HOFFE SIG Update

Another month has gone by, we have seen some really entertaining and sometimes frustrating sporting action and we are now heading into another load of accusations and false promises ahead of another election.

It has also been surprising to hear reports that some people are out there marketing their fire extinguishers as being N.Z. compliant fire protection equipment that doesn't require any servicing and certifying! Given that the N.Z. standard for Hand Operated Fire Fighting Equipment (HOFFE) specifically including fire extinguishers is NZS4503:2005, and it stipulates in section 1.1.1 © "requirements for the regular inspection, testing and recharging and general servicing of hand operated fire-fighting equipment". Additionally in section 2 it states that for fire extinguishers to be compliant, service inspections shall be carried out by a "Competent Person" (definition in NZS4503:2005 section 1.4) within a 12-month timeframe and hydro-test five yearly, the claims of no servicing requirement seem false!

It is also worth noting that in what are deemed "Aggressive Environments" (definitions in NZS4503:2005 sections 2.3.1 & 6.2.2) the service inspection requirement becomes 6-monthly and the hydro-test becomes due after three years.

Guidelines/inspection schedules for the monthly, yearly and five yearly maintenance requirements are also contained within NZS4503:2005 on tables 6.1, 6.2, 6.3 & 6.4 - they are in tick box form and are pretty user friendly. It is also worth noting that if you use the inspection schedules it also picks up the requirement for the location sign aka "For Use" signs (NZS4503:2005 6.1.2 and 6.2.1) which are a valuable tool when locating the fire equipment and assessing what fires it can be used on. When you are servicing and certifying the fire equipment it is important to realise that you are also certifying that it is correctly installed and located appropriately to the risk (NZS4503:2005 6.1.1 7 6.4.5.).

All this of course doesn't mean much if it is not enforced, that said we do know that this standard has been used in recent times as part of the reference material by the Commerce Commission in a prosecution against the owners of a fire equipment company. I am also sure that most Insurance Companies would take a dim view of companies that do not maintain their fire-fighting equipment?

With a variety of companies distributing different types of fire extinguishers onto the N.Z. market, in recent times this type of activity has prompted discussion around whether or not a fire extinguisher register is warranted?

Have a great month and we hope to see you at the FIRENZ Conference & Exhibition at Shed 10 in Auckland from 3-5 October (entrance to the trade show is free of charge), our next HOFFE group meeting is on the 27th October.

Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

ANARP – Cost Assessment:

The challenge is upon the industry to raise the bar when it comes to ANARP assessments of buildings. In my opinion the weak point to date has been regarding Cost assessment of Pain vs Gain. Seldom do we see or hear of sufficient cost assessment to provide justification for the decisions made by Fire Engineers when it comes to ANARP considerations. Simply stating that a full compliance upgrade is cost prohibitive isn't really a suitable effort. I bravely say that very few Fire Engineers ever pick up the phone to a specialist contractor or Quantity Surveyor to seek advice regarding cost when making ANARP considerations & I would hedge my bets that very few Fire Engineers have up to date & accurate cost data at their fingertips to make these educated guesses. I do acknowledge there are some that do make this effort.

The questions I pose to the industry is:

- 1. What is being done regarding cost assessment?
- 2. What conversations are being had between parties, industries & with other disciplines, contractors & consultants such as QS & the like?
- 3. How can we work together for better outcomes?

The following are all key considerations that should be taken into account when ANARP considerations are being made:

- 1. What are the Investment gains from the project i.e if it is a commercially lead project there will be investment gains by undertaking the work, therefore there should be a consideration & question regarding the investment returns. Seldom do developers undertake work without having first completed feasibility studies or at least know their intended return therefore there is a baseline to consider the cost of the upgrades against. If the investment returns are significant, is it reasonable to ANARP Fire upgrade costs out?
- 2. Are all upgrade options considered & all new Technologies considered? There is several ways to skin a cat particularly when it comes to Passive Fire Protection & remedial works or upgrades. In fact as Technology has advanced over the past 5 years there are new upgrade systems that are specifically targeted at ANARP situations such as Naked Wall, Paint Upgrade systems to plasterboard or the like, Wireless smoke alarm systems, topside vs underside methodologies therefore cost of disruption & the like are coming down
- 3. Can the work be staged? i.e could the work be completed over several stages or a period of time, therefore making the work fit within budgets &/ or access limitations without making too much disruptions.
- 4. What is the cost of doing the work now vs at a later date? i.e ceilings are down for other works & it will therefore never be cheaper or easier to complete other upgrade aspects.
- 5. FENZ Levy offsets
- 6. In the other direction if the Costs prove that the project would be a Go/ No go due to the upgrade work was to be enforced then there is clear evidence backed up by costs that this is the case.



PASSIVE SIG Update cont.

It would be easy for standard rates to be applied across simple & standard elements of Fire Safety works, but there will be tricks & challenges with every building. But this need not be a showstopper. I am yet to come across a contractor that isn't prepared to do ECI Cost advice at high level or deep level for good clients & consultants. Therefore, these ANARP cost questions can be obtained quickly & cheaply by way of engaging with good contractors. Better questions, better relationships will deliver better results for buildings & the occupants.
