Contractors SIG Update

Sprinkler & Alarm Contractor SIG

The first meeting of the Sprinkler & Fire Alarm Contractors SIG has now taken place! It is with much delight that we advise that the very first Fire Protection Practical Training Papers are currently being written by industry – for industry.

Fire Sprinklers 101, Fire Sprinklers 201 and Fire Alarms 101 are all underway with national representation from contractors across NZ on the committees – watch this space!

A Sprinkler Systems Value....

There is always conversation around the cost of sprinklers, BUT its about time we started talking about the value of a sprinkler system.

Undeniably, a compliant and operational sprinkler system would've minimised the impact of the recent fatal fire at Loafers Lodge. The loss of life primarily, but also the environmental damage from the asbestos and other contaminants, the cost to remediate vs rebuild, and the interruptions to trading for the businesses (the boarding house and those in close proximity) to name a few.

It is key to note that the most cost effective time to install a sprinkler system is during the initial construction phase. The price to retrofit a sprinkler system varies immensely, some influences on pricing variables are;

1. Proximity and capacity of water supplies;
2. Accessibility to the buildings structural elements for installation;
3. The buildings operational expectations during the refit;
4. The hazards the sprinkler system is intended to protect.

If a budget is requested by a building owner or occupier, we would suggest they contact their Fire Protection agent in the first instance. The FPANZ has a list of certified Fire Protection Contractors ready to offer assistance.

HOFFE SIG Update

It's certainly feeling like winter now and unfortunately not only is the temperature dropping, but it also seems that people's confidence in the way our economy is heading and business activity are also dropping.

So where does that leave us, firstly we need to promote the fact that we are offering services and products that have an internationally proven and documented track record for protecting people and property. Add to that the fact that this track record was further evidenced by the study and subsequent report #148 available from Fire & Emergency NZ. Secondly there are various pieces of legislation (incl Hazardous Substances regs, FENZ (Fire Safety, Evacuation) Regs etc) as well as insurance concerns driving the requirement for providing and maintaining first response hand operated fire-fighting equipment. The aforementioned are some of the very good reasons for your clients to see value in using the products and services offered by our industry, even in tougher financial times.

It is also worth remembering that when unexpected natural disasters such as the Christchurch earthquake happen our clients are sometimes left with fire extinguishers as their only means of protection against fire. It follows then that this first response safety equipment must be fit for purpose which logically means the hand operated fire-fighting equipment must be appropriate to the risks where it's located and it must be maintained as per NZS4503. Obviously, this is where we as experienced and qualified fire protection sales and service representatives have an important role to play in ensuring our clients are prepared and safe.

Inspectorate SIG Update

Now that we are seeing fire alarm works to 2021 and sprinkler works to 2020 regularly flowing though it feels timely to remind contractors of the need to ensure certain components are listed. What is more important is that products are used in accordance with the manufacturers documents as those documents are, in part, what the listing is based upon.

In the case of fire alarm jobs, we do sometimes encounter detection devices that are listed for use with one makers panel but not another makers, even though said device appears to function just fine. With respect to fire sprinklers the need to ensure listed hanger and brace components have been used is causing some consternation, especially when a product that a contractor has been using for some time is not listed.

Listing is an important part of ensuring the base quality of fire alarm and fire sprinkler systems. What many members may not be aware of is that there has been the occasional product failure herein New Zealand and such failures cause immense concern to many stakeholders. With NZS4512 and NZS4541 imposing a listing regime on certain parts of the systems the potential for product failure is mitigated. After all, it does not matter how talented the installing technicians are if they are installing inferior hardware.

The FPANZ publishes the register for each of these strands and the sprinkler one is going to get updated with additional hardware soon.

Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

It was a great experience to be part of the Get It Right seminar for the recently released code of practice for interface testing last month. The day highlighted the importance of all disciplines within and outside the immediate fire industry working together. For me, it highlighted the need for us to ensure the design, and installation of the life safety system operates in the most effective way possible to support our occupants over the lifespan of the building. This includes installing and documenting systems so they can be maintained as intended.

It is great to see more applicants coming through for the certified evacuation consultant qualification. This ensures that building owners and occupants receive a more consistent level of service from the industry.

