Evacuation Consultants SIG Update

This month we see the release of the new FENZ evacuation scheme platform, we are looking forward to using the new features which should see the application process simplified. There will also be additional control for managing and reporting of training and drills as part of the scheme maintenance. We are working with FENZ to provide some specific training for our members around the use of the new platform.

As many of you are aware evacuation scheme applications are made at the very end of a project, this shouldn't mean that they are considered at the end of projects, especially those where managed evacuation is required. It is vital that the fire engineering strategy, alarm system and evacuation procedures are in alignment. An important document that can help achieve this is the alarm cause and effect matrix, having this in place ensures that the alarm behaves as expected and is reflected in the evacuation procedures. There is an exemplar document in the code of practice for interface testing that can be utilised.

Involving certified evacuation consultants and the FENZ fire risk team at an early stage of the project is also a key step in ensuring the scheme approval process flows well. The FENZ fire risk officers will often be familiar with a building and will be involved with various other elements of the building sign off. FENZ site visits are often required as part of the scheme sign off process, voluntarily inviting them to site earlier in the project can help resolve queries before the scheme application is made.

As usual you are welcome to attend our special interest group meetings, where these matters are often discussed. All of the meetings can be found on the FPA calendar via the website.

Inspectorate SIG Update

My how the year passes by. Now we are having those frosty mornings, beautiful blue sky days, and flower bulbs are bursting forth announcing spring is here.

Recently the installation of the wrong model of sprinkler was avoided due to attention to detail by the installation technician. In this case the wrong sprinklers had been supplied to site in error. The drawing had on it the level of detail that enabled the sprinkler fitter to compare what was written on the sprinkler by the manufacturer with what the designer had written on the drawing. Likewise, ensuring compatibility of the field devices with the fire alarm panel is as important ever. As so many sprinklers and certain fire alarm detectors are physically very similar detecting the wrongly installed product is very hard; hence care by the installing technicians is the best line of defense.

Separately, the register of sprinkler hardware has been updated (revision 5) on the FPANZ website. Members should check if there is hardware, they use that is meant to be listed, and if it is not on this list give the wholesaler a nudge to get listed.

HOFFE SIG Update

Another month has rolled by quite quickly, the elections are fast approaching and the politicians are once again promising things they are unlikely to ever deliver. On top of that we still seem to be getting a fair bit of rain. On the plus side both the Warriors and the All Blacks are playing well and the Women's Soccer World Cup was a great success for our country.

We continue to hear reports and see examples of poor servicing, though to be fair it's only from a few companies and not the majority. Unfortunately, as we know, bad news travels faster than good news so consequently when an example of bad servicing or sales by a HOFFE company is reported often our industry ends up being tarnished collectively by the actions or inactions of a few individuals.

Some common examples where servicing could be improved and safety can be compromised include, certified fire extinguishers not securely mounted in mobile plant NZS4503:2005 section 3.10.2. and inadequate "For Use" Blazon signage - yet in NZS 4503:2005 section 3.4 "A sign shall be provided for each fire extinguisher or Fire Point" obviously more specific detail is also offered along with examples within the document.

An often-overlooked area where we can not only add value but also help to ensure the fire-fighting equipment remains fit for purpose, should it be required, is by offering the client the option of protective covers and/or cabinets. This is in line with NXS4503:2005 section 3.3 where it states "Fire extinguishers installed in areas where they may be subject to adverse conditions or aggressive environments shall be protected from possible deterioration" - a similar reference is also in section 2.3 of the same document.

The Commerce Commission has in recent times taken action against the people from within one of these companies which was pleasing to see. As we all know there are specific sections in NZS4503:2005 that lay out the servicing/maintenance procedures (sections 6, 7 & 8) and as anyone operating in our industry should have a copy of this document, the information is readily available and we are familiar with it's content, right?

Anyway, we hope this helps and also that you have a great month

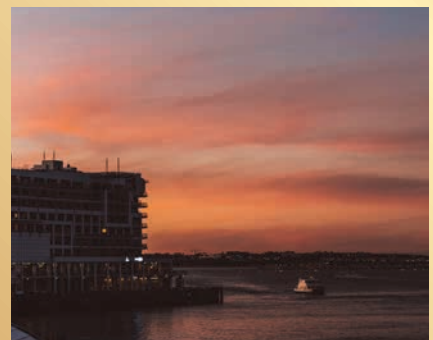

Changes to retention money requirements

In April this year, the Construction Contracts (Retention Money) Amendment Act 2023 was passed. The Amendment Act aims to strengthen and provide protection by making it easier for subcontractors to access retention money without a court order, in the event of a head contractor's insolvency.

The changes in the Amendment Act build on retention money provisions already in the Construction Contracts Act 2002. This was put in place to protect retention money owed to subcontractors in the event of a business failure, and to ensure retention money withheld under construction contracts is responsibly managed.

The changes aim to strengthen and provide protection by making it easier for subcontractors to access retention money without a court order, in the event of a head contractor's insolvency.

The Amendment Act will come into force on 5 October 2023 and become part of the Construction Contracts Act.

Key changes to the regime in the Amendment Act

Many contractors are already doing the right thing and are holding retention money aside appropriately. For these people, the Amendment Act will result in very little change.

The new requirements for retention money include:

- › clarifying that retention money is automatically held on trust by the head contractor once the contract allows it to be withheld from the subcontractor
- › removing the ability to mix retention money with other cashflow and assets
- › requiring that retention money held as cash also be held separately in a bank account with prescribed ledger accounts.

Compliance with the law

The Amendment Act introduces strict liability offences for failing to hold retention money properly, with penalties of up to \$50,000 for a director and up to \$200,000 for a company. Offences include:

- › failure to comply with accounting, recording and reporting requirements
- › use of retention money for a purpose other than remedying defects in the subcontractor's performance
- › failure to provide regular information to the subcontractor on retention money.

Head contractors looking to hold retention money have until 5 October 2023 to ensure processes are established and standard contracts are renewed.

New Guidance document

A new Retention Money Guidance document is now available for people who withhold retention money. The purpose of this guidance is to support property owners, developers, contractors and subcontractors, along with legal, accounting and insolvency professionals with understanding their rights, duties and obligations in respect of changes to the retention money regime. ▶
