### Constitution update

The new Incorporated Societies Act 2022 comes fully into force on 5 October 2023. To remain an incorporated society, FPANZ will need to re-register under the new Act, and we must also make some changes to our constitution and rules. Some of you would remember that we did an update in 2018, and we tried to incorporate as many of the required changes that were anticipated. However, the final version of the Act has now been published and we do have a little more work to do. Later in the year, we will provide details of the changes required and seek members’ endorsement and voting on these changes closer to our AGM.

### Fire engineering design for New Zealand public hospitals

Te Whatu Ora has been working on a draft fire engineering design guidance for public hospitals in New Zealand for use across the country. Consultation opened on 7 July and will close on 4 August. # Contractors SIG Update

Fire protection contractors play a vital role in the safeguarding of lives and property. A key aspect that sets exceptional fire protection contractors apart is the practical training and upskilling they provide their staff. Skilled, trained and experienced staff are the backbone of any successful fire protection company. However, an alarming trend is on the rise—poaching of staff from competing contracting businesses.

An industry marred by rampant staff poaching risks tarnishing its reputation, increasing costs and decreasing overall upskilling and innovation. Poaching staff often forces companies to seek replacements for their lost talent, which can lead to escalated recruitment costs. The time, effort, and resources required to find and onboard suitable replacements can be substantial, further burdening fire protection contractors. Many times fuelling a never ending cycle of poaching, where nobody wins.

While competition is a natural part of any industry, poaching staff can escalate the sense of unhealthy competitiveness between rival companies. Instead of focusing on innovation, training, upskilling and providing exceptional service, businesses may become preoccupied with “winning” through staff acquisition. The negative effects of staff poaching are far-reaching, some businesses consider poaching staff a normal business activity, relying on competitors to train staff and providing staff bonuses to motivate existing staff to attract others from the industry.

To foster a healthy and professional environment, it is essential for companies to focus on nurturing their employees, fostering loyalty, and competing based on quality of service and innovation rather than acquiring talent from competitors.

FPA is actively working with representatives of the Fire Sprinkler and Fire Alarm contractor industry to write and implement comprehensive training for our entire workforce.

I’d like to thank the valuable contribution of the volunteers who are developing the Sprinkler 101, Sprinkler 201 and Fire Alarms 101 training courses. With the support of the FPA, we look forward to training and elevating the entire workforce in the fire industry, for the betterment of everyone.

# HOFFE SIG Update

Well, this year's going by quickly! On the plus side, the All blacks are looking better than they have for a while which is good news as we rapidly head towards the Rugby World Cup.

It is disappointing to hear that once again some people are being advised to remove hand operated firefighting equipment from their commercial premises. As has been repeatedly stated the view of the FPA is that in a commercial premises a combination of various fire protection services and features give the best result. We do not condone removal of any fire protection systems just to save on maintenance costs, the best protection is provided by a combination of fire protection systems as they all have their benefits and specific uses.

The question of Lithium-Ion fires continues to come up. Currently there are some products available, however these are very much first response units suited to small fires. It is also important to understand that there is no existing test or category available under the AS/NZS framework for testing/quantifying a fire extinguisher's effectiveness on Lithium-Ion fires. Another point of confusion is that in some cases a class D approved fire extinguisher is noted as approved for Lithium-Ion fires, it is not. It should also be noted that a Lithium fire is different to a Lithium-Ion fire.

Another ongoing debate is the one surrounding the use of the fire extinguisher balls. The following is taken from a post in the United States ***"The US Consumer Product Safety Commission has announced plans to recall Fire Extinguisher Balls sold on Amazon due to extreme safety hazards. The risk of burns and smoke inhalation associated with using (note: we deleted the brands for legal reasons) fire extinguisher balls sold on Amazon.com can fail to put out a fire, which could lead to serious injury or death, the federal agency released in a statement to USA TODAY."***

The USA Today report dated 1st June 2023 is available online and advised people not to buy or sell or use the affected fire extinguisher balls.

As previously mentioned, our group is working through a project to review the Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment (HOFFE) standard NZS 4503:2005. Following our initial project submission, Standards New Zealand raised a few points, all of which have been responded to. The project scoping process is progressing well, and we are currently awaiting feedback from Standards New Zealand, and we will update members as soon as this is complete.