The Regulatory Compliance Group (RCG) have recently received a greater number of evacuation scheme applications than usual. This has resulted in slightly longer processing times.

Development of the new Evacuation Scheme portal is still in the pipeline, with updates and testing taking place. We hope to be able to advise a release date from the implementation team and project partners soon.

OPINION

Upcoming 2023 Changes to Building Code Fire Protection Documents

MBIE Building Performance has recently published the results of their 2022 consultation on:

- › protection from fire for residential homes (C/AS1), and
- › fire safety system standards (C/AS2, C/VM2, and F7/AS1)

This gives a clear statement of the changes that will be implemented in November 2023, with a 12 month transition period.

In summary, there was overwhelming support for the following changes to be implemented:

- › To require interconnected smoke alarms as the minimum fire safety system throughout household units – this includes both hard-wired and 10-year battery wireless options
- › Citing the new AS 1668.1: 2015 *The use of ventilation and air conditioning in buildings – Fire and smoke control in buildings* Amendment 1, with modifications to invoke NZS 4512 panel, detector, and detector spacing requirements
- › Citing AS/NZS 3000: 2018 Electrical installations – Known as the *Australian/New Zealand Wiring Rules*
- › Citing NZS 4512: 2021 *Fire detection and alarm systems in buildings*
- › Citing NZS 4514: 2021 *Interconnected smoke alarms for houses*
- › Citing NZS 4541: 2020 *Automatic fire sprinkler systems*
- › Removing requirements for a landline phone if a connection to a remote receiving centre can be omitted
- › Removing restrictions for sprinklers so that when Type 4 smoke detection can be substituted by Type 3 heat detection, the use of sprinklers is not more restricted than the use of heat detectors
- › Requiring sprinkler systems to extend throughout any car park areas in the building
- › Editorial changes and corrections, including the consolidation into C2/AS2 of requirements currently spread between F7/AS1 and C2/AS2.

Other proposed changes to the requirements for residential homes (Fire Resistance Ratings, structural adequacy of loadbearing elements, fire separations, external fire spread) in C/AS1 did not receive wide support, and some significant technical and complexity issues were raised. These have been held over, and will become the subject of future consultation(s).

It should be noted that these changes **do not** include any specification of buildings (or parts of buildings) where Visual Alerting Devices (VADs) might be required to meet the needs of the deaf and hard of hearing. MBIE has started a work programme to review the broader subject of accessibility in buildings, including VADs. It is to be hoped that this will progress to a conclusion in a timely manner.

Have your say on improving the Building Consent Process

MBIE is seeking feedback on potential options to improve the current building consent system. This is a rare opportunity to provide input to the regulatory framework. FPANZ members are encouraged to make a submission before the consultation deadline of 5pm on Monday 7 August 2023.

At the request of the Government, MBIE is undertaking a review of the building system. This review aims to “modernise the system to provide assurance to building owners and users that building work will be done right first time.”

“Stakeholder feedback [last year] confirmed that the current building consent system is largely delivering on its purpose of ensuring buildings are healthy, safe and durable. This feedback also showed that there are significant opportunities to improve the performance of the system.”

MBIE has “developed several potential options that could improve the building consent system. An options paper seeks feedback in the following areas and identifies preferred options in areas where policy work is sufficiently advanced:

- » strengthening roles and responsibilities
- » new assurance pathways
- » better delivery of building consent services
- » better performance monitoring and system stewardship
- » better responding to the needs and aspirations of Māori.”

“The options paper also includes options to address the following recommendations from the Commerce Commission’s market study into residential building supplies:

- » promoting competition in the building regulatory system
- » removing impediments to product substitution and variations.”

“This consultation will inform advice to Ministers on what options should be progressed as a priority and the detailed design of options the Government chooses to progress, as well as what options require further consideration and consultation.”

Submissions for the consultation closes at 5pm on Monday 7 August 2023.

Building (Building Product Information) Regulations 2022

Organisations supply equipment into the fire protection industry will need to be cognisant of the requirements of the above referenced regulations. We have an informal opinion that this will apply to equipment used in fire protection systems, such as sprinklers, valves, fire alarm panels and smoke detectors. These regulations come into force on 11 December 2023.
