NZS4510

I am pleased to say that NZS4510 has now been completed and is published and live on the standards website: [NZS 4510:2022 : Standards New Zealand](https://standards.govt.nz/standards/nzs4510:2022). I would like to thank all of the stakeholders for their hard work on this project to deliver yet another standard that is now current for our industry. I have said this many times, but the importance of our standards can't be underestimated; they are the foundation for our industry, and keeping them current is critical. This is the fourth standard we have successfully updated in the past two or more years. Please visit the website to review and access this standard.

Rapid Antigen Kits for Members

I am also pleased to report on the successful completion of the rapid antigen test (RAT) project we carried out on behalf of our members in late February and early March. This was well received, with more than 45% of our members taking up the opportunity to get early access to the RAT kits we secured on their behalf. This was always just going to be a one-off project to help fill a gap until they were more readily available from official sources such as the Ministry of Health. We obtained enough for all the members who pre-ordered and, when they arrived, we dispatched them all in just three days, with almost all orders delivered within a day or so. This was also a full week earlier than we originally planned. We worked with a great supplier, and we had all our planning, packing, deliveries, and freight well-arranged, so it all went according to plan and, as a result, helped fill the void that our members were dealing with. Thanks to all of our members for the positive comments on this member engagement project.

Fire Industry Qualifications

Our industry is committed to training our people, and this is evidenced by the large numbers of learners currently enrolled in a training agreement with Competenz. As we know, workplace training can bring with a whole host of benefits to your business and our industry, but it is not without some challenges. To name a few, learners are full-time employed, often not office based, might not always have mentors who can help them in some sections of their apprenticeship, might not have access to computers, and might have learning difficulties or other challenges. This is why our relationship with Competenz and the WDC (Workforce Development Council) Hanga-Aro-Rau is critical to helping overcome these roadblocks. We regularly meet with both organisations and have representation on our board, council, and special interest group (SIG) meetings.

We want to know about any challenges that may be preventing your learners from completing their courses so we can assist and improve on these areas. In April, Competenz is launching additional support through online inductions and study groups. This is in addition to the existing literacy and numeracy support already available. If you have learners who are having difficulty, make sure you contact your Competenz Training Advisor so they can put the appropriate support in place to help improve our completion rates as an industry and get more people qualified.

Thank you to the companies and learners I have spoken to in the past year or so; your feedback helps us improve learner outcomes and subsequently results for the industry. However, we know we can do more. Please continue to engage with us by attending SIG meetings, liaising with your Competenz reps, mentoring your learners, and asking for help where you or they need it.

CATE Conference 2022

CATE (Careers and Transition Education Association NZ Inc.) runs an annual conference for careers advisors from all around New Zealand. We attended the CATE conference in 2019, but—like many events, ours included—it hasn't been able to run for the past couple of years. However, they will be back in November this year, and we will be attending with our FireNZ partners, the Society of Fire Protection Engineers and the Institute of Fire Engineers. CATE is a professional organisation for people working in the fields of career and transition education. Their focus is on the career education and development of youth and their transition from school into the wider world of employment, training, and/or further education. We see this event as significant in our efforts to continue increasing careers advisors' knowledge of the fire protection industry and raising the profile of the many career opportunities within it. We will be in touch with members in Christchurch closer to the time to see how we can assist in promoting your business and any career opportunities.

HOFFE SIG Update

Another eventful month has passed with us now facing unprecedented prices for necessities such as food and fuel. On a positive note, we have seen an increased level of interest from Fire Equipment Service companies wanting to have input into the review of our Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment (HOFFE) standard NZS4503. It is worth remembering that the opportunity to carry out a review such as this doesn't come about too often, this is evidenced by the fact that the current document is a 2005 dated standard and we are now in 2022!

Another opportunity for professional development, or simply authenticating the skills you already possess is the level 3 HOFFE qualification. Disappointingly, not many people have signed on for this despite it being "fees free". Like most things, if the free-fee facility isn't seen to be working it could be withdrawn - as they say, "use it or lose it". Obtaining the qualification can also help to promote you and your company as being good, ethical, and trustworthy operators who strive to maintain compliance with accepted industry practices, standards, and regulations. We have seen in recent years (2020) that the Commerce Commission will act against those who are proven not to be operating in accordance with accepted industry practices, standards, and regulations.

Our recent HOFFE group meeting was a good one with good discussions held and good input from our newest members, we ended up running a fair bit over our allocated time slot which I think was a good sign. Our next HOFFE Group meeting is on the 20th of May and all going well we should have the option of an in-person meeting.

GOOD PRACTICE GUIDE to running FIRE DRILLS – a tiered approach				
The Fire and Emergency New Zealand (Fire Safety, Evacuation Procedures and Evacuation Schemes) Regulations 2018 provide clear guidelines around reporting of fire drills. This summary provides guidance on options to run a fire drill based on the building complexity, desired outcomes, and intended learning outcomes.				
TYPE OF FIRE DRILL	DESCRIPTION	PROCEDURE	EXPECTED OUTCOMES	OPTIONAL CONSIDERATIONS
TIER 1 BASIC DRILL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Suitable for most premises where there are no special fire features, e.g. fire curtains. No special evacuation requirements. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Activate fire alarm sounders / bells using 'Bulgin Key' at fire alarm panel. Record evacuation time etc. - in line with 32(3) of the FENZ regulations 2018. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Meets compliance requirements for building evacuation¹. BUILDING PERFORMANCE



MBIE's upcoming Building Code update to propose improvements to building fire protection

New building work is regulated through the Building Code to ensure we are delivering safe, healthy and durable buildings. MBIE updates the Building Code annually to ensure it is keeping pace with current methods of construction, products and technologies.

The changes we are proposing for the 2022 update aim to ensure new buildings better protect the safety of New Zealanders, and focus on plumbing and drainage, protection from fire and structural stability of hollow-core floors.

MBIE will begin consulting on proposed changes to the Building Code on 2 May 2022 and run until 1 July, with final decisions on the changes will be made in November 2022.

The theft of these is a serious safety concern as in the event of a fire, Fire Fighters will not be able to boost these systems.

We are also compiling details to forward to the NZ Police to assist with their investigations. **If you come across any of these thefts, please send the details so we can add this to our database and notify FENZ and Police.**
