before end of December 2014 into a NZA level 4 agreements with more than 120 credits.

As fire is a priority trade your apprentice is eligible to a payment of \$2000.00 and the company is entitled to \$2000.00 plus GST after 90 days in training.

The main points for eligibility for this reboot scheme are the following:

- Must be in a level 4 NZA agreement
- Must be signed up before end of December
- Must be in training for 90 prior to applying for reboot money
- The reboot forms must be completed by both the apprentice and company
- The forms must be sent back to myself so I can check eligibility requirements before sending on to TEC
- The payment of \$2000.00 to the apprentice is for tools, courses (outside the agreement)
- The apprentice must keep receipts of all purchases from the pay-out for at least 2 years in case of an audit by TEC

### False Alarms In Schools

During the next month the Ministry of Education are going to be providing some guidance to schools regarding false alarms.

Schools will be advised to contact their Ministry Property Advisor if they are having fire alarm issues to secure funding for appropriate work. The Ministry are also asking that schools meet with their agents and the Fire Service to discuss possible solutions to false alarm issues.

In particular schools will be advised that the following are considered as serious fire safety management errors include:

• Issuing instructions not to evacuate when the alarm sounds because of persistent false alarms.

Persistent false alarms are a sign that the fire alarm system is not functioning properly. This is extremely unsafe because in a real fire staff and students will not evacuate and may be injured.

 Turning off the fire alarm system because of persistent false alarms.

The fire alarm system should never be turned off. It is extremely unsafe because if a fire does occur it may go undetected and threaten the lives of staff and students.

As you work with schools, be aware that the above information is being sent to them in the interests of working towards reducing their false alarms in a collaborative way.






### Canterbury Rebuild Safety Charter UPDATE





### **CLAIMS UPDATE**

New construction-related claims in Canterbury remained static for August at 480 (compared to 479 claims on average over the 12 months to Aug 2014). Claim numbers however have risen just over 12% since August 2013. Those claims that become entitlement claims – that is where a person requires more than 5 days off work –fell slightly from those recorded last month. The average cost of claims in the first 12 months post-injury remained static in August (at around \$2000); the average cost of claims nationally continues to reduce.

Carpenters and joiners showed the biggest increase in claims by occupation group, recording an 18.8% growth in claims over the past 12 months. Electricians recorded the second largest increase in claims, followed by plumbers. Click here to read the August 2014 dashboard.

# DELIVERING A FIRE-SAFE FUTURE

TO ENSURE FIRE-SAFE BUILDINGS AND INFRASTRUCTURE, A ROBUST FIRE SAFETY STRATEGY AND RELIABLE FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEMS AND EQUIPMENT ARE ESSENTIAL.

This requires that decisions on building concept design and the selection of fire safety equipment and systems are right from the very first stages of a project. When a system or technology is poorly designed, incorrectly selected and improperly installed, commissioned and certified, the impacts of these actions affect the safety of the building's occupants and the building itself. There may be major problems during maintenance and an impact throughout the life cycle of the building or piece of infrastructure. Potential failure of equipment, construction elements or systems could occur which may result in loss of lives and property and significantly increase the legal liability of all involved in the supply chain from manufacturers through to installers.

The theme of Fire Australia 2015 focusses on getting design concepts and fire protection systems and equipment right from the outset, therefore ensuring these are fit for purpose once installed. This will ensure dependable and cost effective fire protection throughout the life span of the building or infrastructure. One of the key aspects of any system is using the right products for the right circumstances in the right way.

The conference will highlight issues of product and system certification, evidence of suitability and the various verification methods. It will also look at the technologies we adopt and adapt to the Australian market, as well as how we compare with other countries on an international scale for design, testing and certification.

# How useful are portable fire extinguishers?

The Fire Protection Association has received statistics on the use of portable fire extinguishers from the Fire Extinguishing Trades Association (FETA). The figures highlight how successful these extinguishers can be in containing fire. Fire Prevention hopes to provide regular statistics on the use of fire extinguishers in future issues

P ORMANY years, members of FETA have believed that some fire officers have a low opinion of the efficiency of portable fire extinguishers, although extinguishers are recommended or required in order to comply with codes of ractice or legislation.

Published fire brigade statistics suggest most fires, including small ones, are extinguished by the brigades, and not by the occupants. But a different picture is emerging from data collected by FETA service engineers over the past 2 years.

In 1987, approximately 70 per cent of fires reported to FETA were not reported to the fire brigades. In other words, the brigades' statistics only covered 30 per cent of fires reported. All of the unreported fires were extinguished by fire extinguishers. Moreover, 17 per cent of the fires reported to brigades had already been put out by fire extinguishers before their arrival.

Domestic premises accounted for only 4.7 per cent of reported fires. This low number can be explained by the fact that only very few extinguishers are installed in private homes.

If home occupiers could be persuaded to install extinguishers to similar levels as found in commercial or industrial premises, perhaps even more fires could be contained or extinguished, resulting infewerdeaths and injuries to occupants.


