#### NZS4503 Update

We have booked in a project meeting to revisit this standard, the first since 2005. The aim of this meeting is to figure out the scope of changes required. We want to work with industry as much as possible to ensure that any changes reflect what is needed by our members, end clients and other stakeholders. If you are in the sale and servicing of handheld fire extinguishers and want to be involved, please drop us an email. As this is a workshop-style meeting, we must limit numbers to make things manageable.

#### **Auckland Water Supplies**

Those in our sprinkler fraternity will know the pain this issue has caused. It has become more difficult to work with Watercare to address concerns around water supplies and capacity. The implications to this sector are substantial, and we have been engaging with both Watercare and Fire and Emergency New Zealand to see what improvements can be made. Unfortunately, there will be no overnight fix; however, a combined approach from FENZ, FPA and the Sprinkler System Certifier will at least table the concerns, possible implications and requests for improvements. We will keep you updated as this develops.



## **Evacuation Consultants SIG Update**

As we move through the winter months, it is acknowledged that there are a significant number of cases of Covid-19 and flu. This is resulting in many areas operating with minimal staff, and in some cases, businesses temporarily closing or going into voluntary lockdown. Currently under the CPF: Orange there is still a requirement for us to be completing drills or training for scheme maintenance. Whilst this may be difficult to achieve, it is important to keep communicating with building occupants about fire risk reduction, maintaining means of escape etc, and when possible, record training and drills, and reporting them through to FENZ.

Part of the scheme approval process where a building has an internal place of safety as part of the evacuation philosophy often involves a site visit by FENZ. As part of this inspection, they assess the proposed procedure against the hardware and evacuation routes / travel to adjacent places of safety available for use in the event of a real emergency. It is essential that when writing procedures, they align with this assessment. A site visit, with a focus on the mobility and ability of the occupants to move through the building is often essential to ensure we get this process correct. This will help ensure the evacuation scheme application meets approval sooner.

### **Passive Fire Protection SIG Update**

#### Assessments – ask the extra questions:

As most of us are aware AS1530.4 & AS4072.1 assessments satisfy compliance with NZBC and Acceptable solutions. However, when utilising an AS4072.1 assessment I would urge a little extra caution.

Assessments are great & they fill a needed gap in the market whereby not every single scenario can be tested or it may not be commercially viable to do so.

Too many times I've been given an Assessment that has a better rating or easier installation than a tested solution – This makes life very easy when specifying, installing or signing off to rely on something. However, it is possible that the assessment has made an assumption that a test wasn't able to assume or proved a wrong assumption. Or with all respect the lab assessor may have overlooked a particular element.

This is because tested is a higher threshold than assessments.

There are entire product lines available that are more or less based on AS4072.1 assessments. This is perfectly fine under our building code – however is it actually, right?

When reading through AS4072.1 it is clear that an AS4072.1 assessment is written hand in hand with AS1530.4 tests only – however there are proposed AS4072.1 assessments written based on tests other than AS1530.4. There are even assessments based on other assessments.

AS4072.1 is very specific on what can be assessed & what can't – for instance you can't assess anything larger than what has been tested, nor can you assess different separations (other than superior substrates). Yet we find assessments in the market that have assessed entire new sizes of products.

I have witnessed multiple specifications this year from consultants that appear to have taken an easy path with assessments when in fact there are better tested solutions available.

Here is a few check lists items:

- 1. Recommend tested takes precedence over assessed when both are an option many consultants state this in their specs
- 2. Check if it is actually an official AS4072.1 assessment the wording in the report will state if it is or isn't other closely worded reports such as opinions do occur
- 3. Is the report valid AS4072.1 assessments must have a validity period less than 10 years
- 4. Has the assessment report been superseded all assessment reports have a caveat that if any additional information becomes known, or future tests finds this assessment wrong then the assessment is not valid
- 5. Is the assessment report silent on any critical information? For instance a test report it is very easy to see exact installation, fixings, mastics and the like However, an assessment report may not actually state the exact fixing method or the like. Most lab technicians will confirm that often the fixing method is the critical failure point, yet there are assessment reports available that don't state how a certain device is fixed, what embedment, what flanges, where mastic seals etc are or aren't.
- 6. Does it pass the smell test?

Ask yourself this – if an assessment report is later proven to be wrong, or a test proves it wrong or needed additional installation or product have you done a thorough effort in due diligence in checking?
