is a great time to update and check these details. We will also be announcing changes to the association and seeking feedback on some strategies that we have been working on for the past few months. This is part of our regular review to ensure the association stays fit for purpose and continues to deliver value for our members and key industry stakeholders.

### Membership Survey

As part of our yearly review, we will be conducting a membership survey. A link to this will be emailed to all FPANZ primary contacts, and we encourage you to take the opportunity to have your say on a range of topics, such as the work we are doing, certification and licensing actions, and advertising in our monthly newsletter (see below).

### Certified Contractors and Service Providers

I have touched on the topic of certifying contractors and providers previously. After further feedback, we will be moving to a model that actively promotes members who have completed certification in their respective fields, e.g. sprinkler, alarms, evacuation, and the soon-to-be-launched passive contractors. This is another step towards industry certification/licensing, so it is important we take the lead on this and show how far we can take self-regulation. I strongly believe that now our industry has a strong voice and a respected brand and representation, we need to shift the model from members simply buying into the associations brand. The public and industry stakeholders are seeking more than just a list of financial members and asking for more detailed advice on how to select a service provider that will meet their requirements. To do this, a degree of separation from basic financial membership to certification is needed. The sprinkler certification process run by Aon is a proven method, the fire alarm certification and evacuation certification run by FPANZ are increasingly being adopted by members, and there is new demand for passive certification. These are all indicators that the vast majority of our members understand the need to highlight how the skills their companies offer differ from others in the sector.

Although these certifications obviously require additional time and internal work, this is how we will lift the bar and show that, as an industry, we want and need certification/licensing. Industry members overwhelmingly believe that regulation would help, and most FPANZ members want us to lead industry regulation. So this is the first big step towards a solid case model to show the regulator. Members that are already certified and/or working towards being certified are also showing their commitment to improving our industry and the standards we work to. The association will be starting to more actively promote companies that are certified, and many of you will have seen that certified members are the first options in the new member search function on our website.

We welcome feedback from all members and as such will include the topic in the aforementioned membership survey.

### Newsletter Content

We are increasingly receiving requests from members and suppliers who want to advertise in the monthly newsletter. The main purpose of this newsletter is to keep members and stakeholders informed of relevant industry news, so thus far we have not actively sought advertisers. However, as we are receiving mixed feedback from members about this, we intend to also include this topic in the upcoming membership survey. If we continue accepting advertising, we will also need to determine what is appropriate, and – again – I think members are best placed to determine the value of the different types of advertising that could be published.

Well, yet another month has come and gone and, as we saw in the sold out “all Kiwi” rugby final at Eden Park, the winter weather is now upon us after a comparatively fine summer. With half the year already gone and the economy looking a bit shaky, wouldn’t it be nice to get some progress made before the end of the year on some projects which can benefit us all going into next year? Here are some of our HOFFE groups current projects.

While it may not be immediately obvious to everyone, there has been quite a lot of work going on by various members since the last HOFFE group meeting. The NZS4503 review is progressing and has dominated our time with many emails, some meetings held, and people liaising with Government as well as working on a variety of documents relating to other topics and policies for the group.

This should be of interest to everyone - we continue to see examples of fire equipment that doesn’t meet the required standards and/or hasn’t been properly inspected, being sold online by both private individuals and commercial businesses. While these activities have been brought to the attention of the authorities the message here is buyer beware because the people most at risk are those who may well be relying on this equipment to keep their families, property and themselves safe!! As an example of this issue I found an advertisement on a popular site by simply searching “fire extinguishers” which read “New portable water- based fire extinguisher for in car, vehicle, household, home fire extinguishing level 0.5A, 13B, E, 5F” with a buy now option of \$20.00 or four interest free payments of \$5.00 (plus shipping) with Afterpay. Apart from the obviously cheap price of this particular example, the fact that they are claiming ratings such as 0.5A, 13B & 5F which don’t exist under the AS/NZS1850 performance ratings system would catch our attention but sadly the general public wouldn’t know!

# Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

## Protecting vulnerable occupants in single use buildings

Under Section 76 (3) of the fire and emergency NZ act 2017 there is the opportunity to inform FENZ that a (the) building does not require an evacuation scheme if it meets the requirements of section 75(1)(b) or (c) and has an automatic sprinkler system. This may mean that single use office buildings and apartments do not have an approved evacuation scheme in place, and therefore there is no legal requirement under the Fire and Emergency Evacuation Regulation 2018 to complete staff training or fire drills which are reported to; and recorded by FENZ.

