“Get it Right” Seminars

Passive Certification

We are close to launching the passive certification scheme, which is similar to the Aon sprinkler contractor certification and the FPA NZ fire alarm contractor certification. The certification scheme will have a set of published measurement criteria, and only companies that meet these criteria will be listed as certified to a specific level. As with the other certifications, these criteria include:

- › ISO or other quality systems
- › Staff qualifications and experience
- › Proof of ongoing staff development (CPD)
- › Health and safety systems
- › Minimum levels of insurance
- › Client and supplier references
- › Biennial auditing. ▶

HOFFE SIG Update

Another month has gone by and strangely, as we also say goodbye to daylight savings and head towards winter, the weather is getting a little better than it was during “summer”!

Since the February newsletter we have had the following happen within the HOFFE sector:

› **NZS4503** – scoping document done, meeting held, document wording checked, verified and submitted to standards.

› **Fluorine free foam** – a lot of discussion and some confusion has prompted the FPA to put together a document clarifying the Fire Fighting Chemicals Groups expectations and our responsibilities under their 2021 Standard 1-HSR002573. Phil Lacey, who represented the FPA on this Committee, has been instrumental in creating this FPA document.

› **Lithium-Ion fire extinguishers** are another topical issue for our industry. While we know there are some existing standards for quantifying the performance of fire equipment against, we do not have anything in our AS/NZS framework. We know that fire equipment companies are making various claims about the capabilities of their fire equipment, and in some cases referencing ASNZS 1841.2 (water), then using a fire extinguisher with additives and making unquantifiable claims like “viewed and confirmed that both battery pack fires were extinguished” about its performance. As a result, various initiatives are underway including exploring recognizing ISO and other overseas ratings within the AS/NZS 1841 and 1850 framework with a new category.

› More instances are coming to light of **companies getting their own unqualified staff to certify their fire equipment** rather than paying for those who have invested in becoming experienced, qualified people certified to carry out this work. HOFFE service companies are reporting to us that some hire companies, earthmoving and even some marine companies are reportedly servicing their own equipment with personnel who have no relevant industry training, experience or F/E backing/support. It’s worth remembering that not only is there a liability that goes along with signing off “life safety equipment”, but also that there is a criteria under NZS4503:2005 section 1.4 for determining who can carry out this work, the criteria includes the following:

- i. Relevant industry training
- i. Relevant industry experience
- ii. Access to requisite tools and equipment
- iii. Access to parts and information (including manufacturer’s installation/service manual).
- iv. To be capable of carrying out the installation to an applicable industry training programme recognized by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority is an acceptable means of compliance with this requirement.

› We have had reports that there are **a number of companies offering Fire Extinguishers for sale and claiming they comply with AS/NZS1841:2007**. They make claims such as “General Purpose” despite section 9.1(a) stating “Unspecific terms relating to the ▶

application such as ‘multi’, ‘general’ or ‘universal’ shall not appear on any marking or literature relating to a fire extinguisher.”

Inspectorate SIG Update

As members may be aware there are restrictions on the use of fire fighting foam that contain PFOs or PFOA; this applies to both large fixed installations and extinguishers. While there are new foam concentrates available, they should not be seen as one for one replacements. This due to the mechanism of mixing the concentrate into the water stream, and the discharge nozzle all being part of a system. It is normal to find cross listing of the foam with the mixing/proportioning device, and the discharge device.

According to the US Department of Defence (US DoD) the effectiveness of the currently available F3 foams is not as effective as AFFF. They advise “*Currently, F3s take about 1.5 to 2 times longer than AFFF to extinguish a fire for the same application rate*” (MIL-PRF-3275, page 16). The US DOD explains that AFFF became more effective over time, this was because of ongoing refinement by chemical engineers of the exact foam formulations, and they say their goal is to eventually identify commercially available F3s that have the same performance as the legacy AFFF. As the US defence sector is a major purchaser of fire fighting foams it can be expected the foam concentrate manufacturers will be working hard to develop and refine better F3 foams.

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

Since the last newsletter, we have seen more disruption around the country, this time caused by significant weather events. There have been questions raised around the completion of fire drills and training within these regions. Whilst there is a legal requirement to carry out these exercises every 6 months, it is important that a pragmatic approach is taken and where justified, a delay may be appropriate. Some organisations, especially those operating on a shift cycle, choose to run and report their drills more frequently. This helps ensure their 6 monthly requirement is met.

With all of the delays and exemptions from running fire drills that we have seen over the last few years, it is particularly relevant that we address complacency when completing fire drills. This has been an issue that we have often encountered and requires management. More recently I have witnessed more people working from the office and greater occupancy of buildings. In some cases, there have been insufficient wardens as their numbers have not been scaled back up to allow for the extra occupants. It is vital that emergency evacuation plans are dynamic and able to adjust to the number of occupants within the building and types of activity that are occurring. Regular warden training can assist by building confidence in the role and knowledge of expectations and building alarm system operations.

As usual you are welcome to attend our special interest group meetings, where these matters are often discussed. All of the meetings can be found on the FPA calendar via the website.

Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

The contracting space has matured a lot over the past 5 years to what is largely a healthy space where competency can be identified. Further to Scott's introduction, the next step is to put in place official gates to manage this on an ongoing basis.

The way to achieve this is not anecdotal competency on an adhoc basis, or simply using FPANZ financial membership as some sort of criteria of skills or competency. The way to achieve this is by a process as outlined and similar to other certifications:

1. Certified Contractor registration

- » Administered via FPANZ
- » This process has commenced and will be live in the next few weeks.
- » It will be a process that ensures there is a high level of competency, training and Quality systems throughout the business.
- » The system will include anyone purporting to be a Passive Fire Designer, Third Party Inspector as well as Contractors.
- » This certification needs to be backed up by continued professional development and training.
- » Engineering firms and Councils will need to look to this Certification as a pass/ fail mark in the future.

2. Accredited Contractor control via manufacturers distribution

- » Manufacturers/ distributors need to start enforcing accreditation for purchasing rights.
- » This is a key way to control poor installation, as the training is provided before selling the products.
- » At present anyone in NZ can purchase any fire stopping product of any brand therefore there is no control over who gets access to install products – this is a sure-fire recipe to go back to how badly installations have been done in the past.
- » We need only look at the Intumescent Coatings market which largely has reigned in their supply to the wider market and now generally has good control over their supply chains.
