#### **Review of Joint Standards**

We have been asked to participate in the review of two joint standards that are relevant for the HOFFE (Hand-Operated Fire-Fighting Equipment) sector. AS/NZS 1841.1 is the main manufacturing standard, and AS/NZS 1850 is a fire testing standard that provides suitability and ratings for fire extinguishers. AS/NZS 1841 relies on extinguishers passing AS/NZS 1850 tests. We are assessing the financial impacts and funding needs for both projects. They could affect the redevelopment of NZS 4503, so we are conducting due diligence. It's encouraging that FPANZ is involved, as it allows us to advocate effectively for our members.

#### FireNZ Call for Papers and Update

Just a reminder that the call for papers for FireNZ 2025 is still open. This one is shaping up to be a big year, with 90% of booths and sponsorships now sold. # HOFFE SIG Update

Well, daylight savings is gone – it's darker longer, temperatures are dropping, the rain's increasing, Trump's behaving like a madman and we are starting to get bombarded by local council members telling us what a good job they are doing for us – welcome to winter 2025!!

On the plus side, in our HOFFE Group we have some good things happening – the key one is that funds are being forwarded by member companies to the Charitable Trust to support our NZS 4503 review.

On a topical note though, it is early days but there has been some movement forward with a group in the process of being established to progress the new AS/NZS standards for dealing with Lithium-Ion fire extinguishers. This will be a new class (Class L) to be added to the existing AS/NZS 1841 & 1850 framework, this would include as a minimum adding the following updates:

- a) Specifying materials and components suitable for Lithium-Ion fire extinguishers;
- b) Outlining manufacturing methods appropriate for these specialized fire extinguishers;
- c) Detailing performance requirements specific to Lithium-ion fire extinguishers;
- d) Providing guidelines for instructions and markings related to Class L fire extinguishers.

This is of course the beginning of quite a process, it is also one that has implications for other related documents including our servicing and testing standards. This will potentially be a long process which could well result in amendments being added to our standards.

It is also remembering that fires involving Lithium-Ion batteries are inherently dangerous, they have some very hazardous byproducts (especially if it's in a confined space) and can be difficult to tackle, especially as the batteries are often situated within appliances or beneath covers.

We have had an instance where a prominent organisation had mistakenly told people that foam fire extinguishers were banned from the 3rd December this year. As most of you will be aware the 3rd of December is the date when AFFF type of foam is no longer allowed but Fluorine Free foams can be used and these are going to be used for the foreseeable future, after all the risks they best cater for are still there!! The confusion is easily understood and has been addressed by the organisation concerned.

The next HOFFE Group meeting is on Wednesday 18th June at 1pm.

Subject:	Meeting Pods				
Notice: Aon Sprinkler Certification Technical Notes provide guidance notes which may be used in certification of sprinkler installations by Aon New Zealand. If sprinkler installations are being certified by any other Sprinkler System Certifier, these Technical Notes may not apply.					

There is an increased use of meeting pods within the modern office environment. These units are not exempt from compliance with NZS4541. There are multiple paths to achieve compliance with NZS4541, including:

- 1. Based upon International Building Code 2015 section 9.3.3.3, meeting pods less than 1200 mm x 1200 mm can be treated as furniture. The pod needs to be located to comply with 509.1 (clear space) or 512.2.1 (obstructions); or
- 2. Place fire sprinklers within them in accordance with section 7; or
- 3. Demonstrate via full scale fire testing that sprinkler protection within the pod is not required. There may be requirements in aligning the pods with sprinklers with such pods; or
- 4. Provide an internationally accepted listing for meeting pods where the ceiling is designed to open on detection of fire. The ceiling shall be configured to open on detection of fire within the protected space, via a sprinkler, detector of manual call point operation.

If options 3 and 4 are required, Aon will review application data from the importers or manufacturers of the meeting pods and issue a listing certificate. In these cases, there may be restrictions on the placement of the meeting pod in relation to the general room fire sprinkler heads. Reference needs made to the conditions on the listing certificate to ensure compliance.

