WELCOME

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2022

Well, here we are starting another year and unfortunately still impacted by the effects of the global Covid pandemic. I guess we were all wishing that things might be a bit more normal this year, but that is yet to happen. The association has been working hard on behalf of members to assist where we can in terms of Covid and our industry, with regular discussions with the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) and the Ministry of Health (MoH) about our industry, its workers, testing and critical worker status.

It has become apparent that the various government agencies are as overwhelmed as everyone else and unable to meet the demands of every sector asking them questions and requesting assistance with various industry-specific needs, particularly with the sheer number of requests and meetings taking place.



With this in mind, we clearly saw at the start of the year that rapid antigen tests (RATs) were going to be critical to more regular testing of staff. We spent a lot of time and effort working with the MoH and MBIE, but several false starts, frustrating delays, and disappointments made it clear we were not going to be able to access RATs through these channels. However, we have now found a supplier with a shipment arriving in the first week of March and ordered approximately 5000 RATs on behalf of our members. We hope to be distributing these to those who ordered them through us as you read this newsletter. We are also in line for a second delivery of RATs, so if you are interested in purchasing some for your staff, then drop us an email. This was a one-off purchase to help our members bridge

the gap until business owners can get regular and reliable access to RATs and will be the last time we purchase RATs. Having staff sit in a testing line for 3 hours to access a test isn't a good use of anyone's time, so I would suggest that all companies have a small supply of RATs to use until the MoH is able to deliver them in a timely, regular, and fair manner.

Get It Right Seminars

We are completing the course material for our next round of seminars for this year. Obviously, given the current Covid wave, these will be delayed until the end of April or May. Most venues we use will also limit numbers and require vaccine passes; in addition, FPANZ will cap numbers for each session at 25–30 depending on the venue. All attendees will need to have a negative RAT result before being admitted for the day (more details on this will be in the flyer for the seminars). These are the sessions we are going to deliver:

- Installation of seismic bracing for sprinkler systems site staff
- Gas flood systems
- Passive fire protection

We will be calling for registrations for these in the next month or so. All events booked with us are fully refundable in case of Covid-related cancelations and or transferable to different staff. We intend that no member will be financially out of pocket if a seminar must be cancelled or postponed. It might be hard to think about planning given the present environment, but we feel plenty of notice, contingency plans, and safety assessment means we can work on our future plans to support our members' needs for continued professional development.

Vaccination required to enter Fire and Emergency premises

Fire and Emergency is committed to keeping all personnel and other people who come into contact with them healthy and safe. The Fire and Emergency COVID-19 Vaccination Policy comes into effect on 28 February and introduces requirements for all visitors to be fully vaccinated to come onto our premises.

There are very limited circumstances in which visitors who are not fully vaccinated may be permitted to enter Fire and Emergency premises. These include, visitors who have a medical exemption, visitors who have not been approved by MedSafe as eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination and members of the community seeking advice or support relating to fire safety.

Fire and Emergency look forward to continuing to work with the Fire Protection industry, if you are visiting or attending meetings on our premises please do not be offended if we ask to see your vaccine pass and proof of identity as evidence of vaccination.

These are important steps to help Fire and Emergency's effort to minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-19 within the workplace and wider community.

HOFFE SIG Update

We are now well into another year and it seems we are well into another variant of COVID, it's even affecting such sacred things as our rugby! That said to many people the effect on things such as rugby is inconsequential to the effect on their businesses and their livelihoods. For many of us the effect of Covid manifests itself as the cost of food, shopping and petrol going up, for others we see not only these things but also businesses no longer trading or restricting their spending in an effort to survive, this also has widely felt implications.

Inspectorate SIG Update

Earlier this month we had our first meeting of the inspectorate special interest group. Like most meetings these days it was via Zoom. The inspectorate SIG has been quiet for a while but the FPA is keen to rebuild momentum in this SIG.

An item that one of the inspectorate members raised was the degree of completeness that a construction site needs to be in before an inspection can be undertaken. The further advanced the state of completeness that the site is the better as it reduces the quantity of unknowns.

Ideally in the case of fire alarms the site needs to be almost at the state of final cleaning and the floor linings down. This is due to the influence that soft furnishings, such as carpet, and joinery has on the sound levels, and the need to be able to sight device labelling which is obscured by dust covers or masking tape.

Ideally in the case of fire sprinklers all the final shapes need to be in place so the inspector can confirm adequacy of obstructions; painting of the ceiling is essentially complete to ensure there are no painted sprinkler present, the majority of protective covers removed from sprinklers so the correct sprinkler can be confirmed as installed, and the area outside the FSI suitable for flow testing.

Certainly having to wait until what is the last moment is stressful for head contractors and their project managers who themselves are trying to manage the somewhat complex task of gathering all the right completion documentation that the client and the building consent officer needs. However, by pushing inspection to occur too early there is the risk that subsequent works will create noncompliance's; and those noncompliance's create flow on problems.

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

Welcome to 2022, I hope that you had an enjoyable break. This year we have some new initiatives underway, further details will be released in due course.

One point raised with me earlier in the year was the standardisation of hardware layout within buildings, partially where there are multiple pieces of alarm related hardware in one area. An example is where there is a WIP, MCP and mimic displays in the same space. If these are not laid out in a consistent way, staff may find it confusing when moving between areas. Typically, there is other hardware relevant to the building in a similar space, such as air conditioning controls. Once the building is handed to the end user, they may add other information to the wall - this can cause clutter and makes the space confusing to work in, especially under duress. This is a detailed matter, which could be considered early with the building user so that cable runs can be planned appropriately.

Whilst we are obliged to follow the Covid Protection Framework (CPF / Traffic Light System), which is a vital tool to help ensure the safety of our communities, we need to understand that the risk of fires occurring has not changed. In fact, with less regular occupancy in buildings and frequently changing levels of supervision in the workplace, combined with the possibility of people self-isolating in their places of abode, particularly where they are confined to an apartment- where they may carry out high risk activities such as smoking or cooking, (the latter of which would normally be carried out in a purpose built kitchen) - it could be argued that the risk of a fire event may have actually increased.

There are currently exemptions to running drills due to the CPF traffic light settings, but education can be considered for building occupants, using technologies such as video calling. Walkthrough drills with limited participants could be considered with a risk-based approach. Building owners and their representatives should consider their risks and communicate with their evacuation consultant or FENZ representative for guidance.

Important information has been supplied by one of our members indicating another round of thefts of Fire Sprinkler Inlets (FSI) couplings is happening in Auckland. At this stage, thefts have been identified in Penrose and South Auckland. Please ensure that when your staff are visiting any buildings protected by Sprinkler and/or Hydrant Systems, they carry out a visual check on the status to identify any theft or tampering with the couplings.

The theft of these is a serious safety concern as in the event of a fire, Fire Fighters will not be able to boost these systems.

We are also compiling details to forward to the NZ Police to assist with their investigations. If you come across any of these thefts, please send the details so we can add this to our database and notify FENZ and Police.