Where the building is typically occupied by persons able to evacuate without particular assistance and there is a reasonable amount of social cohesion, then it may be considered acceptable to not brief, or test an evacuation procedure. However, we are looking at a life safety element here and have to consider if this is always acceptable. Let's take an independent living apartment building which is part of an aged care facility - is it the intent of the regulations to allow these buildings an exemption from evacuation training or testing? Whilst it could be argued there is other legislation that could cover this, should we be looking to use the very legislation designed to help ensure we know how to safely evacuate our buildings, to provide us with exemption where the occupants ability to safely evacuate cannot be taken for granted?

# Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

## Substitutions:

We are all unlikely to go an hour in our working day at present where shortages of materials, and in particular the “Gib situation”, are not discussed. Unfortunately, it’s not likely to go away overnight.


Recently MBIE has released some guidance on how products can be substituted. Even recommending BCA’s can issue Minor variations on the spot during inspections for low-risk changes. Fire is not going to get passed as a “low risk” change and therefore will still require a Minor variation application and processing (or full amendment for major changes).

See below links to most recent MBIE guidance on plasterboard substitution and also November 2021 guidance on general substitutions.

Passive Fire related trades are clearly not immune to the need for these changes. As we have discussed at SIG meetings unfortunately passive companies are caught trying to catch the baby as other trades don’t always stick to the game plan and new solutions are needed often in rapid time.

Here are a few tips to assist taking the pain out of the process:

1. Have ready to go template submissions for Minor variations on your local BCAs prescribed form. Including typical relevant test reports at your finger tips.
2. Good documentation for Minor variation submissions - don’t blame the BCA on processing hold ups if you’ve not submitted clear forms, test reports, manufacturers details and the like
3. Work with suppliers to notify well in advance on project works.
4. Check facts on supply availability when specifying, quoting etc - changing early is way easier than when it is a panic.
5. Suppliers don’t over promise - if you don’t have your fingers on the product then be realistic with the market. Suppliers Reputations are getting a hammering for making promises they can’t keep at present. Realistic not optimistic.
6. Talk to all alternative suppliers including competing suppliers from those specified. If a need for change arises.
7. Good Suppliers Technical teams should have all relevant information ready to provide you to assist with minor variation processing docs
8. There is more than one way to skin a cat. In NZ we have a dependency on a certain way of building Fire wall partitions, ceilings etc. However, when we step back there are many ways to achieve e these. Alternatives include systems such as - Fire rated insulation wall systems (unlined), Calcium silicate partition systems, AAC, Korok, Retro fire rated paints & the like.

NZS 4541:2020 *Automatic fire sprinkler systems* – Clause 4.3.13.3.6.1

---

## Question:

Is it the committee's intention that clause 4.3.13.3.6.1 be interpreted as ACI 355.2/355.2R-01 is acceptable in New Zealand for the seismic assessment of post-installed anchors in concrete substrate? NZS 3101:2006 Clause 17.5.5 gives clear instructions for the seismic prequalification testing of post-installed anchors for use in New Zealand. ACI 355.2/355.2R-01 is not suggested by NZS 3101 and not equivalent to the seismic assessment methods given ETAG 001 Annex E.

## Interpretation issued by the Fixed fire protection group:

*The committee confirms that it was its intent that post-installed and proprietary fasteners in concrete or masonry be assessed against the seismic qualification test stipulated in ACI.2/355.2R-01. The testing protocols in ETAG001 to C1 is essentially the same as testing to ACI355.2 and is an acceptable substitute.*

## Outstanding Engineering Achievement

The FireNZ award aims to recognise contributions made by the candidate to the promotion of the engineering profession. This could be in recognition of:

- Significant contributions to the advancement of the professional recognition of the fire protection engineer.
- A fire design that represents a novel, artistic and imaginative solution to a problem
- A project that has delivered enormous value and impact to either a community, country or organisation
- An outstanding collaboration between an engineering organisation and one or more other organisations, that results in a better project outcome or has a significant positive impact on a workforce, customers or community
- A breathtakingly clever engineering project or product launched or completed in the past two years that has solved an age-old problem or shifted from the 'always done this way' mentality
- An individual or team for inspiring engineering education or a significant initiative. It may include student or peer support, teaching, research or other significant initiatives that result in an enduring positive impact

## Lifetime Achievement Award

The Lifetime achievement / outstanding contribution award is a prestigious recognition of life-long contributions to and career achievements in the field of fire safety in New Zealand.

## Young Professionals Award

The Young Professionals award is for a young person who has demonstrated outstanding leadership qualities, excellence in their career, academic excellence and/or has provided a contribution to the fire safety community.
