### Sprinkler system water supply issues

Water supply has been raising concerns in Auckland, Wellington, and Nelson and will no doubt become a considerable topic of concern across all New Zealand. Recent comments from Wellington Water about blanket reductions in water pressure were made without any consultation as to impacts on fire sprinkler systems. We have written to advise them of our industry's concerns and requested a meeting to discuss the implications and ramifications of such action. We will continue to pursue meetings with the relevant authorities at a local level and with other national organisations.



## Honouring John Fraser, OBE

**We regret to announce the passing of one of our founders - John Fraser, Life Member, Fire Protection Association (NZ) Inc on the 24th of December 2023.**

John graduated with a Bachelor of Engineering from the University of Canterbury in 1951. He entered the fire protection industry joining Wormald in 1954, and held several roles, culminating in his position as Wormald Group Technical Manager. In 1989, he established Fire Protection Inspection Services, and was a Director and General Manager until 1994.

He was a key player in establishing the standards our industry is based on, including our sprinkler, hydrant and fire equipment standards, and in forming the New Zealand Fire Protection Association, to enable Government to engage with industry to maintain these standards.

He was passionate about lifting the professionalism of the industry, encouraging the training and development of the workforce to ensure that New Zealand has

reliable and safe life and property protection systems, helping to form the NZQA qualifications now available to develop our trades staff. New Zealand's sprinkler contracting, and service industry has been established by the Wormald cadets that came through the cadetship program that John developed.

He was also instrumental in forming the New Zealand Chapter of the Society of Fire Protection Engineers, and following his semi-retirement in 1996, he put in place the Halon Recycling Company, which was successful in recovering most of the Halon firefighting gasses that were stored in NZ.

The Fire Protection Association prepared the nomination which resulted in John being awarded the Order of the British Empire in 1996, for services to engineering and the community.

## **Dame Judith Hackitt** FEng FICHEM

Independent Adviser to the UK Government on Fire Safety

A chemical engineer who has spent more than 20 years in the chemical industry. A former President of The Institution of Chemical Engineers and a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering.

Throughout her career she has championed the importance of engineering in delivering solutions which benefit society. She cares deeply about safety in the workplace and more broadly.

From 2007 to 2016 she was Chair of the UK Health & Safety Executive and in 2017 conducted an independent review for the UK government into building regulations and fire safety in the wake of the Grenfell Tower tragedy. Her recommendations for radical reform received Royal Assent in the Building Safety Act 2022. In January 2024 she was appointed interim Chair of the UK Office for Nuclear Regulation.



## **Dr Wojciech Węgrzyński** Prof. ITB

Head of Fire Automation, Smoke Control and Signalling,  
Building Research Institute (ITB)

Dr Wojciech Węgrzyński is with ITB, that is the Polish Building Research Institute in Warsaw. He currently holds the position of the Deputy Head of Fire Research Department and the Professor of the Institute, and a Director at SFPE Europe.

He is an Author of 40 peer-reviewed papers published in all of the primary FSE journals. His main area of interest is the fundamentals of compartment fire dynamics and standardized fire testing, and also: use of computational fluid dynamics in fire, wind and fire interaction and evaluation of the effects of the spread of smoke in buildings. His research is focused on the impact of the architectural context of the building on the smoke control performance, as well as finding solutions to make the smoke exhaust systems cheaper and more efficient.

Member of the MAC and Vice-Chair of Sub-committee for Research of the IAFSS. 2018 NFPA Harry C. Bigglestone Award Recipient; 2019 Jack Watts Award Recipient; 2020 SFPE 5 Under 35 Award Recipient. **Field Advisory Bulletin – Pertronic Evacuation Amplifier EVAC50W24 – LED Address misconfiguration.**

We have received advice that sites have been found where the “LED Address” has been incorrectly set on the Pertronic EVAC50W24 Evacuation Amplifier. This is a serious issue as it may prevent the evacuation signal from operating in the affected area.

It appears in at least one case that the rotary switch LED address settings were changed as a means of resetting the defect history on the amplifiers and then were not set back to the correct address. Although changing & restoring the address setting is an effective way of resetting an amplifier, there are inherent risks in that procedure. For this reason we are no longer recommending the use of this procedure after commissioning has been completed. All Pertronic manuals & documentation will be updated to incorporate this recommendation.

It should also be noted that the key operated external “Trial Evacuation” switch and the internal evacuation button directly trigger the operation of the evacuation signal and override all amplifier LED address settings. Amplifiers with an incorrect LED address setting will not give any adverse indication on the control panel. If there is any suggestion that amplifier evacuation tone addresses have been changed, we recommend that the panel programming is verified by operating a detector(s) or manual callpoint(s) in the affected area(s).

Almost all fire alarm control panels have DIP switches or similar for setting up the configuration of the panels. If any changes are made to panel or amplifier configuration settings it is essential that the system is appropriately re-tested to confirm correct operation. This is required by clause 5.1.4 of NZS 4512:2021

- e) FENZ are conducting tests on the effectiveness of various types of products that are advertised as effective on Lithium-Ion fires, the results should be interesting.