Some meeting pods that are coming to market that require greater than Extra Light Hazard protection. Specifiers need to be aware that the compatibility of an unsprinklered pod within an office may require the office to be protected to at least Ordinary Hazard Two criteria.

This updated Practice Note provides essential guidance for fire designers, focusing on best practices to improve documentation quality, communication, and coordination.

The latest version includes:

- **Corrections** following revisions to the Building Code's 'Protection from Fire' acceptable solutions and verification methods.
- Enhanced guidance on communication, coordination, and defining responsibilities to improve fire design documentation quality.
- Best practices for all designers involved in building design, ensuring collaborative engagement throughout the fire design process.

The Government has decided to disestablish the current Workforce Development Councils and establish new Industry Skills Boards (ISBs).

The ISBs will take on some of the WDC functions from January 2026. There will be differences between WDCs and ISBs. ISBs will have a role strongly focused around their standard setting function with a lower level of government funding available. It is also expected that the number and coverage of ISBs could be different from the WDC model.

Included below are details on;

- The current ISB Industry Consultation process,
- The Minister's decision on the work-based learning model,
- A call for nominations for the new Establishment Advisory Groups for the ISBs.

As well as how all of this applies to the services you rely on from the team at Hanga-Aro-Rau.

## Consultation on the number and coverage of Industry Skills Boards opens.

TEC has commenced consultation on the number and coverage of Industry Skills Boards. The proposals also include some sectors where standards setting is proposed to transition to NZQA.

# Minister announces Government's decision on future work-based learning model.

Last Thursday 24th April, the Minister for Vocational Education announced the government's decision to introduce an industry-led, independent work-based learning model.

The key aspects are:

- Any qualified provider (institutes of technology and polytechnics, private training establishments, wānanga) can offer work-based learning, managing all aspects of apprenticeships and traineeships.
- Industry Skills Boards (ISBs) will be established from 1 January 2026 to develop qualifications and standards, endorse programmes, and provide workforce analysis.

The transition of this model will see Te Pūkenga's work-based learning divisions transfer to ISBs for up to two years, ensuring continuity in training.

This decision reflects the Government's commitment to ensuring the vocational education system is more responsive to industry needs. It follows the targeted consultation earlier this year and confirms that WDCs will still be disestablished on 31 December 2025 and Industry Skills Boards (ISBs) will be operational from 1 January 2026.

## Nominations for Establishment Advisory Groups for Industry Skills Boards

The TEC is also inviting industries to nominate representatives to help establish the Industry Skills Boards.

Each Industry Skills Board will have an Establishment Advisory Group with three members from industry. Establishment Advisory Groups will be responsible for ensuring each Industry Skills Board can successfully stand up on day one. The role of the Establishment Advisory Groups is focused on governance rather than industry advocacy.

Candidates will need strong governance and change management skills, an industry background and an understanding of education and training.



Nominations received **before 13 June 2025** will be considered for the Establishment Advisory Groups which will operate through 2025. However, industry nominations after this date are still welcomed. Later nominations will be considered for any unfilled positions on Establishment Advisory Groups or for additional members of the first boards of Industry Skills Boards.

Industry bodies are encouraged to get involved to ensure Industry Skills Board are industry-led from the very beginning.

# What does this mean for Hanga-Aro-Rau and the services you rely on?

Right now, this means that Hanga-Aro-Rau are continuing with their current 2024-25 work programme and don't anticipate changes until 30 June 2025.

They are working with TEC to develop an amended work plan to ensure they can deliver their functions and wind-up Hanga-Aro-Rau by 31 December 2025. This amended plan will cover the period 1 July 2025 to 31 December 2025.

Hanga-Aro-Rau is committed to advocating for industry to have a strong voice in the new system and also want to ensure the needs of current and future workforces are met, particularly Māori, Pacific People, disabled people, and other underrepresented groups.

Hanga-Aro-Rau believe that the redesign process is best supported by robust evidence and policies that have been proven to work well, and have developed **three white papers**, focusing respectively on Māori, Pacific Peoples and disabled people. The success of these groups is essential to the success of the VET system as a whole. They can be downloaded from their website on the links below.
