NZS 4503 Update

We are another step closer to the final formation of the third revenue stream for the Fire Protection Charitable Trust to facilitate standard development of the HOFFE NZS 4503:205, which is well overdue for an update. I encourage you to buy your products and service tags only from suppliers that are signed up to support this industry initiative. We will be formally publishing a larger update on this topic in the newsletter in February 2025.

Member Management Systems

We are embarking on a significant upgrade of all FPANZ business systems, and this project will be completed in Q1 of 2025. It is also a great time to check your company details on our website and on any invoice, you have received from us lately and to update any company contact that you would like to receive emails, newsletters, and access to the member-only sections of the new systems. Adding your staff to your company contacts will give them direct mobile access to the many new services that will launch in Q1 and Q2 of 2025. For ease, we have a spreadsheet that you can add staff details to, and then we can add these details in bulk for you as we go live. Once the new systems are up and running, you will be able to add staff and update your company details directly as changes are required.

Product Issues

Members sometimes ask us about various product issues, and – when suppliers alert us – we publish this information in our newsletters. We also have a separate distribution list for product recalls and bulletins, which is another good reason for staff to be enrolled to get these field updates and newsletters. We have a good working relationship with the New Zealand Fire Equipment Manufacturers' Association (NZFEMA) so we can represent and provide feedback on behalf of our members. However, to do so, we need facts and real data in writing so they can be substantiated, investigated, and followed up. Too often supporting data or information isn't forthcoming. If you have product issues, we encourage you to first contact the supplier with your concerns and seek their technical support. If there is a wider issue, we expect the supplier to contact us so we can pass the information out to the industry.



Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

Ah, summer and Xmas greetings! The season of beach days, cricket on the lawn, and, of course, the sacred Kiwi BBQ. But while you're busy flipping steaks and dodging that one mate who insists on turning everything into charcoal, there's an invisible hero at play: passive fire protection.

The BBQs

Picture this: You're hosting the ultimate backyard BBQ. The grill's sizzling, the jandals are out, and someone's already cracked open a cold one. Suddenly, Uncle Stan cranks up the heat on the grill, and boom—flames leap higher than Jim's cricket bat swing.

The latest upload includes the following determinations that may be of wider interest:

- <u>2024/057</u> considers the compliance of one unisex toilet in a new industrial workshop building with clause G1.3.1 of the Building Code
- · 2024/058 considers an authority's decisions to issue a building consent and code compliance certificate for a dwelling and compliance with B1
- <u>2024/059</u> considers and authority's refusal to withdraw two notices to fix issued in relation to a change of use
- <u>2024/060</u> considers and authority's refusal to withdraw two notices to fix issued in relation to a change of use
- <u>2024/061</u> considers a proposed notice to fix for the construction of a cable care building, two sets of stairways, and a toilet and shower building
- <u>2024/062</u> considers the refusal to issue a code compliance certificate and the reasons given
- 2024/063 considers the authority's request to a building owner for an engineering assessment of a residential building identified as potentially earthquake-prone
- <u>2024/064</u> considers the compliance of proposed internal door locks which alter the building's means of escape from fire
- 2024/065 considers the authority's decision to make changes to a building consent after the building consent had been issued
- 2024/066 considers the authority's decision to refuse an amendment to a building consent to increase the immediate pool area

New Resource: Code of Practice for the Seismic Performance of Non-structural Elements (NSE CoP)

A new resource is available entitled the *Code of Practice for the Seismic Performance of Non-structural Elements (NSE CoP).*

The purpose of the NSE CoP is to is to provide guidance on the seismic design, coordination, and construction of non-structural elements to improve practices, and establish consistency across the industry while meeting the performance requirements of the building code.

It is intended to be the means to achieve consistency in the seismic design and selection of non-structural elements (NSEs) as well as the coordination process between disciplines and through consensus-based solutions. The NSE CoP supports the translation of building functional requirements into design, construction methodologies and quality assurance processes for NSEs.

The NSE CoP is structured to provide guidance to:

- clients,
- project managers,
- quantity surveyors,
- designers,
- contractors and sub-contractors.

COMMENTARY ON THE ABOVE ARTICLE by **Stephen Ridder** – Fire Protection Consultant, Aon Fire Protection

There can often be confusion between the objectives of the Building Code and design Standards versus actual outcomes. Within the fire protection community, it is often believed that a fire sprinkler system will remain functional after a seismic event. However, a careful reading of NZS1170.5 shows that belief is incorrect and a certain degree of damage to the system is allowable; yet that allowable quantum of damage is not borne out in real event.