The Commerce Commission has notified the FPA that they had cause to carry out further investigations into the continued activities of the owners of Aerofire. As the Singhs owners are under a court order not to operate within the fire equipment industry and have allegedly breached this order, we would encourage anyone with any information regarding their continued activities to contact the Commerce Commission. Further details on this can be located on page 7 of this newsletter.

# Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

Reading through the first release of the delegate brochure, FireNZ will have some interesting and relevant topics that impact building evacuation and processes. If you haven't already, I recommend having a look through the speakers that have been confirmed.

There continues to be increased demand for approved evacuation schemes and more detailed training. I find that more building owners are taking interest in how their buildings and occupants operate and that there is an increased desire to consider real-life needs, making compliance about more than just tick boxes and minimum requirements, when meeting their obligations.

FENZ are continuing to work on the release of the new evacuation scheme platform. I understand that reporting evacuation drills and training will be a simplified process, which is good news. We can already report our drills and training online. Doing this directly instantly updates in their system. This saves receiving unnecessary automated reminders and follow up emails from the fire risk teams.

At the end of this year, I will be stepping down from the role of SIG chair. Whilst this is a voluntary role, it is certainly very rewarding. If you, or someone you know would like to discuss interest in chairing the evacuation SIG, please contact me directly.

## **Communication: Court order obtained against couple selling and servicing fire extinguishers in breach of undertakings**

**Date of Issue: July 2023**

The Commerce Commission has obtained a court order against an Auckland couple who breached an agreement to no longer participate in the fire safety equipment industry. This follows a previous conviction for making false and/or misleading representations to small businesses in relation to fire extinguisher services. In 2020, Mira and Lalita Singh and their company, Aero Fire (NZ) Sales and Service Limited, were fined a total of \$60,000 for representations made regarding the installation, servicing and maintenance of fire extinguishers. The Singhs were also ordered to pay reparation of \$20,000. The conduct, noted by the Court, was very possibly dangerous and dishonest. While Mr and Mrs Singh signed an undertaking in 2020 to no longer operate in the fire safety equipment industry, the Commission is aware that the couple have continued to operate in breach of their undertaking. The Court order obtained by the Commission means that Mr and Mrs Singh have been instructed by the Court to comply with the original undertaking and provide the Commission with a list of all customers who have received goods or services from the couple at times when the couple had agreed not to do so. If Mr and Mrs Singh breach this order, they may be in contempt of court and liable for further fines, community work or imprisonment.

Any businesses approached in future by Mr or Mrs Singh for fire extinguisher sales or servicing are urged to come forward to the Commission. Please call 0800 943 600 or email [contact@comcom.govt.nz](mailto:contact@comcom.govt.nz).

### **Purchasing a fire extinguisher?**

People should also refer to Fire and Emergency NZ advice on installation and use of fire extinguishers. Potential risks include installation of the wrong type of extinguisher, e.g. using a dry powder extinguisher for a cooking oil / fat fire could cause the fire to spread.

Other hazards include inaccessible location, insufficient signage making them difficult to find, and having expired or faulty extinguishers. All types of extinguishers require an inspection annually to check operational condition.

### **Have you been approached out of the blue by a salesperson?**

Mr Singh would typically enter a small business without invitation, and advise the business that they either needed replacement fire extinguishers or their existing extinguishers needed servicing. If you have been approached at the workplace or at home by a salesperson, we encourage you to pause, do your research and if in doubt, seek a second opinion.

You are under no obligation to sign up to a service if approached by a seller, so take time to consider your options. Also remember to read the terms and conditions carefully before signing up to any contract so that you know what you are getting into.

### **Background**

Fire extinguishers must be serviced in accordance with the New Zealand Standard for Hand Operated Fire-fighting Equipment, AS/NZS 4503:2005.

The Standard specifies that extinguishers are to be serviced every 12 months but allows for 6 monthly servicing where extinguishers are stored in an “aggressive environment”, for example where they are exposed to corrosive atmospheres or intense vibration. The Standard prescribes requirements for inspection, testing, maintenance and surveying of fire extinguishers.

Under the Standard, pressure testing is required every 5 years to check for structural faults and corrosion, and only accredited laboratories may perform pressure testing.

### **Court Enforceable Undertakings – s 46A of the Fair Trading Act**

An enforceable undertaking is a statutory undertaking that a person may give to the Commission which, if accepted by the Commission, may be enforced through the Court system in the event of non-compliance.

These regulations come into force on 11 December 2023.
