Passive Fire Protection SIG Update

THE ROLE OF QS IN PASSIVE FIRE PROTECTION

I'll start this month with an admission I rarely make in public: I am, in fact, a qualified Quantity Surveyor. Yes, one of "them." It's a truth I carry with a measure of shame – and not just because of the stereotypes. Too often, the QS profession has been at the heart of decisions that drive quality out of buildings in the relentless pursuit of cost savings.

In Fire Protection, this tension is magnified. Compliance and life safety cannot – and must not – be sacrificed on the altar of "value engineering." Yet, QS-led decisions, when divorced from quality and compliance perspectives, have repeatedly shown where this road leads.

Before I offend the wrong people there are several types of QS that I have come across over my career:

- » **The hustler** – the deal maker, you never quite know whether you trust them or not. But they often come out on the right side of the coin & do it with a grin.
- » **The diligent & proficient** – highly regarded, very capable of forecasting costs, assessing budgets, advising clients, can calculate costs from first principles with a watchmaker like precision and rarely do their projects ever end with bad quality or in court
- » **The Spreadsheet Banshee** – nothing is ever cheap enough, budget overruns are always someone else's problem, they assess everything in dollars & cents like it's the only thing that makes a building go up, they focus on personal wins rather than best for client & best for project outcomes. They manipulate & gaslight. They are very up to date with contract law because most of their projects are riddled with disputes.

QS and the Cost Trap

Quantity Surveyors are trained and rewarded to focus on cost alone. But when that mindset dictates design and material choice, the result is predictable: poor decisions that ignore the fundamentals of safety and compliance. QS should never be driving design – design must be led by those who understand the performance requirements and risks. Cost is only one piece of the puzzle. In our industry this is Fire Engineers and Fire Protection Specialists.

Lessons We Shouldn't Forget

History is littered with painful reminders of what happens when QS cost-cutting outweighs technical integrity:

- » Grenfell Tower: a decision to save £5,000 led to cheaper, more combustible cladding – with tragic consequences. The QS fingerprints must have been all over that choice.
- » Leaky buildings in New Zealand: short-term cost-driven thinking left a legacy of billions in repairs, broken lives, and a damaged industry reputation.
- » Countless buildings in NZ have diminished Fire Protection designs driven by cost saving. No sprinklers, minimum staircase, minimum passive fire performance, minimum alarm systems.

The Liability Mirage

There's a cruel irony in all this. With the government's new proportionate liability framework announced in August, every professional will be expected to carry their fair share of responsibility which is rightly driving fear through some of the industry. Yet, don't expect ►

to see PQS standing in the dock. They're almost never named, never liable, despite being central to the cost decisions that contributed to systemic failures. Engineers, contractors, designers, and manufacturers will all carry the burden. The QS? Silent. Absent. Untouched. Yet you can bet they will continue to drive decisions in the background regarding material selection & contractor selection.

I encourage all design & construction professionals to step back & take stock of your own liability when those considerations around cost are being pushed upon you and your personal liability which will extend for many years.

Fair and reasonable with a balanced consideration of liability

I have frequently stated that I would rather compete against a Bonafide competitor than negotiate with an unreasonable PQS. This is because Bonafide competitors have technical knowledge and understanding & competency, therefore it becomes a cost-outcome decision. Whereas when negotiating with an unreasonable PQS the negotiations are not on an even playing field as they are lacking technical knowledge, understanding & competency therefore the negotiations are fraught from the beginning.

This isn't to say that we can drive the cost of buildings up without consideration. Of course we need to consider costs and we can design and construct buildings using smarts that deliver good cost outcomes. This is where diligent and proficiency comes through.

The industry, regulators, and clients must remember this: a QS can count the cost, but only a qualified professional can measure the risk.

I would also encourage any QS to continually learn and perhaps they might consider attending some conferences, webinars and the likes to learn about technical knowledge, competency accreditation schemes and the like that are on offer in the Fire Protection Industry so that they can make diligent and proficient recommendations with full consideration.

HOFFE SIG Update

Spring is nearly here, daylight savings is fast approaching and so is the December deadline on AFFF's. So, is it all bad news for foams as our traditional AFFF disappears?

It's not really all bad as it has still been tested and AS/NZS standards approved for use on the traditional classes A and B fires and despite the generally lower B ratings (9lt - 20B versus 30B) there are some redeeming features about Fluorine Free foam fire extinguishers. For instance, some Fluorine Free Foam (FFF) fire extinguishers also offer class F ratings for use on cooking oil and fat fires which in some instances can be a good "user friendly" class F alternative to Wet Chemical extinguishers.

Another item recently encountered is that companies are not correcting old misleading and inappropriate "For Use" signage. For some time words like "Multipurpose and General purpose" haven't been permitted but as the attached picture shows they are still out there and being certified, why?? It is important to recognize that when we certify the equipment we are also certifying that it is the right type for the risk(s), correctly installed, with the correct location and "For Use" information (written and pictorial) with a blazon background as per NZS4503 which is the reference standard that is also specified on the service tag and documentation. Interestingly these misleading terms and/or impressions are identified as unacceptable under Commerce Commission guidelines (generally Consumer Guarantees Act for Domestic and Fair Trading Act for commercial) which call for information to be clear, accurate and unambiguous. There are of course also other implications including Health and Safety.



As we all have the Fire NZ Conference and Exhibition in early October our next HOFFE meeting is on the 26th November.