What happens in a real event is different to the design intention, this is due to factors of safety and was seen firsthand in Christchurch and Wellington following the major earthquakes of 2010, 2011 and 2016. While a designer is selecting hardware solutions for a certain kW load to ensure their design is suitable for a certain seismic acceleration the load limit of the hardware contains a factor of safety. What happens in a real event is the actual point of failure must also overcome the factor of safety. It may well be that the seismic acceleration that sprinkler systems in Christchurch and Wellington were subjected to exceed the design limit, however they did not exceed the actual physical limit of the various products because of the factors of safety. This observation of real outcomes can lead to the perception that sprinkler system will remain in a better condition than NZS1170.5 requires.

BUILDING PERFORMANCE

The Building (Earthquake-prone Building Deadlines and Other Matters) Amendment Act has come into effect.

Tēnā koe

The Building (Earthquake-prone Building Deadlines and Other Matters) Amendment Act has come into effect on 26 November 2024. It includes an extension of remediation deadlines for earthquake-prone buildings, strengthening of the building warrant of fitness scheme and other minor technical changes.

Remediation deadlines extension

The Amendment Act provides an extension to the remediation deadlines for earthquake-prone buildings by 4 years (except buildings with notices that expired on or before 1 April 2024). The extension aims to provide clarity and certainty to building owners and territorial authorities, while the review of the management of seismic risk in existing buildings takes place.

The extension applies to earthquake-prone buildings whose deadlines had not lapsed before 2 April 2024. Territorial authorities are required to promptly re-issue earthquake-prone building notices to these buildings and to update the register of earthquake-prone buildings (the EPB Register).

The Amendment Act also introduces a one-off power to further extend remediation deadlines by up to 2 years, if required. This power must be used by 2 April 2028 and will apply both to buildings who received the 4-year extension and to any earthquake-prone buildings that are subsequently identified, as long as the EPB notice is issued before the power is enacted.

We have developed guidance for territorial authorities and building owners to inform them of the changes.

Strengthening the building warrant of fitness scheme

The Amendment Act also allowed for changes to better protect the safety of building occupants.

These relate to the building warrant of fitness scheme and will clarify the obligations of independently qualified persons (IQPs) in issuing a certificate of compliance for a specified system Form 12A. It will introduce an associated offence and also increase infringement fees for building owners who fail to supply or to display a building warrant of fitness as required. This will help to ensure that IQPs are fulfilling their obligations under the building warrant of fitness scheme and help to protect the health and safety of building occupants.



The Building (Earthquake-prone Building Deadlines and Other Matters) Amendment Act has come into effect *cont*.

Minor and technical changes

Changes covered by 'other matters' in the Amendment Act include:

- Requiring stand-alone building consent authorities that are not territorial authorities to pay
 the building levy directly to MBIE, rather than via territorial authorities, enabling a more
 efficient process.
- Removing an obligation for dam owners to display a copy of a dam compliance certificate
 in a prominent place on the dam, as this is impractical to do. Instead, dam owners must
 forward the certificate to the relevant regional authority.
- Clarifying which small heated pools (such as spa pools) are exempt from the requirement for periodic inspection that is, small heated pools that have a safety cover that complied at installation, or currently complies, with the Building Code.
- And finally, clarifying that if a certificate of acceptance for building work is issued by a territorial authority, it is not necessary to apply for a building consent for that work.

BUILDING PERFORMANCE

Changes to minor variations, new minor customisations and building forms

Tēnā koe

The Government's key priority for Aotearoa New Zealand's building and construction sector is to make it easier for Kiwis to build affordable homes. This will be achieved by reducing regulatory barriers and streamlining the building consent system.

New and amended building regulations commenced on 30 September 2024 to clarify the definition of a 'minor variation' in relation to building consents and create a definition of a 'minor customisation' for MultiProof approvals.

Building consent Form 2 has also been modified to enable pre-approval of alternative products and/or plans or specifications. These changes will make it easier for people to customise their building designs. Building Consent Authorities (BCAs) will still need to check the proposed building work to ensure it complies with the Building Code, but people won't need to make an application for an amendment to the building consent for most minor, straightforward product or design changes.

Minor change to Form 2 application for PIM and/or building consent

Form 2 has been changed and must be used by all building consent authorities and territorial authorities from 30 September 2024 onwards. The change enables pre-approval of alternative products, plans or specifications.
